

Question for Pastor...

Where Did This "Maundy Thursday" come from ?

There are lots of words we use in church that are not part of our everyday vocabulary. Words like "liturgy," "justification," and "hallowed." "Maundy" certainly fits into that category.

The Thursday of Holy Week has been referred to by the church as Maundy Thursday for centuries. The word "maundy" is derived from the Latin *mandatum* meaning "commandment." (English words "mandate," "mandatory," "command" and "demand" are all derived from this Latin word). The *mandatum* referred to on this special Thursday is found in Jesus' words to His apostles as recorded in John 13:34: "A new command I give you: love one another."

Of course, the command to love one another is found throughout the Bible. The "new" part of that command is found in the next sentence: "As I have loved you, so you must love one another." We are to love one another as Jesus loved us. And how would that be? In a word: "unconditionally."

Loving others unconditionally - as Jesus did - means loving each other when our love is not returned. Loving others when they are "unloveable." Loving others when there is absolutely nothing in it for us. Loving others by doing what they need - even when we don't feel like giving what they need. In the next sentence Jesus went on to say that this kind of love is something that demonstrates to others that we are truly disciples of Jesus.

On "Maundy" Thursday Christians around the world gather to recall the events that took place on that night when Jesus was betrayed. The gospels of Matthew, Mark, and Luke (Matthew 26:20-30; Mark 14:17-26; and Luke 22:14-35) concentrate on the institution of the Lord's Supper, so Holy Communion is always celebrated in worship services that day.

The gospel of John (chapters 13-16) focuses instead on the Lord's final teachings to His disciples, including His example of humble,

servanthood demonstrated when He washed their feet. In later centuries, some Christians would combine the two emphases and commemorate the Last Supper with a ceremonial foot-washing, which came to be known in French as a , a shorter form of . That French word became a descriptive term applied to the day, becoming "maunde" in Middle English. Eventually, its spelling was standardized as "maundy," the word we use today.

One tradition typically observed after the communion meal in Maundy Thursday worship services is that of stripping the altar. The members of the altar guild remove all vessels, crosses, books, candles, linens, paraments, banners, and other decorations from the altar and chancel area. This ancient ritual is a powerful and dramatic reenactment of the Lord's humiliation at the hands of the Roman soldiers. As the altar is being stripped, left bare or adorned only with black paraments, it is transformed from the communion table of Maundy Thursday into the tomb slab of Good Friday.

While we're at it, I might as well refer to a couple other unusual words we will use during Holy Week: seder and tenebrae.

Seder is a Hebrew word meaning "order" or "sequence". The Passover Seder is the special meal where special foods are eaten in a specific "order." This seder meal relives the enslavement and subsequent Exodus of the Children of Israel from Ancient Egypt and is designed to help participants remember what God did for His people in that Passover event.

Tenebrae is a Latin word meaning "darkness." In many churches the Good Friday worship is marked by the progressive extinguishing of candles as each of the "seven last words" spoken by Jesus on the cross are read. The final candle to be extinguished is the Christ Candle - a candle that calls to mind the fact that Jesus came to be a "Light to the world." The Christ Candle is then removed from the sanctuary symbolizing Jesus being cast out of the Father's presence as part of taking the punishment for our sin. It is a very stark visual reminder that Jesus had his life snuffed out by Satan and all the "forces of darkness." But the Tenebrae service ends with the Christ Candle brought back into the sanctuary and placed on the altar. It serves as a reminder to return on Easter Sunday morning when that Christ Candle will be re-lit as we celebrate Jesus' Resurrection and the fact that because of His death and Resurrection there is a "light at the end of the tunnel for all who trust in Him.

The Bible study closes with a look at the development of the English Bible and some of the heroic pains required of men and women who gave everything to get God's message into print. Throughout each chapter, Web links offer interesting jumping-off points for users to glean more information.

As an expert on this subject, Dr. Paul Maier, who is the Russell H. Seibert professor of ancient history at Western Michigan University, has profound insights regarding the production, canonization, and inspiration behind the texts that comprise the Scriptures.

From Focus On The Family re: The Tim Tebow SuperBowl ad

Just last week while I was in Tampa, Florida, I met a friend of the ministry. "Bill" asked to chat, and I was eager to listen. Here is the essence of what he said:

"Now, look, please don't get me wrong. I was excited to see Focus run that ad in the Super Bowl--if you're going to be effective, you're going to have to reach a new generation and maybe try new things in new ways. I get it! But my wife, who loves Focus, said she thought the ad was kind of 'soft,' and she was disappointed it didn't even mention the word abortion. What do you say to people like her?"

I was grateful for the candid dialogue. I shared with Bill some of the background behind the ad, especially surrounding our conversation with CBS. For example, the network would not permit the word "abortion" to even be mentioned. So, if we didn't want to play by their rules, we couldn't run the spot. I also explained there had always been a two-part strategy surrounding the ad campaign. Our main goal was to drive viewers to FocusOnTheFamily.com where the full story of Mr. and Mrs. Tebow was featured. Over 1.5 million people have viewed the online movie.

The second part of the ongoing strategy concerns our commitment and passion to witness to people about the saving nature of Jesus Christ with a gentle spirit of humility. Focus on the Family is HIS ministry. As such, we're determined to engage the culture and present His truths--respectfully, thoughtfully and winsomely--all from a biblically based foundation.

Incidentally, I also shared with Bill some new research data that indicated the Super Bowl ad caused over 5 million viewers to reconsider their view of the legality/morality of abortion.

Sermon Summary...

"By His Stripes: Healing Wounded Relationships"

The Christian life (indeed all human life) is about relationships: Our relationship with God and with each other. Each Sunday in Lent we have looked at things Satan uses to tear down relationships in our lives - and what God gives to heal them.

So Far We've Focused on These Things Satan Uses to Destroy Relationships. Which ones are troubling for you ...

Escalation... Where a simple disagreement escalates into name-calling, digging up the past, and eventually ends up with contempt for each other.

Invalidation... Snide remarks, sarcasm and direct put-downs of people's ideas and actions as a way of trying to make yourself feel superior.

Negative Interpretation... A situation where one person always assumes the other person has "an uterior motive" for everything they do or say.

Withdrawal and Avoidance... where one person deals with conflicts and issues by NOT dealing with them. Withdrawing from the relationship

A Minute For Parents...

Story Behind The Song...

"Christ Arose"

Songs that celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus Christ are some of the greatest songs ever written. *Christ Arose* is one of those songs. Our choir will sing it on Easter again this year. The song sets an appropriate tone for our celebration as it begins slow and somber with the words "Low in the grave He lay," calling to mind the reality of Jesus' death on Good Friday. But the song builds to a crescendo as it announces the great news: "Up From the Grave He Arose!"

The song is a bit unusual in that both the words and the music were penned by the same person, Robert Lowry. During his lifetime Mr. Lowry had served as a professor of literature at Bucknell University, pastored several large churches in the eastern United States and finally became music editor of Bigelow Publishing Company.

It was during the Easter season in 1874 as Mr. Lowry was having a his evening devotions that the angel's words from Luke 24:6-7 struck a chord with him (literally).

He is not here; he has risen! Remember how he told you, while he was still with you in Galilee: The Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, be crucified and on the third day be raised again.'"

Soon Lowry found himself seated at the little pump organ in the parlor of his home translating his thoughts about that verse into the words of the great Easter hymn *Christ Arose*. Not only does the song sum up the message of victory, but the words at the end of each line of the verses remind us of the result for us of Jesus' rising from the grave:

- 1) He can be trusted as our Savior and
- 2) He deserves to be followed as our Lord.

The song was published the following year and has been a favorite way for Christians to express their victory joy ever since.

Low in the grave He lay, Jesus my Savior! Waiting the coming day, Jesus my Lord!

> Up from the grave He arose, with a mighty triumph o'er His foes. He arose a victor from the dark domain, and He lives forever with His saints to reign. He arose! He arose! Hallelujah, Christ Arose!


