# Question for Pastor...

The Bible says "God knows our needs before we ask," so why do we need to ask?

A great question. One that I've received more than once. The underlying question often is "Why bother praying - God' knows what we need... and besides He's going to do what He wants anyway."

It is very true that God knows our needs and sometimes (maybe most often) he provides what we need without asking. But there are many instances in the Bible where God gave something just because someone asked - and would not have given it had they not asked.

God tells us to ask for things in prayer for several reasons. First of all, humility is one of the things God values most in His people. Asking God for something is by its very nature a humbling experience. When you ask God for something you are admitting that you aren't capable of providing that thing by yourself, you aren't capable of controlling the situation on your own, you aren't capable of doing what God alone can do. Admitting there are things we can't do is a humbling thing.

Second, "trust" is another thing God requires of His people. Again, prayer by its very nature is an act of trust. You wouldn't be asking God for something if you didn't have at least a little trust that He has the power to give what you ask for.

Third, God may wait until we ask for something before He gives it, so we realize that He is the one who gave it - and

then give Him the credit for doing so. The more He gives without our asking, the more we take Him for granted, or even credit ourselves for all the good things we have.

Of course, there's always the "relationship aspect" to keep in mind. Above all else God wants a personal relationship with each one of us. He wants it so badly that He sent His Son to the cross in order to remove the barrier of sin that would have prevented sinful people from ever being reconciled with a sinless God. And one of the truths about relationships is that you can't have one without talking to the other person. When we come to God in prayer we are taking the time to talk to God - strengthening our relationship.

Jesus said, "Ask and you shall receive." When you ask God for something you will always receive an answer. That answer may be "Yes." The answer could be, "No, I have a better idea." Or the answer could be, "Yes, but first I want you to...." But whatever the answer you can trust it truly is the best answer.





# Coping With Stress...

Some insights from our studies thus far:

# Stress isn't inherently good or bad, it's natural

- That means
  - 1) You can't avoid it.
- Whether it is good or bad depends on how you respond to it.
- Romans 8:28 Reminds us that God can make "all things" (including the situation that brings the stress) work for our good.



- 1) Don't let fear paralyze you.
- Figure out what you can do in the situation then do it.
  - 3) Trust God to do what you can't do.

# <u>Philippians 4:6-9 gives additional insights on dealing with stress:</u>

Do not be anxious about anything, ... DON'T WORRYbut in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus....

INSTEAD PRAY - as a first response, not a last resort

[8] Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable--if anything is excellent or praiseworthy--think about such things.... FOCUS YOUR MIND ON THE GOOD THINGS GOD HAS ALREADY DONE

[9] Whatever you have learned or received or heard from me, or seen in me--put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you.... DON'T JUST SIT THERE - DO SOMETHING!

# So, what kinds of things should you do in response to stress?

1. Remember the "Owner's Manual" Principle:

"Follow the instructions and things work; Don't follow the instructions and things break." (The Bible is our Owner's Manual)

2. Remember the "Creatures of Habit" Principle:

We keep responding the same way - even when it doesn't work.

So QUIT RESPONDING IN WAYS THAT AREN'T WORK-ING (e.g. yelling, drinking, not dealing with it)

# Two promises from God about our responses to stress:

- The promise of FORGIVENESS for our bad past responses
- 2) The promise of His POWER to respond better in the future

Some positive ways of responding to stress: Prayer, reading your Bible, Bible study, exercise, talking to friends who are known to give good advice)

# Relationships are a major source of stress.

Stress in relationships can be caused by sin, conflict (natural differences) and unmet expectations. Some keys to resolving relationship stress:

- Deal with the conflict (God gives great instructions in Ephesians 4:22-5:2)
- Adjust your expectations
- 3. Communicate your expectations (so the other person knows what you expect)

# The Story Behind the Song...

# Take My Life and Let It Be

Recently in our Tuesday Bible study we've been taking a look at some of the songs in the Bible. When it
comes to songs in the Bible we tend to think of the
Psalms, but there are actually quite a few songs outside the Psalms. One such song is known as the Song
of Hannah. The song is a prayer of praise after Hannah made good on a vow to the Lord to give her son
Samuel to the Lord for service in the temple.

That song prompted us to look through our hymnal to find hymns that were actually prayers. One of those "prayer songs" is Take My Life and Let It Be. Here's the story behind it as told in *Devotionals from Famous Hymn Stories*.

The hymn was written by Frances Havergal who was bom in England in 1836. In her early twenties she became ill and was confined to a wheelchair for most of the rest of her life. Even in those trying years she kept a cheerful attitude and strove to use her musical talents to be a blessing to others.

Take My Life and Let It Be came about as a result of a 5-day trip to London. She visited a home where ten people were living. She found that several members of the household were not believers in Christ and that the rest seemed to find no joy in their faith. She asked God to give her all in the house before she left.

On the last night of her stay, the governess brought the two unconverted daughters to her, weeping. They were both deeply concemed about their spiritual welfare and had asked to see Miss Havergal. The Spirit empowered her to lead the two to faith in Jesus. Frances later wrote that she stayed up most of the night rejoicing and re-consecrating her own life to God. As the hours wore on, the lines of a poem began to form in her head:

Take my life and let it be Consecrated, Lord to Thee
