Questions for Pastor...

Was Luke an apostle?

This is a question I received after one of our Daily Devotional readings from the Gospel of Luke.

We typically refer to the Old Testament as being written by "The Prophets" and the New Testament as written by "The Apostles." Both of those statements are generalizations. Most of the Old Testament was written by those who were known as "prophets." There are some exceptions to that generalization. For example, a large number of Psalms were written by David, the king, and a large number of Proverbs were written by Solomon - also a king.

In the same way, the vast majority of the New Testament was written by apostles - those disciples specifically sent by Jesus to tell the world about Him. Among the exceptions are the books of James and Jude (Jesus' brothers) and the books of Luke and Acts (both written by Luke.)

Before I go any further, we need to be reminded of what the apostle Peter wrote: (2 Peter 1:20-21) "Above all, you must understand that no prophecy of Scripture came about by the prophet's own interpretation of things. For prophecy never had its origin in the human will, but prophets, though human, spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit." The Apostle Paul put it this way in 2 Timothy 3:16 "All Scripture is God-breathed," (or "inspired by God.")

Even though the words of the Bible were written down by men, everything they wrote was what God prompted then to write, so God is ultimately THE Writer of both Old and New Testaments.

A lot of times when people are interested in finding out more about Jesus and aren't sure where to start reading, I will point them to the Gospel of Luke. One reason is that Luke records several things that most people have at least some familiarity with, like the "Christmas" story in Luke 2 and the famous parables of the "Good Samaritan in Luke 10 and "Prodigal Son" in Luke 15. Another reason is because of what Luke tells us at the beginning of his Gospel: "Since I myself have carefully

investigated everything from the beginning, I too decided to write an orderly account for you, most excellent Theophilus, so that you may know the certainty of the things you have been taught." Anyone interested in finding out about Jesus wants to know the truth, the facts. Luke states point-blank that everything he wrote was a result of careful research, so that whoever reads what he wrote can be confident that it is true.

Luke had to do "careful investigation," because he was not an eyewitness to the events he wrote about in his Gospel. He records at the start of the Gospel of Luke that his "careful investigation" included talking with those who were eyewitnesses. Obviously, these eyewitnesses included the disciples who were with Jesus from the start of His ministry. But we get the idea - especially from the details of the "Christmas Story" - that Mary was also one of the eyewitnesses Luke interviewed.

Luke first used "we" in Acts 16:10. Prior to that he referenced events by using "they." This indicates that it was at this point on the Apostle Paul's second missionary journey (ca 49-51 AD) that Luke had joined Paul and thereafter also becomes an eyewitness.

Salvation When We Least Expect It: Camille's Story by Joshua Tumil, Jews for Jesus Paris Branch Leader

Camille attended our Paris Passover event in 2021 at the insistence of a mutual friend, a Jewish believer named Joël. The following year, she came on her own. That's when I introduced her to Irma, another Jewish believer. I was surprised when Irma put her hand on Camille and prayed for God to reveal Himself, and to show Camille that Yeshua (Jesus) is her Messiah. It was uncharacteristic for Irma, and I wondered if Camille felt pressured.

But unbeknownst to me, God was working! In fact, my wife, Delphine, had offered Camille a copy of our Messianic prophecy book, Y'shua, that same night.

I was so pleased when Camille accepted my invitation to one of our Zikaron BaSalon events, where Holocaust survivors share their stories. Camille's parents had survived the Nazi concentration camps, but their memories were so traumatic that they would never discuss what happened. So, Camille was grateful to finally connect with her parents' past. I had expected this but was totally surprised when she exclaimed.

"Josh, I believe!"

"Believe what?" Lasked

She replied, "In Jesus!"

I asked, "What about Him?"

Camille answered, "Everything—that He is the Messiah, the Son of God."

It turned out that Camille had read the entire Y'shua book in one sitting, then continued reading the Bible on her own. "After years of claiming to be an atheist, I finally realized the truth about Jesus and the truth about myself," she admitted with a smile. Wow—how amazing is our God!

But there is another piece of the story that you've got to hear!

Joël, the friend who insisted that Camille attend our Passover event, had himself survived the Holocaust at a young age. He became a follower of Jesus and shared his faith with the people he'd grown up with, including Camille. Though they could not understand Joël's choice, she and the others saw changes in his life and how he had

been able to heal spiritually from the trauma he experienced.

Over the years, Joël continued to passionately share the gospel with his Jewish friends. When Camille came to that first Passover event, Joël was suffering from kidney failure. Camille was quick to donate one of her kidneys to save her dear friend. Nonetheless, Joël died a month later.

Joël's funeral was held at a monumental cathedral. He was greatly loved, and more than 1,000 people attended. Camille was very happy that we were there to represent Joël's Jewish identity.


His death really shook her, but his testimony had made an impact, and she decided she would come to another Passover event. She confessed, "Joshua, I can't believe like you do ... but I'd like to." And you know the rest.

I know that Jesus and the angels are rejoicing over Camille's salvation, and so is Joël! While we continue to minister to her here in France, I've also connected her with my colleague Kata in Hungary, where Camille was born and where she frequently visits family.



The Homeless Person

The parking lot filled rapidly on Sunday morning as members of the large church congregation filed into church. As usually happens in a church that size, each member had developed a certain comfort zone a block of space within those four church walls that became theirs after the second or third sitting.

It was as much a part of their church experience as the recliner was to the television at home. Some of the older members had been sitting in the same row on the same side for several decades. A team of oxen could not have moved them to the opposite side of the church.

One morning a stranger stood at the edge of the parking lot near a dumpster. As families parked cars and piled out, they noticed him rummaging through the trash. "Oh no! I don't believe it," whispered a lady to her husband. "That's all we need -- a bunch of homeless people milling around here."

One worried little girl tugged on her dad's sleeve. "But Daddy..."

Daddy was busy sizing up the bearded stranger, whose baggy, outdated trousers and faded flannel shirt had dusted too many park benches.

"Don't stare at him, honey," he whispered, and hurried her inside.

Soft music filled the high-ceiling sanctuary as churchgoers settled into their usual spots. The choir sang an opening chorus, "In His presence there is comfort ... in His presence there is peace...".

Sunlight suddenly flooded the center aisle. The double doors swung open and the homeless man, sloppy and stooped, headed toward the front.

"Oh no. it's him!" somebody muttered.

"What does he think he's doing, anyway?" snapped an incredulous usher.

The stranger set his bagful of dumpster treasures on the very first pew which had been upholstered in an expensive soft teal fabric just three months ago. The music stopped. And before anyone had a chance to react, he ambled up the stairs and stood behind the fine, handcrafted oak podium, where he faced a wide-eyed congregation.

The disheveled stranger spoke haltingly at first, in a low, clear voice. Unbuttoning and removing his top layer of clothing, he described Jesus, and the love He has for all people.

That wise pastor - under the guise of a homeless "nobody" - did not preach a sermon that day, but every person left with plenty to think about.



A Minute for Couples...

(from the Prepare-Enrich blog)

You know you love your spouse... but have you have ever found yourself wondering if you actually like them? Maybe it was just a fleeting thought, when they did that thing that annoys you again. Or maybe it lasted longer, during a rough patch in your marriage.



It might seem contradictory, but loving and liking someone are actually two different emotions. Think of love as a reflection of how you feel internally about someone, while liking them is more of an appreciation for who they are. Ideally, these two emotions are aligned. But marriage can be complicated, and sometimes they're not. You might feel like you're constantly critical, annoyed, or negative with each other, or even dislike spending time together - even though you know you love each other dearly. So what gives? Are there things you can do to get back to liking your spouse as much as you love them? Keep reading.

1. Nurture your friendship.

It seems so basic, and yet one of the aspects of marriage that is easily neglected over time is the friendship between you and your spouse. Sure, you're married, run a household together, possibly have children, and are committed to your lives together- isn't that enough? While those things are all important, actually being friends with your spouse is a major factor in the overall happiness and longevity of your marriage - and this friendship requires intention. Think of your other friends. Chances are you actually admire and appreciate them as people and enjoy spending time with them. What kinds of things do you do to keep those friendships strong? Do you make an effort to have fun together? Do you try to be thoughtful, encouraging, and supportive? Do you focus on their positive traits? Now ask yourself: are you doing those things in your marriage?

2. Separate the person from the behavior.

Sometimes the feeling of disliking your spouse can stem from an action maybe something they said or did, or something they do continuously, like a habit or recurring behavior. It can be difficult, but try to separate the behavior from them as a person. You might dislike something they do, but that doesn't mean you have to dislike who they are. We all have habits that others might find annoying or undesirable, and we probably hope that our loved ones don't hold them against us. Give your spouse that same grace. If there are bigger issues at play, such as excessive moodiness or controlling behavior, consider sitting down for a serious conversation about what's really going on, and get help from a professional if necessary.

3. Don't forget who you are as individuals.

Once you're married, there's a lot of focus on your identity as a couple-

your sense of "we". Healthy relationships have a good amount of this, and it's not unusual for the "we" mentality take priority. It makes sense, as you understandably want to put your marriage and spouse first. What's important is that it's balanced out by both partners maintaining their selfidentity. Having your own separate likes and dislikes, hobbies, interests, friends, etc. is critical to having a healthy sense of self. This uniqueness is a big part of what initially drew you and your partner to each other in the first place, and giving each other the space to continue growing as individuals - together - will ultimately strengthen your relationship in the long

4. Reset your perspective.

Over time, we tend to zero in on the negatives. Maybe the personality traits and quirks that you once found charming you now find annoying. You tend to view your spouse more critically, unable to ignore the flaws you once overlooked. Time to check yourself and get back to seeing each other in a positive light. Next time you find yourself getting irritated or on the verge of making a critical remark, try to flip your perspective by seeing the positive side instead. Or try this exercise: think about how you might "sell" your spouse to someone who doesn't know them. It might sound silly, but you'd play up all their positives, right? Try to lean into that mind-

5. Prioritize your relationship.

It happens - you unintentionally fall into a relationship rut. Maybe your communication has been sub-par lately, or you've both been stressed out and short with each other. Or you're so wrapped up with your kids, jobs, and the day-to-day grind that you no longer get to enjoy the fun-loving side of each other. Get back to the couple you used to be by making sure you are prioritizing quality time and your relationship overall. Schedule date nights or commit to daily check-ins where you focus on your marriage. Sure, your children are obviously important, but the quality of your relationship acts as a foundation and sets the tone for your family.

6. Do some self-reflection.

When you're dealing with (or failing to deal with) your own personal issues, it's not uncommon to project that onto the people closest to you, i.e. your spouse. When you're feeling bad, that negativity can create a cycle within your relationship that builds upon itself. You see the worst in yourself, and you see the worst in your partner, too. Take some time to reflect on whether you've got stuff you need to work through. Talk about it with your spouse. Allowing yourself to be vulnerable increases your emotional intimacy, which can help you get back to appreciating each other again.

Hopefully, you've never (or rarely) had the experience of disliking your spouse. If you have, or are in it right now, you're not alone. Your relationship is not doomed. With intention and a willingness to reframe a negative perspective, you can get back to liking your spouse as much as you love

Mother's Day-May 12, 2024...

Mother's Day can be traced back to ancient pagan practices, but it has gone through a lot of changes and names to get to what we know today. The history of Mother's Day can be traced back to celebrations of ancient Greece in honor of Rhea, the mother of the gods. During the 1600s, the early Christians in England celebrated a day to honor Mary, the mother of Christ. By a religious order, the holiday was later expanded to include all mothers. Mother's Day occurs in the U.S. once a year on the second Sunday of May. Traditional ways to celebrate Mother's Day are to take mothers out to dinner and/or honor them with cards, flowers, or candy. Biblically, honoring mothers (and fathers) is commanded by God in both the Old and New Testaments (Deuteronomy 5:16: Ephesians 6:2).

The Bible does not command us to dedicate a special day to honor our mothers, nor is there anything in the Bible to condemn it. So the question is whether, considering the pagan roots of the holiday. Christians should celebrate Mother's Day. The key is found in Romans 14:5-8: "One man considers one day more sacred than another; another man considers every day alike. Each one should be fully convinced in his own mind. He who regards one day as special, does so to the Lord. He who eats meat, eats to the Lord, for he gives thanks to God; and he who abstains, does so to the Lord and gives thanks to God. For none of us lives to himself alone and none of us dies to himself alone. If we live, we live to the Lord; and if we die, we die to the Lord. So, whether we live or die, we belong to the Lord."

A God-fearing mother helps her children discover God's will, purpose, and path for their lives. She helps them discover their Godgiven gifts and talents and how they may best use them to bless others and glorify God. Through her example, she teaches her children how to pray, live, work, serve, and worship

This day is a reminder to be grateful to our mothers for what they did to bring us into the world. Similarly, we also forget that all of us, including our mothers and fathers and the generations who preceded them, are here because of the true Mother or Parent, God.

The Link has officially purchased the space we have been in since 2021!! With individual donors, community support and a generous grant from the USDA, the funding need-

ed to purchase the building was finally met and closing happened March 29th! We are so blessed and grateful to have a space to call home!

The Link has absorbed a new program—Foster Stitches is a resource for children in foster care and their foster families providing them clothing and other basic necessities when they are put into care. For more information, you can visit www.fosterstitches.org. If you would like to donate toward the mission, you can do so online at www.youarethelink.org and choose "Foster Stitches" from the drop down menu!

The Food Pantry. In March, The Link served 150 households - including 228 adults, 133 children, and 55 seniors - distributing a total of 8,461 pounds of food.

Wildcat Backpack and Snack Pantry. The Link is currently serving 96 children each week from NL-S schools! This is an ability to supplement children's food for the weekend when they are not in school. The Link is also currently connecting 31 teachers with snacks for students in their classroom.

Client Outreach. In March, your donations were able to support 36 families by helping with medical bills, gas, utility bills and rental payments along with providing budgeting support, networking and referrals for additional basic needs. Household Exchange. The Household Exchange Program was able to provide 18 families with much needed furniture and other household necessities in March...





Story Behind The Song...

'In my Father's house are many mansions: if it were not so, I would have told you. I go to prepare a place for you." – John 14:2

Sweet By and By

This is the only hymn ever written in a drugstore. For decades millions of Americans have sung the lyrics to his famous hymn; yet, only a handful know the name of the one who co-wrote Sweet By and By. Sanford Fillmore Bennett was born in New York, 21 June 1836. He moved to Elkhorn, Wisconsin and in 1864 enrolled in the Wisconsin Volunteers and served as Second Lieutenant in the Civil War. Following the war, he returned to Elkhorn and started a drug store. During this time he began the study of medicine at Rush Medical College in Chicago. He graduated in 1874.

Sanford had a friend, a musician named Joseph Webster, who would visit the drugstore and spend time with Sanford. The two men had a mutual love of music and composed several tunes together – Sanford writing the words and Joseph composing the music. One morning two women came in to the drugstore and told Sanford that they had met his friend Joseph and he seemed depressed. "You know how musicians are – temperamental – but I know just what to do to help him when I see him" Sanford replied. Mr. Webster, like many musicians, was of an exceedingly nervous and sensitive nature, and subject to periods of depression. During these times, everything seemed dark to him. Webster had learned his peculiarities so well that on meeting him he could tell at a glance if his friend was melancholy. Webster had found that he could rouse him by giving him a new song to work on.

The following account comes from Sanford Bennet's autobiography:

"He came into my place of business [in Elkhorn, Wisconsin], walked down to the stove, and turned his back on me without speaking. I was at my desk. Turning to him, I said, "Webster, what is the matter now?" "It's no matter," he replied, "It will be all right by and by."

The idea of the hymn came to me like a flash of sunlight, and I replied, "The Sweet By and By! Why would not that make a good hymn?" "Maybe it would," he said indifferently.

Turning to my desk I penned the words of the hymn as fast as I could write. I handed the words to Webster. As he read the words, his eyes kindled. I stepped back to the my desk and he began writing the notes seated at the stove. Taking his violin, he played the melody and then jotted down the notes of the chorus. It was not over thirty minutes from the time I took my pen to write the words before two friends with Webster and myself were singing the hymn."—Sanford Fillmore Bennett (1836-1898)

As the men were singing the new hymn, R.R. Crosby, Sanford's uncle, came into the store. "I never heard that song before" exclaimed Mr. Crosby. "I heard it across the street and couldn't resist coming in to hear it better. That hymn is immortal." It was used in public shortly after, for within two weeks children on the streets were singing it. The hymn became a Gospel standard and has been included in hymnals ever since.

"Sweet By and By" was originally written on a little piece of 5 x 7 paper, but it was big enough to sing its way into the hearts of millions of Christian people for over 140 years.
