

Question for Pastor...

What's going on with Thrivent?

I'm sorry, those of you who were waiting for my answer to the question "What's your favorite New Testament book?" will have to wait another month. The third Sunday of January is traditionally "Life Sunday" - the day we celebrate the Sanctity (holiness) of Life. With that in mind it seemed timely to deal with the question above which cropped up just before Christmas.

Here's some background about Thrivent: Thrivent Financial for Lutherans is the financial services organization that provides things like mutual funds and life insurance for Lutheran Christians. Its Thrivent Choice Dollars® are profits that must be given back to those its members each year. Once a year the members get a chance to tell Thrivent where they would like those dollars given. Many Thrivent Choice Dollars get channeled back to individual Lutheran congregations. Around \$500 Thrivent Choice Dollars® were directed to Living Word this past year.

About a week before Christmas an email with this title caught my eye:

LCMS issues statement about Thrivent Choice Dollars®

That email subject-line prompted me to ask the question listed at the beginning of this article. Of course I read the email which stated:

The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod (LCMS) is deeply concerned by the news that Thrivent Financial has recognized Planned Parenthood of Minnesota, North Dakota and South Dakota as a potential recipient of funding through its Thrivent Choice Dollars Page 3

grant program. The LCMS always has been, and will continue to be, clear and faithful in its proclamation of the sanctity of all human life from conception until natural death. We are currently in conversation with Thrivent Financial and pray for a God-pleasing resolution to this matter so that the pro-life witness of individual Lutherans and the LCMS will not be compromised.

The very next day I received an email with this subject line:

LCMS Responds to Thrivent's Choice Dollars® Statement

The body of that email reads:

With the recent Thrivent announcement to reconsider their Choice Dollars® Program, the LCMS is encouraged to learn that Thrivent is beginning to recognize the serious concern its members have when their choice dollars are stewarded toward organizations such as Planned Parenthood that directly support the abortion industry and the killing of unborn children.

"We are very happy that Thrivent was willing to reconsider this issue. However, the LCMS and every one of its entities and congregations are both pro-life and nonprofit, so we certainly hope that Thrivent will continue to support such pro-life, nonprofit organizations," said the Rev. Dr. Matthew C. Harrison, president of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

LCMS members are urged to express their concerns directly to Thrivent Financial during this time of re-evaluation of the Choice Dollars® Program.

The above email included a link to the Thrivent Statement which included this paragraph:

After input, discussion and a review of the concerns from Thrivent members, the leadership of this local chapter voted Thursday to remove it [the Planned Parenthood affiliate] from the Thrivent Choice program effective immediately. Given the deeply held views on this issue across our membership, we also are taking action to address the concerns of our membership. These steps include temporarily suspending all pro-choice and pro-life organizations from the Thrivent Choice program,

placing a temporary hold on the addition and removal of nonprofit organizations from the program, and conducting a comprehensive program review.

Please notice the words I highlighted in bold. Not only did they remove Planned Parenthood from the list of those who can receive money, Thrivent also removed all pro-life organizations from that list. As the second email from our synod indicated, that could technically include all Missouri Synod congregations. That email encouraged us to give Thrivent our feedback. I thought it may be helpful to share the feedback I gave:

When I first learned that Thrivent was considering channeling Thrivent Choice Dollars to a Planned Parenthood affiliate my initial reaction was, "You're kidding, right?" And after finding out that this was no joke, I said, "Unbelievable," and wondered where we should go to replace the financial products we currently get from Thrivent.

The next day upon hearing that Thrivent had reconsidered and removed the Planned Parenthood affiliate from the list of possibilities, my response was "Thrivent made a good choice." But then I read the fine print and discovered that Thrivent had also removed all pro-life organizations from the rolls of possible recipients, and I was back to, "You've got to be kidding me." And we are back to trying to find alternative providers for our Thrivent products.

Working to save the lives of those yet to be born is biblically defensible. Taking those same lives is not - no matter how you slice-and-dice and spin it. There are "grey" areas where Christians can in good conscience agree to disagree. Abortion is not one of those areas. It is categorically contrary to the Word of God in the Scriptures. Just to be clear: That does not mean that a person who's had an abortion cannot be considered a Christian. Everyone of us sins and needs God's forgiveness daily. But what it does mean is that it is unconscionable for an organization that identifies itself as "Christian" to support abortion.

Thrivent's real "Choice" as I see it is this: If you want to be a politically correct organization, then you must choose to remove the "Christian" facade. If you truly want to be a "Christian" organization, then you must choose to get rid of any pretense about being politically correct. (If Jesus had been "politically correct" He never would have gone to the cross.)

In my sermon last Sunday I talked about things we could say "Amen" to about this past year and the coming year - things that are "most certainly true." One of those truths is this: "It has been / will be difficult to be a Christian." Every day we face choices. Sometimes we listen to the wrong voices and make the wrong choices. The challenge is to repent of those wrong choices and listen to God's voice and seek His power to make better ones the next day.

One of the choices we will increasingly need to make is the choice to either stand up for what God's Word clearly says or stick our heads in the sand and pretend everything is ok (when it really isn't). We live in a time when everyone has an opinion - and we all, it seems, love to make our opinions known. But if God has spoken on an issue, it really doesn't matter what my or your or anyone else's opinion is. The Sanctity of all human life is one of those issues that is not a matter of opinion. It is one of those black and white areas where "God has spoken." God tells us, for example, in the 5th Commandment (not His "fifth suggestion") "You will not murder (take an innocent life)". Please pray that more people will be emboldened to point out what God has declared about life fact as a result of Thrivent's action.

The Common Table Prayer...

A way to stay ready for Christ's Second Coming

During the Advent Season we focused on what Jesus would have us be doing as we wait for His return. We found the Common Table Prayer can be a very useful tool to remind us of some of those things.

Come, Lord Jesus. Pause after this part to remember what you are really asking: For Jesus to return to bring an end to this world and usher in eternity. It's hard to ask Jesus to return in one breath and then go out and act like He's never coming back.

Be Our Guest. Pause after this petition to remember that you are asking Jesus - the King - to come into your home and your life. Let that be a reminder to "clean house" before the King comes. In other words, sweep out your sins by repenting.

And Let These Thy Gifts To Us Be Blessed. During Advent we focus on four specific gifts Jesus brought when He came the first time: Hope, Peace, Joy and Love. The way for these gifts to be a blessing for us is two-fold: 1) Use them. No gift, no matter how great, does anyone any good unwrapped and sitting on the shelf. Make the choice to put these gifts to use in your life. 2) Share them. God gives gifts to be shared. You will be blessed when you share the Hope, Peace, Joy and Love Jesus gave you. Pause after saying this petition to remind yourself to use and share these Thy gifts.

Amen. This is a word that indicates your agreement that what has been said it "most certainly true." Pause after ending the prayer and remember that Jesus has promised to return again. He is still here to be a guest in your life right now. He will bless you for using and sharing His gifts.

The purpose of Tuesday's Table is to build relationships among all of God's people.

The cold weather has made it very difficult for our neighbors over the past month. Car breakdowns, the cost of warm winter gear and the extra gasoline needed to warm up a vehicle can stretch an already stretch budget very thin.

Here's a story about a young man that the Link was able to assist in December:

John (name changed) called the office and was frustrated by a lack of funds at local agencies. Desperate, he called the Link as his last hope. As a self-employed person, John was lacking any income due to the unpredictable nature of his work. John had secured a new iob and had lined up a second iob for the weekends. He was facing homelessness as his rent and utilities were all past due, Additionally, he needed warm clothing to work his new job outdoors in sub-zero temperatures.

The Link assisted John in applying for Energy Assistance to ensure the heat in his home. Link staff contacted the WorkForce Center to see if they had any available funds to assist with work clothes, but they didn't. With the help of the Link and partnership with local churches, businesses and community members, the Link assisted John with a rent and water/sewer payments to avoid eviction. The Link purchased a warm face mask, gloves and boots so he could begin his new job without the fear of frostbite in the frigid cold. A friend purchased warm bibs for him and allowed him to pay him back later.

Through your generosity, the Link is able to assist hard-working people like John **get and keep work** and **avoid homelessness** in the frigid cold weather. Thank you!



DAILY DOZEN #3

One of the basics of parenting is this:

"You can't begin to meet the needs of your children, until your needs are taken care of."

If you've ever been on an airplane you've heard this principle explained as the flight attendants tell you about what to do when if the oxygen masks drop down: "If traveling with small children, secure your mask first, then put them on your children." The idea is that you can't very well help them put theirs on if you have run out of oxygen yourself. It's really the same in all aspects of parenting.

If you are going to help your children build a strong relationship with the God whose children they truly are, you will need to first build that strong relationship with God. As with any relationship, your relationship with God grows stronger by spending time together. When it comes to God we do that by talking to Him (PRAYER). We do that by listening to Him (BIBLE READING), and we do that by coming into His presence in WORSHIP. Story Behind The Song...

"Simple Gifts" A.k.a. Lord of the Dance

The Magi traveled hundreds of miles to bring gifts to Jesus, honoring Him as the true King of kings that He is. This month we look at a song our choir sung a while back entitled, "Simple Gifts."

"Simple Gifts" is a song written and composed in 1848 by Elder Joseph Brackett (1797–1882) of the Shaker community in Gorham, Maine. (Shakers were a protestant sect sharing aesthetic-life similarities with the Amish). Brackett first joined the Shakers at when his father's farm helped to form the nucleus of a new Shaker settlement.

Though often classified as an anonymous Shaker hymn or as a work song, it is better dassified as a dance song.

The song was largely unknown outside Shaker communities until Aaron Copland used its melody for the score of Martha Graham's ballet Appalachian Spring, first performed in 1944. Copland used "Simple Gifts" a second time in 1950 in his first set of Old American Songs for voice and piano, which was later orchestrated.

Many people thought that the tune of "Simple Gifts" was a traditional Celtic one but both the music and original lyrics are actually the compositions of Brackett. "Simple Gifts" has been adapted or arranged many times since by folksingers and composers. It has been recorded by such diverse musicians as The rock band Weezer, 70's folk singer Judy Collins, and 80's alternative rock group R.E.M

For many years, a portion of this tune was used as the opening theme for the CBS News television documentary series, CBS Reports. The TV series Little House on the Prairie also had the Ingalls family singing this song.

More recently the tune was incorporated into *Air and Simple Gifts* arranged by John Williams for the 2009 inauguration of United States President Barack Obama.

Many contemporary Christian denominations incorporate this tune into hymnals, under various names, including a song that we use regularly: "Lord of the Dance," which was adapted in 1963 by English poet and songwriter Sydney Carter.
