

Question for Pastor...

"Do dogs go to heaven ?"

For some reason I keep getting asked this question over and over. It's really not difficult to figure out why. Dogs (and cats, and gerbils and whatever other pets you may have) can quickly become 'part of the family.' And sometimes they are easier to deal with than the human members of the family. The dog doesn't talk back, always listens and shows you proceed the part of the start that's what we think. It con



unconditional love (At least, that's what we think. It could be they are just being nice to us, so they can get more treats.)

We have two dogs (plus a cat), so I decided to check with them to see if they had any insight into the question. They looked up at me with those adoring eyes. I'm sure they were just thinking, "Maybe he has treats."

Sometimes the best answer to a question is a simple, "I really don't know." And that's the answer I'd have to give. I can say "I hope so," but I can't go so far as to replace "hope" in that sentence with another four-letter word: "know." I do hope so, but I don't know so.

I can say, though, that I am convinced that there will be animals in eternity. The end of the Bible - the book of Revelation - depicts God restoring people and the earth to their original condition. We look to the first few chapters of the first book of the Bible for clues about that original condition. The most important part of that original condition is that human beings will have a perfect relationship with God. We will live in His visible, audible presence and really understand Him. The Apostle Paul describes our understanding of God here on earth as looking through a really fogged-up glass. In eternity, though, we will see/understand God with perfect darity - no more fog.

But one of the other things we find in the perfect world that God created was.... ANIMALS. All kinds of them. And when God destroyed the world by a flood and started over with just Noah and seven others, the vast

majority of the passengers God saved on that ark were.... ANIMALS. It's quite apparent to me that God has a very important place in His creation - and re-creation in eternity - for animals. I have no doubts that God will have animals in eternity along with us humans.

The question that remains unanswered, however, is this: "Will the specific animals who were part of our families here on earth be with us in eternity?"

The story is told that one of Martin Luther's kids asked him that same question. Luther answered it by saying, "If, when you get to heaven, you want your dog there, it will be there." (The idea being that in heaven we will have everything we want.) But Luther followed that comment up with this: "The real question is this: "When you get to heaven, will you still want your dog there?" (The idea being that some things that are important to us on this earth will no longer important to us in eternity.)

I would have to say in answer to that, that I see no reason why animals that were important to us here would all of a sudden not be important in an eternity where there will be animals.

But as for the question, "Will my dog be in heaven?" The best I can say is, "I don't know for sure, but I sure do hope so."

We accept building materials, large appliances, furniture, and more. A full list can be found below. Materials can be brought 9am-5pm Mondays-Fridays to our office location and future home of the Habitat ReStore at 619 Benson Ave. SW in downtown Willmar, next to Family Dollar on HWY 12.

By donating useable materials, they are kept out of landfills which leads to a greener and healthier community. If a donation cannot be used in a Habitat home, it will be sold at a bargain price in the Re-Store. ALL proceeds from ReStore sales go to our local Habitat so we can help more people in the community!

- Appliances: Less than 5 years old, CLEAN and WORKING
- Cabinets: No built-ins, must be complete unit –doors, hardware, etc
- Countertops: No holes or sink inserts
- Doors: No deep gouges, holes, water damage, bowing, splintering
- Electrical: No odds and ends
- Flooring: New or like new, no stains, rips or odors, useable quantity
- Furniture: Upholstered furniture must be completely stain, rip and odor free, no major repairs needed
- · Hardware: No odds and ends, quantity needed
- Landscaping Materials: No damaged bricks, pavers, or fencing, useable quantity
- Lighting Fixtures: No broken glass, no repairs, all parts working
- Lumber and trim: No smaller than half sheet or 5', no nails or damage
- Paint: No lead or oil paint, full, unopened cans only
- Plumbing Fixtures: CLEAN, WORKING, stain free, has all parts
- Roofing Materials: Large donations only, useable quantity, no scraps
- Tools: Complete in working condition
- Windows: No single pane, cracked or fogged glass, or rotted sills

- Materials containing lead
- Materials containing asbestos
- Chemicals

What is Your Next Step in a "Closer Walk With Jesus"?

During the Lenten Season we have been challenged to "Take the Next Step," so we can have a "Closer Walk" with Jesus.

We've looked at these areas for ideas of possible Next Steps:

- Loving God above all things. We learned that the Bible says we show our love for God by obeying Him. So, a possible "next step" can be found by looking at the 10 Commandments - and Luther's explanation of them.
- 2) Loving your neighbor as yourself. We saw Jesus teach in the parable of the Good Samaritan that *everyone* is our neighbor, and the question for us to ask is "How can I be a neighbor." Who needs you to help them? That's a possible "next step."
- 3) Trusting that God will continue to provide when you follow his command to return to Him the first ten percent of what He's entrusted to you. Tithing may be a possible "next step" for you.
- 4) Using the talents God has blessed you with. We all use our talents for God - maybe not as many or as often as we should. But one "next step" each of us can take as we use those talents is to use them with the right attitude. The attitude God talks about in 1 Corinthians 13: An attitude of love.

What's a "Next Step" you can take in your effort to have a "closer walk" with Jesus? Ask God for His power to do it. (And His forgiveness when you "take two steps forward and one step back.")

New Prayer Opportunities...

One of our Core Values at Living Word is "People Praying *To-aether."*

Jesus promised His special presence when people get together to pray: "Where two or three are gathered together in My name, there am I in the midst of them."

With that in mind we are offering a handful of ways to "get together" to pray.

1) Pray with the Elders after worship.

God tells us in the book of James (5:14-15), "Is any one of you in trouble? He should pray. Is anyone happy? Let him sing songs of praise. Is any one of you sick? He should call the elders of the church to pray over him and anoint him with oil in the name of the Lord." Our Living Word Elders (Troy Hansen, Kevin Welsh, Jason Miller and Brady Sharp) will be available after worship at the front of the sanctuary to pray with you.

- Pray on Wednesday evenings at 6:15 (just prior to Confirmation). We will gather together in the sanctuary to bring our prayers to the Lord.
- 3) Take home the prayer requests from Sunday worship. We've started printing off the prayer requests from Sunday worship, so you can take those home with you after worship and keep those requests in your prayers during the week.
- 4) Pray "together" at 11:09. As before, we can pray together even when we are not physically together by taking time to pray at the same time each day (11:09) wherever we are.
- 5) Ask our Prayer Force to pray. We have updated our Prayer Force prayer chain listing. Special prayer requests that come in during the week will be forwarded via email or text message or phone (you choose), so we can bring those requests to God together even when we are not physically together. If you didn't have a chance to sign up to be part of the Prayer Force but would like to be, please talk to Pastor David (or text him at 320-220-1816)

BRINGING JESUS TO THAILAND Update from Jade Dols

Jade Dols, who grew up in New London and Kerkhoven, visited our Wednesday Bible study groups last month. Jade has spent the past year doing mission work in Africa and Thailand. She told about how God had worked to change her life and give her a passion for bringing Jesus and His love to people - especially in Thailand. Jade is now back in Thailand and promised to keep us updated about her experiences there. This is her second update:

Dear friends and family,

Greetings from Thailand! First of all, I would like to thank you for your prayers and support. They are SO valuable to me. It might sound "cheesy," but I'm serious when I say that I don't know what I would do without you.

These past few weeks have been such an amazing journey with the Lord, and I am so blessed that everywhere I go, you go too. When I first arrived in Thailand, I was traveling with Iris; the ministry that I was with this past fall/winter. Everybody on the team felt called to serve long term in Southeast Asia, either in Thailand or Cambodia to combat the growing sex industry.

We visited a lot of missionaries that have already been pouring out their lives here. This has helped to educate us more on the problems and their roots, as well as what is being done, and the visions that God has been giving others for the future. Much of the first 2 weeks has been about listening to what God has called us to individually, and for those called to Iris corporately.

I said goodbye to the Iris team a few days earlier than planned in order to prepare for a journey to Chiang Mai. Originally I thought that I would settle in Bangkok, so I was a little surprised when the Lord started pointing me to Chiang Mai repeatedly. Some of my spiritual parents have done a lot of missions work in Thailand, much of it being here, so they put me in contact with several ministries in the area. I really felt in my spirit that something significant would happen here, and something did...I found my home. Some new friends brought me to a church called TLC, located near Chiang Mai University and I began to connect with people instantly. By the end of the first night we were family.


