

Question for Pastor...

"Do you think the world will end this month - like the Mayan calendar says?"

This seems to be quite a popular question these days. The 21st of December, which also happens to mark the Winter Solstice, the day when the sun will appear at noon at its lowest altitude above the horizon, has long been believed by some to signify



This whole "Mayan Apocalypse" thing strikes me as being quite similar to what I've been reading this fall from some of the baseball "bloggers" that follow the Twins. Lot's of totally unfounded speculation by people who apparently have way too much time on their hands. For example, one blogger posed the question, "Will the Twins sign A-Rod?" If you know anything about baseball, you know the chances of that happening are about the same as New London being chosen as the sight for the next Winter Olympics.

I'd rank the possibility of both of those things happening `right up there with' the end of the world coming this December 21. Here's why I say that: Jesus said in Mark 13:32 "No one knows about that day or hour - not even the angels in heaven." So to those who claim to "know" that December 21st is the last day I would say, "What part of `no one knows' don't you understand?"

Jesus said elsewhere that the end will come "Like a thief in the night." In other words, it will come unannounced and unexpected. So, since December 21 has been announced globally as the end, and since lots of people are expecting it, I'd have to say there's virtually no chance that God has chosen this December 21st as the last day of the earth's existence.

So what can we say with certainty about the end of the world? As always, instead of spouting our opinions, thoughts and ideas on the subject, we need to see what the One who actually created of the world has to say. And God is quite clear in the Bible about many things regarding the end. Here are just a few:

- 1) The world will come to an end.
- It will come at a time when God not anyone else says it will.
- We need to always be ready for that last day, simply because we won't know in advance when to expect it.
- 4) We stay ready by keeping our "lamps filled with oil" (our lives filled with faith in God's Son).

I find it interesting that this hype about the end of the world is happening during the season of Advent. Advent is that time in the church year when we focus on preparing for Christ to come. In addition to preparing to celebrate His first-coming at Christmas and preparing for Him to come into our lives daily, Advent is a time when we prepare for Jesus' second-coming at the end of the world.

I'd invite you to join us the Sundays in Advent as we learn more about what the Bible says about Jesus' second coming and how to keep ourselves prepared for that great event.

First of all, I would like to apologize to you all. Many people have given generously to enable me to stay out here and do this work and they have not received a thank-you. I am so sorry for my disorganization. I have no excuse. I



would like to thank you from the bottom of my heart for your contributions. Without you this would not be possible. Lives are being saved and transformed because of YOU!

Secondly, I want to inform you all that I will be returning to MN from Dec 18th to Jan 15th, however I may be leaving for the DC area a few days earlier. That is still pending at the moment. And I will be in CA from Jan 15th-23rd between San Francisco, San Diego, and Redding.

I will be doing fundraising with the goal being to raise enough to stay and continue this work for at least another 2 years. If you would like to get together please let me know and we can set a date. Time is very short so I need to arrange dates prior to leaving Thailand so that it does not become too hectic upon returning to the states.

And thirdly, when I return to Bangkok in January I will be participating in a 3 month XEALOT residency program for emerging leaders. This program is hands-on and will teach me about leadership, collaboration, and community development.

Let me fill you in on this crazy month!

This past month has been full of surprises! I coordinated a wedding in 3 days with what started out as a budget of \$10 (my \$10) for a refugee couple.

The next week that same family went nearly 2 days without food before I realized what was going on and brought some to their home.

A few weeks after that they were kicked out of their apartment and 2 members of the family were held hostage in another apartment without food, water, or medicine while one of them was extremely ill and suffering from diabetes. We had to deliver these basic necessities in a dark alley under the cover of night.

One of my families was chased by immigration police. They fled to a church where they remained for 7 hours. The children were very shaken.

We opened a Safe House as a joint collaboration between Life Raft International and Generation Miracle with help from members of Newsong Church. There are now 3 refugee families living in the

I have also been actively exploring areas where human and child trafficking are taking place (this is different than willful prostitution). A portion of the trafficking of adult women is open and visible, however many are locked up behind closed doors and all children are locked up.

Two of the Thai girls that we have been building relationships with in on of the red light districts have left their lives of prostitution and will be starting new jobs soon!



Story Behind The Song...

"Go Tell It On The Mountain" (From the website www.sharefaith.com)

In 1907 John W. Works III, a professor at Fisk University and a professional musician, compiled and published Folk Songs of the American Negro, a songbook designed to preserve and promote African American Folk-Work. Included in this book was Works' arrangement of the song Go Tell It on the Mountain (author unknown). This song was known to have been sung by African American slaves since as far back as at least 1865.

In the 1960s Peter Paul and Mary took the liberty to re-write some of the lyrics of Go Tell It on the Mountain , renamed it Tell it on the Mountain, and recorded it as a Civil Rights theme song. In the 1990s, musician Art Paul Schlossel re-wrote the lyrics for kids and renamed the song Go Tell It on the Swingset. It has been popular for many years as a Christmas Carol, and is also sung in some settings as a praise song.

In one format or another since its conception, the anthem of Go Tell It on the Mountain has been sung in the fields, on buses, in the streets, in churches, on school choir platforms and in concert halls. And it has been recorded by more than 20 popular artists, including such big names as Frank Sinatra, Dolly Parton and Simon & Garfunkel.

Go Tell It On The Mountain:

Refrain: Go, tell it on the mountain,

Over the hills and everywhere Go, tell it on the mountain, That Jesus Christ is born.
