(Had to keep that one I kept to myself).

You have no idea how excited I am to finally be able to answer

"WE ARE GOING TO BREAK GROUND THIS SPRING!"

and to know that is not just wishful thinking!

I have been to be able to give that answer many times since our Voters' Assembly on Palm Sunday unanimously approved going ahead with construction. And, each time I've given it, the reaction has been with equal excitement for us!

In this May issue, on the next few pages, you will find drawings of the floor plan, the location on our land, and view from outside. You will also find the cost figures and list of subcontractors whose bids have been selected by our Building Committee.

A Ground-Breaking Celebration Sunday is planned for May 20. That day we will celebrate in worship God's work in bringing us to this point. The Sunday School students will be

"The papers for the mortgage are ready to be signed, so that's exciting. We're looking forward to our land-use permit receiving final approval at the county board meeting on May 15th. The excavating can proceed immediately after that. We're also counting on lots of volunteer help once the walls are up and the roof is on."

Special thanks is due to our Building Committee for the many hours they have put into planning: Chair Jamie Iverson, Mark Fuglie, Mona Hjelle, Brent Sawatzky and Kevin Welsh.







District Convention Summary...

Pastor David and Vice Chairman Tim Geer represented Living Word at the convention which was held at Alexandria, April 16-18.

Here's a quick summary of the 'high points' of the convention:

- Rev. Donald Fondow was re-elected to another 3-year term as President of the Minnesota North District
- Rev. Steve Bielenberg of Redeemer, Willmar was re-elected to serve as Circuit Counselor for our circuit (Montevideo Circuit)
- Lutheran Hour Ministries Speaker Rev. Greg Seltz spoke about "Flexing our faith muscles" by "unleashing God's mercy" on our neighbors in their times of need. He emphasized that showing mercy requires being willing to get into people's lives and be willing to meet them where they are with what they need, and that mercy eventually leads to opportunities to share the Good News of Jesus with people.
- Synod President Rev. Matthew Harrison answered questions and spoke about the Synod's "Witness, Mercy and Life Together" emphasis. He received a standing ovation in recognition of his presentation to the United States House of Representatives Health and Human Services committee this March. In that presentation he encouraged the legislature to defeat the Administration's proposed mandate that all organizations offer and pay for abortion-causing drugs as part of the health plans offered to their employees.

A Sampling of Resolutions Passed:

- To encourage all members of MN North District LC-MS congregations to vote for the Marriage Protection Amendment in the election this coming November. This amendment to the Minnesota constitution would "provide that only a union of one man and one woman shall be valid or recognized as a marriage in Minnesota." (The ELCA in Minnesota has gone on record as urging its members to vote against the amendment.)
- To join with the North Dakota District in supporting Project 24
 an effort by our partner church in Kenya to build three orphanage "rescue centers" there.
- To allow the District to continue to call two full-time Mission and Ministry Facilitators, even though one of them, Pastor Rick Hans, is retiring this year. (Pastor Dave Strohschein is the Facilitator assigned to work with Living Word).
- To encourage each MN North District congregation to conduct a yearly strategic planning session centered around our Synod's "Witness, Mercy and Life Together" theme.

Just for Dads...

Some of us remember the times our dads were active in our lives: sitting in the stands cheering us on, waking us up early to go fishing, packing the

van for vacation, sitting next to us in church. Some of us remember the hole that was there when our dads weren't around to do stuff with us. Does it really matter if dads do stuff with their kids?

Besides our own experiences, there are a number of studies indicating the more stuff a man does with kids, the better the kids turn out. One study sums it up when it concludes this: "Without two parents working together as a team, the child has more difficulty learning the combination of empathy, reciprocity, fairness and self-command that people ordinarily take for granted. If the child does not learn this at home, society will have to manage his behavior in some other way. He may have to be rehabilitated, incarcerated, or otherwise restrained. In this case, prisons will substitute for parents." Though the downward spiral and end result this study suggests are extreme, it would seem to be true that what kids don't get at home they often pick up from the streets.

The Men's Network offers another chance for men to get involved in the world of their kids. Do Stuff with Your Kids provides the rationale and framework to be active in the lives of your children. Find out more at

Story Behind The Song...

"This is My Father's World"

Our Easter song, "Every Morning is Easter Morning," contains the line "Daily news is so bad it seems the Good News seldom gets heard." But our song this month reminds us that God has surrounded us with evidence of His love and creativity and power. The beauty of the creation He has surrounded us constantly speaks of His majesty and glory. Who can deny the pleasure that comes from the sight of a glowing sunset or a majestic mountain, the song of the birds early on a sunny spring morning, the roar of the surf at the ocean and the smell of new mown hay or grass?

Maltbie D. Babcock put his great admiration for God's creation into the words of they hymn "This is My Father's World." He was recognized as one of the outstanding Presbyterian ministers in the late 1800's, Dr. Babcock was also a skilled athlete who enjoyed all outdoor activity - especially his early morning walks. He would comment, "I'm heading out to see my Father's world."

Dr. Babcock was also an accomplished performer on the organ, the piano and violin, so it was natural for him to write that God's creation seemed to him to be "the music of the spheres."

This hymn is not simply a tribute to God's work in creation, but the final verse reminds us of the unfailing power of God and the assurance of the victory Christ won for us on the cross and empty tomb, "Jesus, who died shall be satisfied, and earth and heav'n be one."

As we gaze upon the beauty of God's creation we are reminded that He has placed us here as stewards (caretakers) of His world. The real answer to the ecological problems of our world is not to be found in a trendy concern to be "green," but rather in the simple reminder given by
