Question for Pastor...

What Sunday is Reformation Sunday?

This question came up in one of our planning meetings as we were trying to decide dates for the choir to sing. It's a simple question, but it gives a chance to talk about why we celebrate certain events when we do.



You may have noticed that there aren't a lot of special "Days" in the church that have fixed dates. Christmas is one - we always celebrate it on December 25. And since Epiphany (the Wise Men day) has been fixed at 12 days after Christmas it is always celebrated on January 6. Easter, as you probably know, is a "moveable" date that follows the moon more than it does the calendar. Easter is set as the "First Sunday after the first full moon after the Spring Equinox," so it can be anywhere from March 22 to April 25. Since Ash Wednesday (40 days before Easter - not counting Sundays), Ascension Day (40 days after Easter) and Pentecost (50 days after Easter) are all dependent upon the date of Easter, they are never on the same date from year to year either.

Even though we do have fixed dates to celebrate Christmas and Epiphany, we really don't know the exact date Jesus was born or when the Magi showed up. Early-on the church settled on those dates as the ones we would set aside to celebrate the birth of Christ and the first Gentiles coming to worship Him.

But there is one event we celebrate that we do know the exact date that it occurred in history - the beginning of The Reformation. It was on October 31 in the year 1517 that Martin Luther posted his 95 Theses on the school bulletin board on the north door of the University of Wittenberg Castle Church. Those statements served as a notice of an academic debate that Luther hoped would clarify the

church's teaching regarding the sale of indulgences. The church in that day raised funds through the sale of indulgences that promised the purchaser a reduction in (or total removal of) the punishment for sin. Luther held that this was not Scriptural and hoped a debate would clarify and settle the matter. The debate was never held, but the 95 Theses sparked a movement to restore the church teachings to the truth that we are saved by God's grace through faith in Christ Jesus, not by anything we can do or pay.

However, since October 31 only falls on Sunday once every seven years, Lutheran churches typically celebrate it either the Sunday before or after October 31. This year we will celebrate the Reformation on Sunday, November 2, two days after the anniversary of the posting of the 95 Theses.

Inspire a Love of Reading...



Now that school is in full swing, book lists, reading logs, homework, and journals are everywhere. There's no doubt that reading has many benefits. Studies have shown that kids who read regularly gain confidence, increase their vocabulary, and im-

prove their test scores. Here are some everyday ways to instill a love of reading.

Read together. Consider reading the same book your child is reading. Or have your child read to you. As you read, stop and talk about the book. Ask questions. Not only will it help your child with reading comprehension, but you'll also have special time together. If they can't read yet, read to them. It's never too early to start!

Family devotions. Kids and adults take turns reading different parts of the Bible story and devotion books and talk about what God has done, is doing, and will do for His beloved children.

Books before bedtime. If your children are engrossed in a good book, can bedtime slide a little later? Simply reading "one more chapter" sends a positive message and reinforces a love of reading.

Be an example. Let your kids "catch you" reading and meditating on God's Word and turning to Him in prayer. Consider placing your personal devotion materials—your Bible, devotion book, and prayer journa—in a place that is visible to your kids. Encourage them with their very own devotional books.

- Never forget that you are a TEAM (with God as your coach)



October Discipleship Verse...

E-Mail Wisdom... (received via e-mail)

During a question and answer session at a recent speaking engagement, a university student asked, "Why do you believe that the Bible is the inspired word of God?"

Now this is a very interesting question; and probably one of the most important questions any Christian could ask themselves. What is so special, so unique about the Bible that Christians believe it is literally the inspired word of God.

In answering this student's question, I encouraged him to consider the following facts about the Bible:

First, the Bible is not just one single book. This is a more common misconception than many people realize, especially with people who do not come from a Judeo-Christian background. Rather than being a single book, the Bible is actually a collection of 66 books. These 66 books contain a variety of genres: history, poetry, prophecy, wisdom literature, letters, and apocalyptic just to name a few.

Second, these 66 books were written by 40 different authors. These authors came from a variety of backgrounds: shepherds, fishermen, doctors, kings, prophets, and others. And most of these authors never knew one another personally.

Third, these 66 books were written over a period of 1500 years. Yet again, this is another reminder that many of these authors never knew or collaborated with one another in writing these books.

Fourth, the 66 books of the Bible were written in 3 different languages. In the Bible we have books that were written in the ancient languages of Hebrew, Greek, and Aramaic; a reflection of the historical and cultural circumstances in which each of these books were written.

And finally, these 66 books were written on 3 different continents: Africa, Asia, and Europe. Once again, this is a testament to the varied historical and cultural circumstances of God's people.

Think about the above realities: 66 books, written by 40 different authors, over 1500 years, in 3 different languages, on 3 different continents. Most importantly, this collection of books shares a common storyline- the creation, fall, and redemption of God's people; a common theme- God's universal love for all of humanity; and a common message-salvation is available to all who repent of their sins and commit to following Jesus with all of their heart, soul, mind and strength. In addition to sharing these commonalties, these 66 books contain no historical errors or contradictions. God's word truly is an amazing collection of writings!

After I had shared the above facts with this student, I offered him the following challenge: I said to him, "If you do not believe that the Bible is the inspired word of God, if you do not believe that the Bible is of a supernatural origin, than I challenge you to a test." I said to the student, "I challenge you to go to any library in the world, you can choose any library you like, and find 66 books which match the characteristics of the 66 books in the Bible. You must choose 66 books, written by 40 different authors, over 1500 years, in 3 different languages, written on 3 different continents. However, they must share a common storyline, a common theme, and a common message, with no historical errors or contradictions." I went on to say, "If you can produce such a collection of books, I will admit that the Bible is not the inspired word of God."

The student's reply was almost instantaneous, he emphatically stated, "But that's impossible!"

"But that's impossible!" It truly is impossible, for any collection of human writings. However, the Bible passes this test. The Bible contains 66 books, written by 40 different authors, over 1500 years, in 3 different languages, on 3 different continents, with no historical errors or contradictions. The entire Bible, from Genesis to Revelation, bears the mark of Divine inspiration.

The next time you encounter someone who asks you why you believe the Bible is the inspired word of God, try sharing this challenge with them. Better yet, don't wait until you're asked, just go ahead and share this challenge with a friend today...

You don't even have to mention the Bible up front, just ask them if they think it would be realistic to assemble such a collection of books. After they say, "But that's impossible!" you've got a readymade opportunity for sharing the truth of God's word with somebody

DAILY DOZEN #11 Laugh a LOT! (and then laugh some more)

"Do you know that when we laugh our brain releases good chemicals called "endorphins"? It's a word that literally means "internal morphine." What a deal! When we laugh loud our brain actually releases a chemical that is similar to morphine and those effects can hang out in the brain for twelve to twenty-four hours! So, laugh, laugh and laugh some more; even at yourself.

One caution: Sarcasm is usually not funny to the person it is directed to.

Over the summer, with Camp Gilgal, there were two campers from unsaved Jewish homes who attended camp and prayed to receive the Lord, one at Junior Camp the other at Teen Camp. Trent came to Junior Camp for the first time, at the invitation of his aunt. He was pretty difficult throughout the session of camp - sometimes he was involved with the program and Bible teaching, other times he was very resistant, but throughout the two week session of camp, it was almost like you could see a cloud of spiritual activity following him wherever he went, like Pigpen from Peanuts.

Many of our staff got to speak with him about spiritual things, including sharing the gospel. I gave a Bible to him and his younger sister at the halfway point in camp, and his Tribe Leader told me that he was reading from it as often as he could. That was very exciting to hear.

On the last day of camp, we have an awards ceremony, where the campers are recognized by their tribe leaders for an area of growth they've shown throughout the session of camp, followed by a gift for first time campers. At the end of this time, Trent raised his hand to say something. I could see by the look in his eyes that it was something important. When I called on him, he said something along the lines of, "I am so happy. And I just want to let everyone know that now that I have faith in God, I can see that my life is going to be different." We were all a little stunned. This was still the last thing I expected Trent to say, but we rejoiced with him for his new life.

The next day, I sat next to him on our school bus ride from camp back home, and we talked. I asked him about how he came to believe in God. I asked him if he understood what sin was. I asked him where and how Jesus fits into this picture. In this conversation, I saw that he does in fact believe in Jesus for his salvation and forgiveness of sin!

At Teen Camp, we had a joint camp session with Camp Gilgal Midwest. Lea was one of the girls from the Midwest. She came at the invitation from a friend, who also attended camp. Lea's from an unsaved Jewish background. The midwest director asked me to have a conversation with her early in the week. And even though I had never met this girl before, on the second day of camp, I approached her while we were walking down the road to a meal, and began a spiritually directed conversation with her. I was intimidated at first, but she responded and told me that she wanted to know God. Talk about being open!

Through the week, she had conversations with her fellow campers and other staff. At our last Tabernacle session, we gave an opportunity for all of the campers to respond, indicating whether or not they'd like to make a first time commitment of faith, and Lea raised her hand! Her Tribe Leader was sitting next to her, and as

soon as we dismissed, she had a conversation with Lea asking about what she understood about what she had done. In that conversation, Lea asked her Tribe Leader if this decision she just made to commit her life to Yeshua was something that she needed to tell her parents. Her Tribe Leader encouraged and told her that should do that, in the near future. I was so encouraged to hear that report, because it shows that Lea sees this as something significant in her own life, and also sees the potential difficulty that her faith might bring into her family life.

There are many more stories I could tell! Please pray for the campers to continue to grow in their faith - especially the ones who rededicated their lives to the Lord. Pray also for the staff who served, that they will find places to keep serving in their work-school-lives. And let's praise God together for new life!

Thank you for standing with me, with the work of Jews for Jesus. Let me know how I can be praying for you. I pray a fruitful year for you. L'shana tovah!

Story Behind The Song...

"Thy Word is a Lamp Unto My Feet"

This song was from American Christian singer-songwriter Amy Grant's 1984 album Straight Ahead, the first Christian set ever to chart on the Billboard pop chart.

Grant and Christian singer-songwriter Michael W Smith wrote the song which is a worshipful hymn based on Psalm 119 v105. The song was recorded at Caribou Ranch recording studio high in the Rocky Mountains.

Michael originally came up with the song's melody and some words for the chorus straight from David's Psalms about God's Word being a light into our path. Amy fell in love with his demo, but as Michael had no idea what the verses were supposed to say, he gave it to her and told her she could finish the tune. "So later that night she starts walking back to her cabin," Michael told us. "And you have to understand Caribou Ranch is an 8,000 acre ranch and it's very dark, and you're in the middle of nowhere. And she got lost. There's bears and all that sort of thing. You've got to really know where you're going. It's obviously a compound with all these cabins and stuff."

"She finally saw a lamp and started walking towards that light, didn't realize that it was her cabin," he continued. "And she walked into that little cabin and sat down with a notebook and pen and wrote the verses to 'Thy Word.'" Page 22 Page 23
