

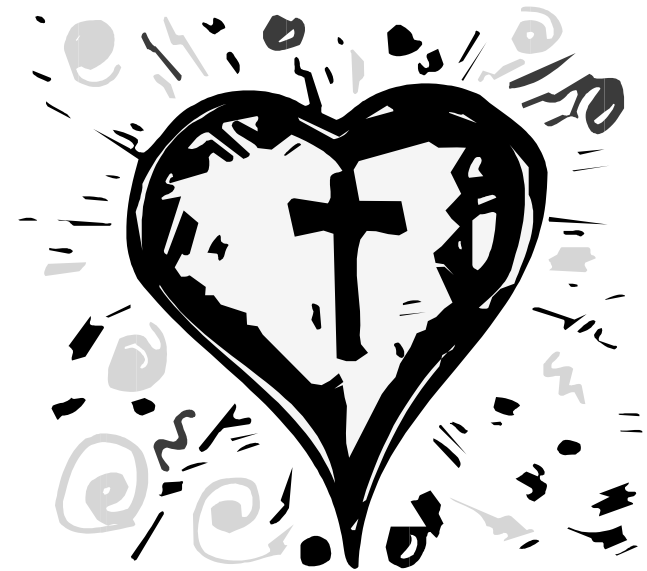

Questions for Pastor...

Taking a little break from the “serious, theological questions” . .

What is your favorite Christmas carol ?

I can't say that I have just one favorite. It seems that there is an unusual number of great songs and carols for Advent and Christmas. There are songs with some of the best tunes as well as songs with great lyrics - and some songs that combine great tunes with great lyrics.

My traditional favorite has been “Joy to the World,” even though it's technically not a Christmas song. It was written as a paraphrase of Psalm 98 and later came to be used as a joyful song celebrating Christ's coming to earth. One reason people like certain songs is that those songs are connected with certain fond memories. That may be the underlying reason Joy to the World always been my favorite. I love the tune, but it's the memory connected with the song that makes it a favorite. You see, when I was growing up Joy to the World was always the song we sung at the end of the Christmas program on Christmas Eve. When the organist pounded out those first notes, I knew the program was over and it was time to head home to open presents - joy to the world!

“Hark! The Herald Angels Sing” is another favorite. Again, it has a bold, joyful tune, and the last two lines really sum up Christmas: *“Mild, He lays His glory by, Born that we no more may die. Born to raise each child of earth, born to give us second birth.”* But this is another song with memories attached. I remember as a child humming this tune in my head as I went to

Lessons From Bible Guys: Jesus

Reprinted from last December (It's just as relevant this year)

It almost seems sacrilegious to refer to Jesus as a "guy." But, the celebration of Christmas reminds us that in addition to being fully God, *Jesus was also fully human*. Indeed he is the ultimate example for us to follow.

As we approach the Christmas season and the celebration of His coming to earth, He gives us the example of the gift to give. What gift did He give us on his birthday (setting the example of something He later said, "It is more blessed to give than receive.")?

The most basic gift Jesus gave was the gift of Himself.

God came to be with us as one of us.

As you are tempted this month to buy all sorts of material gifts for the people close to you, remember what they really want is your presence - not your presents. Get creative and think of ways to give your presence *throughout the coming year* - not just for a week or so after Christmas...

Some ideas: Give your wife the promise of a "date a month"

Give your kids the promise of a special day spent with each of them each month. If they no longer live at home, promise them a visit more often than in the past. Or mark dates each month (week?) when you will call them.

The same thing applies with your parents and your friends. The gift they really want is your presence. It's the example that Jesus set the first Christmas. You will be blessed and so will they.

p.s. Don't forget, that's also the gift Jesus wants for His birthday

But, maybe the song that for me best combines a great tune with great words is "Good King Wenceslas." It's disappointing that the song isn't found in most hymnals. I think that in the story of a king who left his throne to provide for the needs of a poor peasant we really have the story of what happened on Christmas. Christ, the King, looked upon us poor peasants here on earth and saw our greatest need, the need for forgiveness. So, He left His throne in heaven, came to earth and did what only He could do to take care of that need. And just as the king in the song tells his page to follow in his footsteps, Christ tells us to follow in His footsteps, for it is there that we find the power to do what the King did: help others.

Therefore, Christian men, be sure

Will celebrate Charter Sunday w/ New Members with at Potluck January 15.

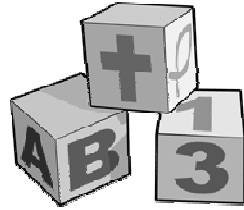
