Questions for Pastor...



There's nothing wrong with Ouija boards is there ?

Many young people get exposed to these things - and have for years. Are they harmless fun or things to stay away from? Depending on who you listen to you could get either answer.

Curiosity about supernatural things is pretty natural. God has not only created us as physical beings, He has made us spiritual beings as well. There is a physical world that we can see, but the spiritual side of us also wants to know about the unseen spiritual world.

God's people in Old Testament times were no different. As the Israelites entered the land of Canaan they would be exposed to many occult practices like sorcery, witchcraft, fortune-telling. They would have a natural curiosity about these things, so God told them in advance how to respond: (Deuteronomy 18:9-15)

When you enter the land the Lord your God is giving you, do not learn to imitate the detestable ways of the nations there. [10] Let no one be found among you who sacrifices his son or daughter in the fire, who practices divination or sorcery, interprets omens, engages in witchcraft, [11] or casts spells, or who is a medium or spiritist or who consults the dead. [12] Anyone who does these things is detestable to the Lord, and because of these detestable practices the Lord your God will drive out those nations before you. [13] You must be blameless before the Lord your God.

[14] The nations you will dispossess listen to those who practice sorcery or divination. But as for you, the Lord your God

has not permitted you to do so. [15] The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among your own brothers. You must listen to him.

The prophet God promised to raise up for us to listen to is Jesus. God is very clear that we should seek spiritual information and guidance only from Him. All the occult practices are "detestable" to Him. I'm pretty sure that if Ouija boards would have been around at the time, God would have included them in His list.

We would do well to learn a lesson from the people in Ephesus in Acts 19:18-19

(The apostles, just prior to this passage, demonstrated Jesus' power over Satan by driving an evil spirit out of a person.)

[18] Many of those who believed now came and openly confessed their evil deeds. [19] A number who had practiced sorcery brought their scrolls together and burned them publicly. When they calculated the value of the scrolls, the total came to fifty thousand drachmas. (About 4-5 million dollars in today's economy)

Those people now realized that Jesus was the most powerful supernatural force. As a result they were willing to throw away a literal fortune in occult books they had used in an effort to tap into Satan's power.

To sum it up, I think something we talked about recently in our Tuesday study is important to remember:

Satan is very powerful, but he can't force his way into your life. He is, however, ready and willing to "make himself at home" in your life if you give him an invitation. In fact he'll do all sorts of things to get you to issue an invitation.

I would definitely say that using a Ouija board (or any other way of trying to contact the spirit world for answers) is kind of like opening the door and putting out the "Welcome" mat inviting Satan to come into your life. Don't do it.

After this, it says that God really came down on the Philistines and "smote them with tumors", (which in some translations, says, "hemorrhoids"), until the people freaked out and

decided they better give the Ark back to Israel.

This might sound like a strange story to have as a favorite, but it has always had an impression on me for a number of reasons. First of all, I love the image of the power of God knocking that statue over. It reminds of the scene in "Indiana Jones" where God's power burns the swastika off the crate in which the Ark is being kept – only this is real. Also, I like how the story demonstrates that you don't mess around with God or His people, and that there are consequences for those who do. Lastly, the warnings that God sent as well as His choice of punishment (possibly hemorrhoids) tells me that God has a sense of humor, which makes Him more approachable to me, someone I'd like to get to know.

What attracted you to Living Word...

I had known a few people that have gone to Shepherd of the Hills for years and were very active in their church. As they were people that seemed to really walk the walk, this made an impression on me. A Minute for Parents...

TEACHING THE FAITH - PART 7

How do you "stay connected" to Jesus ?

If we want our children to grow up to be disciples of Jesus, we must be attached to Jesus ourselves. But how can you stay attached to Jesus? Here's where "the rubber meets the road" - **some practical things you can do to stay connected and produce fruit in your home:**

+ Connect to Jesus in *daily* Bible study. You can't be connected to someone unless you let them speak to you. God talks to you in his Word. God's power to grow the fruits of faith is in His Word. You must be "plugged in" to His Word to have that power flowing through you.

If your children witness you reading and studying your Bible daily, they will *naturally* develop the belief that God's Word is an important part of daily life. Of course, we should also make a daily practice of reading God's Word to and with them from the beginning. (2 Timothy 3:15)

+ Connect to Jesus in daily prayer. You also can't really be connected to someone unless you talk to them. Pray daily. Pray for God's Spirit to empower you to stay connected to Jesus and to let your actions match your words. Pray for opportunities to talk with your kids about faith issues. Pray specifically for the Holy Spirit to work in the lives of your kids to help them grow closer to Jesus. Pray for God to protect your children from the anti-Christian influences they will encounter from friends, television and movies, music and school.

+ Connect to Jesus in worship. You can't really be connected to someone without hanging out with them on a regular basis. What will your child learn about the importance of God if you skip worship to sleep in, or get a work project done, or go golfing or when you have company. What will your child learn about God if you go to worship even when you would love to sleep in, and even when you have lots of work to do, and even when there's a golf tournament Sunday morning, and even when you have company? As 2 Kings 17:41 reminded us, our kids will worship what we worship - not what we give lip service to.

The most important thing to remember in teaching the faith is **STAY CONNECTED TO JESUS**. The fruit-bearing details will naturally take care of themselves if you are connected to Jesus through daily prayer and Bible Study, weekly worship. Ask God for His help to do these.

Lessons From Bible Guys: Another Unnamed Guy

In the first chapter of the Gospel of Mark we read about a man who had leprosy. This could have been one of a number of chronic skin diseases that ranged from "nuisance" to "life-threatening". No matter what the severity one thing was certain: His disease rendered him "unclean" which meant that he was prevented from entering the presence of God in the Temple.

A man with leprosy came to him and begged him on his knees, "If you are willing, you can make me clean."
Mark 1:40

I think the man sets us a great example in what he asked for. Did you notice that he didn't ask for what we'd expect? He didn't ask to "be healed.." He asked to be "made clean."

In that simple request we see what was most important to him. It wasn't physical healing but spiritual healing. He wanted to be made clean and able to enter the presence of God more than he wanted to be healed. He had his priorities straight.

Lent is a great time to check your priorities. Who or what is more important than God in your life? Ask God for the power to re-arrange any misplaced priorities. Then ask him to do for you what he did for the man with leprosy. Ask Him to make you clean. Jesus died to make you clean - to forgive your sins and enable you to enter the presence of God eternally. That's great motivation to make Him number one priority in your life.
