# Question for Pastor...

I saw where a strawberry farm gave their "first fruits" to the food shelf this year. I thought that was neat. It made me wonder how "first fruits" translate into today's world if I were to attempt to give a "first fruit" offering from our garden. Would it be the first of each type of plant as it matures - or just the first harvest of the season? Do I give the entire first picking or a tenth like a tithe? Do I give it to the church or a food shelf?



That's a great question I received via email several weeks ago from one of our members.

In the Old Testament God instructed His people to bring "firstfruits" on several occasions. The first was when they entered the Promised Land. They were to bring a basket of some of the "firstfruits" of the various things they raised as a way of acknowledging that God had kept His promise to bring them into a good land - and that the fruits the land produced were a gift from and made possible by God. (Deuteronomy 26)

He also instructed them to bring the "firstfruits" of the barley harvest at the end of their annual Festival of Unleavened Bread and the "firstfruits" of the wheat harvest - baked into bread - at the start of the annual Festival of Weeks. (Leviticus 23 & Numbers 28)

No quantities are specified, only the instruction to "Bring the best of the firstfruits of your soil to the house of the Lord your God." (Exodus 23:19)

It seems the important thing about the various firstfruit offerings is that they were all designed to impress upon the people that the harvest was made possible by God and was a gift from Him.

Bringing Him some of the best of the firstfruits was a way of saying, "I'm giving You back what comes from Your hand to show that I know it rightfully belongs to You and that you have blessed me with it as a gift - not something I can take credit for."

Giving away the best of the "firstfruits" is also a way of showing that you trust God will continue to provide additional fruits for you to keep and use for yourself and family. i.e. When you give God the first of the harvest, there is no guarantee that a hailstorm won't come and wipe out the crop the next day leaving you with nothing. Giving Him that first fruit is a great way to show that you do indeed trust that God will continue to provide you and your family with all you need when you put Him first and give Him the first.

Maybe the bottom line on "firstfruits" is this:

Giving some of the best of the first fruits that come from your garden is a great way to acknowledge God as the giver of those fruits. Whether you bring them to share with folks at church or take them to the foodshelf is up to you.

Depending on the timing of your "firstfruit" harvest, you could actually bring them both to church and to the food shelf. August 9 is our "Foodshelf Sunday" for August, so you could bring your "firstfruits" to church for delivery to the food shelf. That may even inspire some other folks to do the same.

On page 21 in this Newsletter you will find a page from the Willmar food shelf about how to donate produce from your garden. The *New London* Food Shelf (sponsored by The Link) is open Tuesday and Thursday afternoons.

# Dedication of the Christ Serve Ranch...

### August 29, 2015

Christ Serve Ranch is the environmental learning center operated by Lutheran Island Camp. A Christian, Biblical worldview is taught in science, education, leadership, the environment and adventure activities.



Regaining Ground. Some years ago a secular author lamented a reality that he termed as "natural outdoor deficit disorder" that, in his estimate, American children have been experiencing for some time. He expressed his concern in his book, Last Child In The Woods

Later, other authors associated with the Answers in Genesis organization also drew attention in their book Already Gone to the many influences in culture toward atheistic evolution that have led youth to buy into this view and to begin to look at the Church's teaching as imaginary myths and tall tales.

There recently emerged a detailed report by the Barna group of pollsters about why sizeable numbers of young people outside of the Christian faith are not inclined to adopt it or to affiliate with Christian congregations. The book's title is: Unchristian. The same group of researchers followed that with a new project that resulted in the volume called, You Lost Me! It tells of three separate types of young Christians who have "jumped ship" in one form or another due to recent influences of our technological society that has changed their way of looking at the world and their lives in it.

The entire purpose of Christ Serve Ranch is to be a place where we attempt to gain ground against these societal trends and to help our congregations get their children back into God's great outdoors, to learn to see Him in the natural phenomena of His creation and how none of this could be without His creating hand. It also is to help all of us see how what we discover in nature lines up with Bible truth and therefore gives us a more secure hold on the Bible as truthful in all its parts including that about God's salvation and sanctification.

The dedication will be held throughout the weekend of August 28-30, with Dr. Dean Wenthe as the preacher for the service on the 29th. Mr. Steve Deace, nationally syndicated Christian talk show host will be presented Friday evening and will deliver a keynote on Saturday prior to the service. 



Many home/community gardens harvest more fresh produce than their families and neighbors can consume, and we welcome you to donate your abundance to those who need it most. **Donation Plant Ideas Includes:** Carrots, Radishes, Summer Squash, Green Beans, Winter Squash, Tomatoes, Cucumbers, Peppers, Onions, Potatoes, Beets and hard fruits such as Apples and Pears.

#### Good Guidelines to Follow:

- Please brush or wash off all dirt, and avoid donating produce that has serious bruising, insect damage, or splitting.

# Story Behind The Song...

## This is My Father's World

(Taken from Amazing Grace: 365 Inspiring Hymn Stories )

Even though we are constantly reminded of the violence, tragedy and ugliness in today's world, we can still rejoice that the beauty of nature all around is ours to enjoy. Who can deny the pleasure that comes from the sight of a glowing sunset or a majestic mountain, the sound of chirping birds or the roar of the surf, and the smell of new-mown hay or roses?

Maltbie D. Babcock revealed his great admiration for nature in this lovely hymn text. Although he was recognized as one of the outstanding Presbyterian ministers of his generation, Dr. Babcock was also a skilled athlete who enjoyed all outdoor activity especially his early morning walks and runs. He would comment, "I'm going out to see my Father's world."

Since Dr. Babcock was an accomplished performer on the organ, piano and violin, we can see why he referred to nature as "the music of the spheres." In addition to being a tribute to God's creation, the hymn is a triumphant assertion of the unfailing power of God and the assurance of Christ's reign—"Jesus who died shall be satisfied, and earth and heav'n be one."

Shortly after his death (at age 43) in 1901 his widow published a compilation of Babcock's writings entitled *Thoughts for Every-Day Living* that contained the poem "My Father's World." The original poem contained sixteen stanzas of four lines each. The poem was set to music in 1915 by Franklin L. Sheppard, a close friend of Babcock. Sheppard chose only six of the sixteen stanzas as part of the hymn. He combined those six stanzas into three verses of two stanzas each. Most sources state that Sheppard adapted the music from a traditional English melody that he learned from his mother as a child

Scripture references in the original poem include Psalm 33:5 "He loves righteousness and justice; the earth is full of his unfailing love." and Psalm 50:12 "For the world is mine, and all that is in it."


