Question for Pastor...

"Why do we believe the Bible?"

One of our sessions in confirmation instruction is dedicated to having the students ask questions. (It seems like almost every topic we cover brings up questions, but we have one class devoted to just questions they have.) To get them started, I give them some prompts like "What do we believe about....., Why do we, and Why did Jesus....." The above question came after the "Why do we believe...." prompt.

The question actually has a bit of clarification. "Why do we believe the Bible ... and not the books other religions are based on?"

It's a great question. It gets at the heart of our faith. And faith is at the heart of the answer. The message of the Bible really comes down to faith. And the Bible is clear that we don't come by that faith naturally. For example we are told, "No one can say, 'Jesus is Lord' except by the Holy Spirit." (1 Corinthians 12:3) When we have faith that the Bible is the true and accurate revelation of God, the Holy Spirit gets the credit for bringing us to that conviction.

But the fact that we "take it on faith" doesn't mean that we have a "blind faith" - or that there is no evidence for what we believe. In fact, just the opposite is true. There is evidence for the truth of the message in the Bible.

For starters, in a court of law a point can be taken as fact on the agreement of as little as two witnesses. God used no less than 40 different authors to record his revelation. 40 different witnesses to the same truth. Compare that with the sacred writings of most

other religions which are typically penned by only one person. One person whose writings are basically ideas and thoughts. Whereas the message of the Bible is grounded in events that took place in verifiable history. For example, the exodus in the Old Testament and the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus in the New Testament.

It's one thing to believe what one person says "because what they say makes sense." (All sorts of things that don't work in reality seem to make sense "on paper.") It's a whole different thing to believe writings that are grounded in historical fact.

The apostle Paul goes so far as to say that the entire Christian message stands or falls on the historical event we call the Resurrection of Jesus. Paul says (in 1 Corinthians 15) that if this event didn't really happen, then we are fools and liars. But that if Jesus really did rise from the grave, then we can be sure that our faith in Jesus is placed in the right place.

At the time of the Resurrection even the enemies of Jesus admitted that the tomb He was placed in on Friday was empty on Sunday. All they had to do was produce the body of Jesus in order to prove the Christian religion to be false. They were not able to produce His body, because He had indeed risen from the grave and was no longer dead. We have further evidence of the truth of the Resurrection in the ten disciples who were put to death for their conviction that Jesus had risen from the grave. It has been correctly said that those disciples would not have been willing to die for a lie or "pie in the sky." They were willing to die for their belief in Jesus' resurrection because they had seen Him alive again.

In short, we trust in the message of the Bible because the Holy Spirit has brought us to faith in it, and because there is evidence to back it up.

Highlights from 50 DAYS ABLAZE Week Two: PRAY

- Do not attempt to witness to a Jehovah's Witness (or anyone else) unless you first have a love in your heart for that person
- · Prayer is often a "last resort" when it should be a "first response."
- Satan hates it when Christians pray, because prayer plugs us in to God's power - and Satan knows he can't win against that power.
- Prayer is both "preparation for the battle" with Satan and a battle in itself (because prayer is also an act of trust in God and Satan fights to keep us from doing that).
- God used the prayer of a Sunday School teacher offered 75 years earlier to set in motion events that would result in Billy Graham coming to faith in Jesus.
- 50% of people not now attending church say they would consider an invitation from someone who does attend
- We have two choices as we look at the world (and life): 1) See the problems or 2) See the potential
- The Lord's Prayer could also be thought of as "The Disciples"
- The Lord's Prayer is about the attitudes we should have including a focus not on self, but on God and others
- One of our greatest privileges is that of lifting others up in praver
- Set an empty chair in front of you when you prayer, then envision Jesus in it and just talk to Him as you would talk to a friend.
- Prayer changes us.

Habitat for Humanity...

TAKING APPLICATIONS FOR A HOME IN NEW LONDON

Habitat for Humanity of West Central Minnesota is currently seeking a partner family for a home in New London. Would you please help us spread the word by including information in your bulletin and newsletter; making an announcement during your next church service; and posting the attached flyer on a community bulletin board?

Habitat for Humanity is an ecumenical Christian housing ministry that exists to:

- Provide simple, decent housing for low-income families;
- Make decent shelter a matter of conscience and action; and
- Bear witness to the Gospel of Jesus Christ throughout West Central Minnesota.

Our partner families are selected based on three factors: need, ability to pay, and willingness to partner. Need can be defined as unsafe, inadequate, or overcrowded conditions and/or spending more than 30% of monthly income on rent. Ability to pay is important because Habitat does not give houses away. Rather, families partner with our organization throughout the building process and eventually purchase the home by making payments on a 30 year, 0% mortgage. Partner families must have a minimum of \$25,000 in annual income and not exceed the maximum income guidelines found on the attached flyer. This income includes all wages, social security, county assistance, and child support.

Willingness to partner is our final selection factor. Habitat partner families put in 200 hours of sweat equity for a single adult family or 500 hours for a two-adult family. Sweat equity hours for the New London family will be spent making improvements to the existing home and attending homeowner classes that are designed to help families transition from renting to owning.

The home in New London has three bedrooms and one bathroom. Habitat follows Equal Housing Lender regulations; all families who meet the above criteria are welcome to apply. Families or individuals who would like to apply should call our office at 320-231-2704 to request an application.

Applications will be accepted from January 3rd-February 7th. We will greatly appreciate your assistance in generating awareness with the attached resources and personal referrals during the coming month.

A young man was getting ready to graduate from college. For many months he had admired a beautiful sports car in a dealer's showroom, and knowing his father could well afford it, he told him that was all he wanted.

As Graduation Day approached, the young man awaited signs that his father had purchased the car. Finally, on the morning of his graduation, his father called him into his private study. His father told him how proud he was to have such a fine son, and told him how much he loved him. He handed his son a beautifully wrapped gift box.

Curious, and somewhat disappointed, the young man opened the box and found a lovely, leather-bound Bible, with the young man's name embossed in gold. Angry, he rose his voice to his father and said "with all your money, you give me a Bible?" and stormed out of the house.

Many years passed and the young man was very successful in business. He had a beautiful home and wonderful family, but realized his father was very old, and thought perhaps he should go to him. He had not seen him since that graduation day. Before he could make arrangements, he received a telegram telling him his father had passed away, and willed all of his possessions to his son. He needed to come home immediately and take care of things.

When he arrived at his father's house, a sudden feeling of sadness and regret filled his heart. He began to search through his father's important papers and saw the still gift-wrapped Bible,

Story Behind The Song...

I Love To Tell The Story

Arabella Catherine Hankey, commonly known as Kate Hankey was not born into the kind of family that typically rears song-writers and missionaries. Kate was born in 1834 and grew up in a fashionable London suburb as the daughter of a wealthy British banker. However, Kate had a passion for the gospel that sent her into the world to share the Good News.

Nothing is known of how or when Kate Hankey came to Christ. However, it is told that she started a Bible class for the girls in her neighborhood when she was young. By the time she was eighteen, she went to London and started a Bible class for girls who worked in the factories. She started a second class when she was in her twenties. Obviously, Kate's passion was sharing the gospel.

In her thirties, Kate became seriously ill. Her doctors put her on bed rest and told her she could not teach her Bible classes for twelve months. However, despite her illness, Kate still believed in the gospel and desired to share it with those around her. When she began her bed rest she wrote a poem that became the hymn *Tell Me the Old, Old Story* about ten months later she wrote *I Love to Tell the Story*.

After ten months, Kate's strength returned and she was able to leave her bed. Soon she began teaching her classes again. She continued to teach the gospel to factory girls until she was too old to sustain the commitment.

Even when she was too old to teach factory girls, Kate found a way to share the gospel. Kate started a prison ministry in London. Kate died in 1911 but the world is still reminded of the gospel and Kate's passion for it whenever they hear the song I Love to Tell the Story or its companion Tell Me the Old, Old Story

Kate Hankey clearly loved the Lord and took to heart I Peter 3:15 "be ready always to give an answer to every man that asketh you a reason of the hope that is in you with meekness and fear." When today's Christians today sing her hymns, the call to carry the message forward can be heard in the word's she penned.
