Question for Pastor...

Will we be reading through the Bible from front to back?

For a couple months we've been talking about "Reading Through the Bible in 15 Minutes A Day." We will use the Today's Light Bible for our readings which begin Monday, January 5. The question above grew out of a desire to find out how the program will work.



The short answer is "No." Here's an explanation of why:

Because these 66 books of the Bible are bound together into one volume, we get the idea that it is like a typical book that we would read from front to back. But since the Bible is actually a collection of 66 books, it's more like a library than a book. For example, the Bible contains books we might find in a history section of a library (e.g. Genesis), books we'd find in a poetry section (e.g. Psalms), books that give practical wisdom for daily life (Proverbs), books that detail the life of Jesus (the Gospels), books that are actually letters (all the New Testament books by the Apostle Paul), and books of prophecy - messages from God (e.g. Isaiah).

As with books in a library, many of these can be "pulled from the shelves" and read independent of the other books. Some of the history books are helpful to read consecutively (like Genesis and Exodus). Others may be best read at different time. For example Chronicles comes right after Kings in the Bible, but if you read the Chronicles right after Kings you may come away with the thought, "Didn't I just read that?" Chronicles does recount many of the same events recorded in Kings, but it does so from a different

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perspective and with a different purpose.

For that reason we won't read all of the books in order. We will start at the beginning with Genesis and Exodus, and we will end up with the book of Revelation (which does describe the "last chapter" in the book of God's story. In between we will move around the "library," for example during the seasons of Christmas and Easter it just seems natural to read about Jesus' life, so we'll read the Gospel books during those seasons.

Who Can You Invite?...

Two of the prophesies about the Messiah that God promised to send talk of Him as being a "Light to the Gentiles." People who are living without Jesus are living in the dark - and that's no way to live!



Those of us who believe that Jesus is truly the "Light of the World" and our only Savior have the privilege of being like "mirrors" - reflecting the Light of Jesus to those around us.

One great way we can reflect that Light is by a simple invitation to friends, neighbors, relatives. Who can you invite? Pray about it. Ask God to give you the words and opportunity. Then just do it. Ask them to come with you. Offer to pick them up. (And if they don't take you up on your invitation,, keep praying for them and for another opportunity to invite.)

Thank God For...

You've seen our sign board out by the road with the beginning of a sentence: "Thank God For..."



Each week we'd like to change the ending of that sentence to encourage people who drive past to remember that God is the

giver of all good things - especially things we take for granted. Christmas Week we thanked God for Coming to Be With Us, Let Pastor know how you'd complete that sentence next week.

Read through the Bible with the Today's Light Devotional Bible.

We begin reading on January 5.

We talk a lot about being disciples of Jesus.

In fact, the Living Word mission statement reminds us that making disciples is our goal. Disciples

reminds us that making disciples is our goal. Disciples are more than "followers." They follow with a purpose: Learning from the Master in order to continually grow to become more like the Master.

The best way to become like someone is to spend time with them. In fact, it tends to happen naturally that the more time you spend with someone the more you become like them.

That's where the TODAY'S LIGHT BIBLE (TLB) comes in. It is designed to help us spend that 15 minutes a day with God. The TLB is divided into daily readings that take 10-15 minutes to read. The real beauty of the TLB is the introductory and summary paragraphs. Each daily reading has an introductory paragraph that tells you what to look for as you read. At the end of each reading is a summary paragraph that explains in everyday terms what you just read - and gives ideas for how to apply what you read in real life.

Many of you have a Today's Light Bible already, but if you don't new Bibles are available on the "Free Stuff" table. (If you would like to contribute to the cost (\$20), you can simply put money for it in the offering plate at worship.

Audio recordings of the daily readings will be available on our website for those who'd rather listen than read.

Simple steps to make 15-minutes a day a reality (instead of just a 'good intention')

- Make a commitment to read.
 Write down your commitment
- Pick a time to read. When you are least likely to be interrupted
- Set your Bible in a spot that you will literally have to pick it up every day.
- Resolve to not "throw in the towel" when you miss a day or two.

We will spend 10-15 minutes at the start of each Bible study reflecting on the week's readings and answering any questions about them.

Stewardship...

Living Each Day as a Steward is our new 3—week stewardship program for 2015 (beginning this month).

Transformed by God's Spirit working through His Word and the Sacraments, we are enabled to understand both our identity and purpose as God's stewards. As a result, we live each day as stewards. When God's grace and love fill our hearts and minds, our stewardship is not limited to specific acts, but, instead, becomes a lifestyle. We express our faith in the way we live our lives. The stewardship program emphasizes three themes:



A Steward's Identity:

We don't really want to be stewards. Our first impulse is that we want to be the owners. We want to have possession of things. We want to be important, to be respected, and even to be envied. That's not how it works, though. God owns everything, "The earth is the Lord's and the fullness thereof..." (Psalm 24:1).

A Steward's Purpose:

King David wrote, "The Lord will fulfill his purpose for me" (Psalm 138:8). Just as God had a purpose for David, so he has for us as well. Have we given much thought to what purpose God may have for your life? By grace, we come to understand that we were created for God's purpose, not ours.

A Steward's Lifestyle:

When God's grace and love fill our hearts and minds, our stewardship is not limited to specific acts, but, instead, becomes a lifestyle. With transformed hearts, we express our faith in the way we live our lives. God's Spirit provides motivation and power to live the Christian life in a growing awareness of redeeming grace.

May God help us all live each day as a steward as we give generously of our time and our talents and our money!

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Learn about the persecution of Christians

in our country and around the world from Voice of the Martyrs representative Wayne Bloomquist, in worship on **Sunday**, **January 11**.

The Voice of the Martyrs is a non-profit, inter-denominational Christian organization dedicated to assisting our persecuted family worldwide. VOM was founded in 1967 by Pastor Richard Wurmbrand, who was imprisoned 14 years in Communist Romania for his faith in Christ. His wife, Sabina, was imprisoned for three years. In the 1960s, Richard, Sabina, and their son, Mihai, were ransomed out of Romania and came to the United States. Through their travels, the Wurmbrands spread the message of the atrocties that Christians face in restricted nations, while establishing a network of offices dedicated to assisting the persecuted church.

Voice of the Martyrs ministry is based on Hebrews 13:3:

Remember them that are in bonds, as bound with them; and them which suffer adversity, as being yourselves also in the body.

VOM's Five Main Purposes

- To encourage and empower Christians to fulfill the Great Commission in areas of the world where they are persecuted for sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ.
- To provide practical relief and spiritual support to the families of Christian martyrs.
- To equip persecuted Christians to love and win to Christ those who are opposed to the gospel in their part of the world.
- To undertake projects of encouragement, helping believers rebuild their lives and Christian witness in countries where they have formerly suffered oppression.

The song was written by Christian songwriter Charlie Peacock and made popular in 1996 when it was recorded by Christian Rock band dc Talk.

The song is a very honest assessment of both our in-born desire to get right with God (be in the Light) and our inability to get right with Him by the things we do. If we are honest, we will find that many of our good deeds have selfish motives. Sin is definitely a fatal disease that must be cured, a disease whose root cause it selfishness. Jesus is the Savior who provided the cure for that sin disease - a cure that cost Him His life, and results in restoring us to a right relationship with God.

The 'pre-chorus' echoes the Apostle Paul's confession at the end of Romans chapter seven where he says the good things he

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wants to do is not what he actually ends up doing. And as he looks at the evil he ends up doing - in spite of his desire not to - he concludes, "What a wretched man I am!



Who will rescue me...?" To which he answers, "Thanks be to God—through our Lord Jesus Christ." In other words, "I'm still a man in need of a Savior." We can all relate.
