

## What's your favorite hymn?

Our organist, Sharon Willen, asked me this question a couple months ago. One of the other churches she accompanies was having a "March Madness"-style tournament to determine that congregation's favorite hymn.

That's a question with no "easy" answer. That's because the answer will likely change every time I'm asked that question.

For example, if I fielded that question in December, my answer would most likely be "Hark the Herald Angels Sing." It does a masterful job of describing what really happened when Christ was born. e.g. "God and sinners reconciled." (Plus, it's the song the kids sing at the end of A Charlie Brown Christmas after Linus recites from Luke chapter 2 reminding them what Christmas really is all about!)

If I were asked around Easter "Jesus Christ is Risen Today" would get my vote - based on the rousing tune that really helps us get into celebrating the greatest event in all of history.. "I Know That My Redeemer Lives" would win out if words were the main criteria. In all eight verses that hymn reminds us what Jesus' resurrection really means for our everyday lives.

"What A Friend We Have in Jesus" is another favorite, and may be the greatest reminder we have of the power of prayer - and the peace God brings through it. The hymn title is also what my father chose for his and mom's gravestone.

"How Firm a Foundation" is also a great song with an easy-to-sing tune. It reminds us that God's Word is the rock on which to build a solid life. It contains, in my estimation, one of the greatest verses of comfort and hope ever penned:

The soul that on Jesus hath leaned for repose, I will not, I will not desert to it's foes.

That soul, though all hell shall endeavor to shake, I'll never, no never, no never forsake.

The refrain of *Solid Rock* (in our hymnal it's titled *My Hope is Built on Nothing Less*) has a much needed reminder that everything other than Jesus in which we can place our trust will eventually crumble:

"On Christ the Solid Rock I stand, all other ground is sinking sand."

The answer I gave off the top of my head the moment Sharon asked was "Be Thou My Vision." That answer is based largely on the tune - which probably is my all-time favorite (From All That Dwell Below the Skies is a very close second) - although the words are also a great reminder of the difference that focusing on Jesus makes in life.

If you were to ask me that question a week from now, I just might name a hymn that has slipped my mind today, one whose words are a perfect fit for the situation that day.

The answer to the above question, I assumed, was limited to the more traditional songs in hymnals. But, if I were

to be able to include some of the contemporary songs.... well, that's a question for another month.
