## Question for Pastor...

What's Your Favorite Book in the Bible - Old Testament?

I appreciated this question, because it reminds us that the Bible is not a book in and of itself. Rather, it is a *collection of books* that we have bound into book form for convenience. You could actually think of the Bible as a small library, a collection of sixty-six books. You could say it is "God's Library," since all of the books in it have been inspired by God. In other words, even though the words in those books were written down by human beings, everything written in each book is exactly what God himself wanted in there. He prompted (inspired) the writers to write what they did.

As with any library, the Bible contains different types of writings. For example, you will find writings that would be classified as "History." The book of Acts in the New Testament would be one good example. Other writings, like the Psalms, fall under the "Poetry" category. Still others fit the "Prophecy" genre - direct messages of warning or encouragement from God to His people. Isaiah is such a book. The Gospels (Matthew, Mark, Luke and John) could be classified as "Biographies" -although they are much more than that. And most of the rest of the New Testament books are actually "Letters" that were written to individuals or congregations.

I can, at times, be easily distracted, so I tend to gravitate toward books or sections of books that I can read from start to finish in five or ten minutes. The shorter the time frame, the less likely I will be to lose focus. I also tend to find myself attracted to books that tell stories about people or specific situations those people

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faced. So it stands to reason that Jonah and Esther would stand out for me as favorites from the Old Testament. (It took me five minutes to read the book of Jonah just now.) I have many favorite parts and chapters in other Old Testament books that would probably top Jonah and Esther on my list, but when taking the books as a whole, it would have to be one of those.

Jonah has an added bonus. It's not just an interesting and memorable non-fiction short story about God's miraculous work in and through the life of one prophet named Jonah. The book of Jonah also has a single, easy-to-detect, central theme: God is "gracious and compassionate, slow to anger and abounding in love." Main points that are easy to pick out and highlighted over and over are a blessing to those of us who have a tendency to get distracted easily.

I'll tackle the favorite New Testament and Gospel books in upcoming newsletters. In the meantime, I'd like to know what yours is - and why. Head over to our website www.livingwordlutheran.net and leave your answer as a comment to the blog entry asking this question

Jesus said, "Abide in Me, and I in you. As the branch cannot bear fruit of itself, unless it abides in the vine, so neither can you, unless you abide in Me. I am the vine, you are the branches; he who abides in Me, and I in him, he



bears much fruit; for apart from Me you can do nothing" (John 15:4-5). Fruit characterizes the life of the Christian steward. It is interesting to note that, in this passage above, Jesus did not say, "You should bear fruit." He stated that when we abide in Him, it follows naturally that we will bear fruit.

We will learn more about Bearing Fruit for Jesus in each of our Bible Study groups this month as well as on Sundays.

We will conclude the theme with a special Harvest Dinner on Sunday, November 24. (see page 4 of this newsletter) On that day we will also make our commitments to God about fruits we intent to return to Him over the course of the coming year.

Over the past months, Link staff and Advisory Board members have been visiting local churches: dergy, temple talks to congregations and visits to church councils. We have had great conversations about exploring ways to deepen our partnerships. We are grateful for a community that is willing to build on common purpose for our neighbors in need.

Here's a guick story: There's a local couple that needs assistance to "keep things moving forward" every so often. One adult works full time and the other adult is disabled. This past June, I provided a gas card to help "Jessica" get to work. A few garden plots at a local community garden had opened up earlier in the day and I connected her to one via a scholarship. "Jessica" was delighted to receive the free garden plot. She planted and tended her garden all summer. During the harvest, she shared her produce with the community by placing it in the bounty cart. She even dropped some for me! She told me that she and her husband were so grateful for the fresh produce. Jessica even bragged that her husband's diabetes had come under control due to access to fresh, healthy vegetables had she had lost weight. This is a wonderful example of ways the Link can connect people, resulting in better health and well-being through access to healthy foods and helping someone keep a job with a little gas money.

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## The Daily Dozen of Christian Parenting



The class is finished, but the parenting never stops, so we'll have excerpts of things we learned in this and future newsletters.

#### DAILY DOZEN #1: Parents, Don't Forget Who You Are

Our society trains us to find our identity in the things that we buy. That's a horrible example to set for children. Someone talked of the result of trying to define ourselves by the stuff we own this way, "I buy things I don't need... with money I don't have... to impress people I don't even like!"

God - as always - has the better way: Ephesians 5:1 (our Discipleship Verse from October) reminds us that we are "Dearly Loved Children." Who are you? You are a Child of God.

There's a lot wrapped up defining who you are as "A Child of God." Here are a couple really important things that means:

1) You have the Ultimate Parent (God) as an example.

You may not know how to be the best parent for your children, but God does. Ask Him to show you. (As His child, you can come to Him any time). Even when you know what's the best thing to do, you may not have the power, patience, perseverance to do it. God does. Ask Him for His help

2) You have a Heavenly Father who specializes in forgiveness.

God may be the Perfect Parent, but we certainly aren't. And when you find that you've really blown it, you can - and should - go to God and ask His forgiveness. Then go back to the previous step and Ask for His power to do it right next time.

## E-Mail Wisdom... (received via e-mail)

ATTITUDE IS EVERYTHING

(If you've heard this one before, it's still worth reading again.)

Jerry was the kind of guy you love to hate. He was always in a good mood and always had something positive to say. When someone would ask him how he was doing, he would reply, "If I were any better, I would be twins!"

He was a unique manager because he had several waiters who had followed him around from restaurant to restaurant. The reason the waiters followed Jerry was because of his attitude. He was a natural motivator. If an employee was having a bad day, Jerry was there telling the employee how to look on the positive side of the situation.

Seeing this style really made me curious, so one day I went up

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to Jerry and asked him, "I don't get it! You can't be a positive person all of the time. How do you do it?" Jerry replied, "Each morning I wake up and say to myself, Jerry, you have two choices today. You can choose to be in a good mood or you can choose to be in a bad mood.' I choose to be in a good mood.

Each time something bad happens, I can choose to be a victim or I can choose to learn from it. I choose to learn from it. Every time someone comes to me complaining, I can choose to accept their complaining or I can point out the positive side of life. I choose the positive side of life."

"Yeah, right, it's not that easy," I protested.

"Yes it is," Jerry said. "Life is all about choices. When you cut away all the junk, every situation is a choice. You choose how you react to situations. You choose how people will affect your mood. You choose to be in a good mood or bad mood. The bottom line: It's your choice how you live life." I reflected on what Jerry said. Soon thereafter, I left the restaurant industry to start my own business. We lost touch, but often thought about him when I made a choice about life instead of reacting to it.

Several years later, I heard that Jerry did something you are never supposed to do in a restaurant business: he left the back door open one morning and was held up at gunpoint by three armed robbers. While trying to open the safe, his hand, shaking from nervousness, slipped off the combination. The robbers panicked and shot him. Luckily, Jerry was found relatively quickly and rushed to the local trauma center.

After 18 hours of surgery and weeks of intensive care, Jerry was released from the hospital with fragments of the bullets still in his body. I saw Jerry about six months after the accident. When I asked him how he was, he replied, "If I were any better, I'd be twins. Wanna see my scars?"

I declined to see his wounds, but did ask him what had gone through his mind as the robbery took place. "The first thing that went through my mind was that I should have locked the back door," Jerry replied. "Then, as I lay on the floor, I remembered that I had two choices: I could choose to live, or I could choose to die. I chose to live.

"Weren't you scared? Did you lose consciousness?" I asked. Jerry continued, "The paramedics were great. They kept telling me I was going to be fine. But when they wheeled me into the emergency room and I saw the expressions on the faces of the doctors and nurses, I got really scared. In their eyes, I read,

That for a day: Success is more attitude than

aptitude

'He's a dead man." I knew I needed to take action."

"What did you do?" I asked.

"Well, there was a big, burly nurse shouting questions at me," said Jerry. "She asked if I was allergic to anything. 'Yes,' I replied. The doctors and nurses stopped working as they waited for my reply. I took a deep breath and yelled, 'Bullets!' Over their laughter, I told them, 'I am choosing to live. Operate on me as if I am alive, not dead."

Jerry lived thanks to the skill of his doctors, but also because of his amazing attitude. I learned from him that every day we have the choice to live fully. Attitude, after all, is everything.

## Story Behind The Song...

#### Let All Things Now Living

Most songs and hymns start out as poems that eventually get set to music. The author - or often someone else - finds a tune that fits the cadence of the poem then tune and text come together in the form of a hymn. Katherine K Davis (born in St. Joseph Missouri in 1910) did the opposite. She wrote this text for the Welsh tune ASH GROVE which she discovered in the 1920s. She wrote the harmonization and a descant for the tune and published them with her text in 1939 under the name John Cowley, one of her pseudonyms. (Davis wrote "The Little Drummer Boy," 1941, as well as many other songs under this and other pseudonyms.) She died on April 20, 1980, at the age of 87, in Littleton, Massachusetts.

In addition to the imagery of God physically in the form of a pillar of fire leading His Old Testament people on their journey to the Promised Land, the text of the hymn also incorporates themes found in both Psalm 19 and Psalm 148. Both Psalms talk about all the created things joining to praise God. The hymn encourages us to join with all creation in praising God as together He leads us to the Ultimate Promised Land of heaven.

Let all things now living, A song of thanksgiving
To God the Creator triumphantly raise.
Who fashioned and made us, Protected and stayed us.
Who still guides us on to the end of our days.
His banners are o'er us, His light goes before us,
A pillar of fire shining forth in the night,
Till shadows have vanished And darkness is banished,
As forward we travel from light into light

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
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His law he enforces, The stars in their courses,
