## Question for Pastor...

Does God get 'sick' of us ?

This question came from the confirmation students. I'm guessing it grew out of the realization that we keep on sinning (over and over and over), because that question was followed by this one: "Will God ever quit forgiving us?" As in, "Is there a limit to how many times He will forgive?"



God is the "Ultimate Parent." He's our "Heavenly Father," the father who truly does know what's best. So, how does He view us - the often rebellious, unruly children?

God hasn't left us in the dark on this one. For starters, He's told us that He never quits loving us:

For I am convinced that neither death nor life, neither angels nor demons, neither the present nor the future, nor any powers, neither height nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God that is in Christ Jesus our Lord.

Romans 8:38-39 NIV

Since our society tends to incorrectly define "love" as something along the lines of "warm, fuzzy feelings of approval," it needs to be said that God doesn't hold to the same definition of love. Love is much more than a feeling. It is a commitment to do what the other person needs - even when you don't feel like it. Even when you don't approve of their actions.

God in Romans 5:5-10 tells of His kind of love - love that requires making a huge sacrifices (like dying).

...God's love has been poured out into our hearts through the Holy Spirit, who has been given to us.

You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

Since we have now been justified by his blood, how much more shall we be saved from God's wrath through him! For if, while we were God's enemies, we were reconciled to him through the death of his Son, how much more, having been reconciled, shall we be saved through his life!

Jesus didn't die for us because we were wonderful, loveable children whose every action He approves of. He died for us in spite of the fact that we were "ungodly," "sinners" and His "enemies" who frequently engage in actions, attitudes and beliefs He doesn't approve of. That's love!

Awhile back I heard a song on a Christian radio station - thankfully I only heard it once - that said, "God's not disappointed with you." The song left me with the impression that God thinks, "I know you're doing your best, so I'm ok with that." That really ticked me off, because it's not a biblical idea. It's an idea born out of that totally wrong definition of love I mentioned above.

I think the song was trying to highlight the biblical truth that God loves you no matter what. No matter what you have done. No matter what has been done to you. Here's the likely thought process behind that song: Since God never stops loving you.... and 'love' is "a warm, fuzzy feeling of approval"... then it logically follows that God always has warm, fuzzy feelings of approval toward you. But because they started by defining 'love' the way our culture defines it instead of how God defines it, I (and probably everyone else who has ever heard that song) was left with the impression that "Because God loves me, He never disapproves of anything I do." And that is just wrong! Totally wrong.

Can you love someone and be yet be disappointed and frustrated with what they've done? Parents, you know the answer to that: Absolutely!

God does care about you - deeper than anyone else ever will! And because He cares that deeply, He's naturally going to get frustrated with us, disappointed in us - even angry with us - when we do things (and keep on doing them) that He knows are harmful and hurtful for us - and other people that God loves. But that frustration, anger and disappointment NEVER lead Him to stop loving us.

Five times Matthew records Jesus using the term "you of little

faith" with His disciples, because of some action or belief or attitude they displayed that was less than what He wanted from them. Did that frustration mean He stopped loving them? Absolutely not. Did that mean He came to the limit of His forgiveness for them? No way.

So, I wouldn't say that God ever gets sick of us. But I would say this, "Yes, because He loves us, God does get 'sick' of our sinful actions and attitudes and unbelief." That's why - in His love - He allows us to reap consequences for those actions, attitudes and lack of trust. More than anything He wants us to learn that those actions, attitudes and lack of trust are actually making us spiritually sick, and that we should stop them.

But never, ever forget this:

Because nothing will keep God from loving you, you can be assured that He will always be holding out His forgiveness for you as well as the power He has for you to repent - to change and be rid of those sinful actions, attitudes and beliefs in the future.

Smile appropriately - it creates a warmth and tears down walls.


Eye Contact - Look at your child face-to-face when you talk to them. Don't talk to them from the other room.


Eyebrows - Raising your eyebrows says, "I'm really sincere about this. You can trust me."

## Lenten Service

#### Our Nation Seems to be in a "Moral Free-Fall,"

"Right" has become "wrong" and "wrong" has become "right."Things are bad but the important thing is this: GOD HAS A REMEDY!! And we as followers of Jesus play a huge part in that remedy:

"If my people who are called by my name will humble themselves and prayer and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, I will forgive their sins and I will heal their land."

2 Chronicles 7:14

So, instead of complaining about the deplorable state of things, each Wednesday during Lent we will do what *God* says and gather at 6:30 for a devotion and a time of prayer. The devotions will focus on some of the myths about God which Satan's successfully planted in our minds - myths that have served to assist the moral decay in our nation.

Thus far we've debunked these myths about God:

#### The "Vending-Machine God" Myth

God is *not* like a vending machine. You can't just 'put in' your prayers or offerings or attendance or 'whatever' and expect He will give you anything you want. That incorrectly assumes that *you* know what's best for you or that whatever you want is actually *good* for you. Thank God, *He* does know what's best and good, and that He can't be bribed into giving whatever we want when He knows it won't be good for us.

#### The "Cosmic Cop" Myth

God is not the "Heavenly Killjoy" who doesn't want you to have any fun. Yet lots of people incorrectly view Him that way. Jesus said in John 10:9-10 *The thief comes only to steal and kill and destroy; I have come that they may have life, and have it to the full.* And our Discipleship Verse for March reminded us: "Your enemy the devil prowls around like a roaring lion looking for someone to devour." Being Satan's "lunch" is what really doesn't sound like fun to me.

#### The "All Roads Lead to God" Myth

The idea that "It doesn't matter what religion you believe, because they all lead you to God" is as silly as saving. "It doesn't matter. They'll all lead you there." to someone who asks what road to take out of Willmar to get to downtown Minneapolis. If that person takes your advice and hits Highway 71 first, they may





# Marriage Enrichment Retreat...

#### The Marriage Enrichment Retreat is History....

... but History is something we are supposed to learn from. So, for the next few months we'll include some things we learned at the retreat.

The 'foundational' thing to remember: You Are A TEAM

This month we highlight the first of five keys for having a successful team.

#### Key #1 to Successful Teams: They have a Great Coach.

 Your Marriage "Coach" is GOD. He's the greatest coach you could ever have. Why? Well, for starters.... He created marriage..

"Haven't you read," Jesus replied, "that at the beginning the Creator 'made them male and female,' and said, 'For this reason a man will leave his father and mother and be united to his wife, and the two will become one flesh'? So they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, let no one separate." Matthew 19:4-6 NIV

- Listen to Him. (Your Marriage Coach is never wrong)
   ... from infancy you have known the Holy Scriptures, which are able to make you wise for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All Scripture is God-breathed and is useful for teaching, rebuking, correcting and training in righteousness, so that the servant of God may be thoroughly equipped for every good work.
   2 Timothy 3:15-17
- Do what He says.

#### Tired of Hobby Lobby?

You're tired of hearing about Hobby Lobby and the Supreme Court, tired of all the talk of fines and health-care plans and reproductive rights, tired of being bombarded with words spoken in anger from both sides of the aisle. You want to put your fingers in your ears, switch the channel, and wait for the ruling and the rest of it to just go away.

But even though you are tired, even though you've grown weary of having the same discussions about the same points, Hobby Lobby and fines and health-care plans still matter. They matter because your country – the United States of America – was founded on the principle that you were born with certain rights: the rights to seek and follow truth, to live according to your beliefs, to worship freely.

And no one, not even the government, gets to tell you how to do that.

Today, our federal government threatens that right, consistently refusing to protect religious liberty as our Constitution and the laws of nature demand. In the dozens of cases against the Health and Human Services contraceptive mandate, the government has started dictating the boundaries of religious beliefs, and to pick and choose which beliefs — and which individuals — deserve religious liberty protection.

The contraceptive mandate, part of the Affordable Care Act, requires employers to provide a full range of 20 FDA-approved contraceptive devices, drugs and services in their health-care plans. These include "emergency contraceptives" with the ability to prevent implantation of an embryo — in other words, the ability to end a human life. Catholics, Lutherans, and many other Americans find these drugs morally reprehensible. Yet, though objections to the mandate are strong and numerous — with over 90 lawsuits filed so far — the government has simply swept them aside.

The mandate's provisions allow for very narrow exemptions for houses of worship. Exemptions do not extend even to affiliates of those houses of worship; for example, a Catholic order of nuns, operating homes for the elderly poor, is not exempt. Nor are Christian colleges, nor are thousands of other religious non-profit organiza-

tions, which serve the public good.

In the case of the non-profits, the government has come up with an empty "accommodation" that would force organizations to sign HHS forms directing third-party administrators to provide the drugs that the organizations cannot. As one plaintiff, the Little Sisters of the Poor, explained, these forms are nothing more than permission slips. The Little Sisters cannot direct someone else to act immorally. just as they cannot act immorally themselves. The government has branded this particular belief meaningless.

Neither the exemption nor the false "accommodation" extends to individuals who run their own businesses, like David and Barbara Green, owners of Hobby Lobby. The Greens morally oppose providing drugs that can prevent implantation and have filed suit against HHS, represented by the Becket Fund for Religious Liberty. In the Greens' case, the government claims that moral convictions must be abandoned at the door of the workplace. The Greens may not run their own companies according to their consciences. Or, in return for staying true to their convictions, they will be forced to pay crushina fines.

The government's distinctions under the mandate don't make sense. The government does not get to reduce God and the way in which He works down to what happens only in church or worship. By its definition, religious liberty stipulates that a church – not the government – must be permitted to form its own definition and its own boundaries.

Moreoever, God uses each of us in our vocations to serve those around us. This call to serve others and live according to our beliefs extends beyond our houses of worship, into our homes, our communities, and our work. To prevent individuals from following the dictates of their consciences is an abuse of power and a gross infringement on human dignity.

As the leader of a Christian church body, I strongly object to the government's approach of picking and choosing whose beliefs merit consideration. Now, according to the government, Catholic nuns must authorize others to give out free contraceptives, and evangelical Christians must abandon their most deeply held convictions in the operations of their own businesses. What group, and what belief, will next be under attack?

Friends, we may be weary. We may be tired. But we must stand together to protect our God-given right to religious liberty. This mandate threatens not only those whose religions specifically compel them to oppose it, but all Americans. We cannot allow our government to define the content of our beliefs or the degree of their significance.



# Story Behind The Song...

#### "Jesus Paid it All"

The words to the song Jesus Paid It All were written by Elvina Hall (1822-1889) in 1865. Elvina was a member of the Monument Street Methodist Church in Baltimore, Maryland. The Choir Director of the same church was John Thomas Grape (1835-1915). Unaware of Elvina's composition, Grape had composed a tune he called All To Christ I Owe.

The pastor of Monument Street Methodist Church, Rev. George W. Schreck heard the music written by Grape and immediately thought of the verse written by another of his parishioners, Elvina Hall. At the pastor's suggestion, Hall's lyrics and Grape's music were combined, and then sent to Professor Theodore Perkins, publisher of the periodical Sabbath Carols. The hymn quickly became a favorite and has been published in and sung from hymnals across America ever since.

Recently the song has gained renewed popularity, being recorded by Contemporary Worship artists like Chris Tomlin.
