Question for Pastor...

"So, what insights did you get?"

This is a question that Violet asks me quite frequently, usually after we have finished our daily Bible reading. But this time her question came while we were riding in the car on our way home from a few days spent in Door County, Wisconsin. It's kind of been a 'tradition' to come home and share some "insights" whenever we have some time away. Violet was just curious what bits of wisdom I gained this time.



I shared some of those last week in worship, but there seems one that bears repeating:

Three years ago when we visited Door County (we've vacationed there several times), we came across an Irish-themed gift shop in one of the villages. It was located in what I termed "the tourist-trap village" - the one with the most shops geared to selling souvenirs to tourists. But the Irish place was not on the Main Street near all the other shops. It was off by itself at the top of a hill on a curve that was leading out of town. You had to make a special effort to stop there (not to mention that making the turn into their parking lot could be actually a bit dangerous given the location on a hidden curve).

This year as we drove into that town, I commented to Violet, "I'm guessing we will find the Irish place is no longer in business." Given the aforementioned location issues I figured there was at least a 95% chance that I would be right.

You may have guessed that I was wrong. As we drove up the hill and came around the comer I fully expected to see some new business in that location. I was more than a little surprised, that our Irish store was still there, ("shocked" may be a more accurate word - that's how convinced I was that it wouldn't be in business).

It would be easy to toss in some "Luck' o the Irish" comment, but I don't really think luck had anything to do with it. What I said to Violet was this, "I guess if you have good stuff that fills a need, people will find out about it and make an effort to seek you out."

That little insight also applies to the Christian Church.

At some point during our stay in Door County, Pew Research (which has nothing to do with the furniture we sit on in worship) published their latest survey of spiritual beliefs in America. The big news in the survey was that over the last seven years the percentage of Americans considering themselves Christians has declined a full eight percent! That's an alarming drop. That's not a bump in the road but rather a HUGE decline trend. The natural response would be to make the same judgment about the Christian Church in our country that I had made about the Irish store in Door County: "Looks like it won't be around long."

We can prove that assumption to be wrong for the same reason I was wrong about the Irish place. When you have good stuff that fills a need people will find out about it and seek you out.

"Dark" seems to me to be a very appropriate word to describe both a country and the lives of individual people who are living without God. Without God there truly is no enduring purpose for life. There is no hope for anything after this life - and since "none of us makes it out of here alive," that's about as hopeless and dark as you can get.

But the Christian Church has the one thing people living in darkness need: Light. Light that cannot be extinguished by darkness (see John 1:5). Light that is Jesus Christ! And we have the Holy Spirit who empowers us to shine that Light to a dark world - the very Spirit of the God who showed He had defeated darkness when He rose from His grave!

Where is a light most visible - when surrounded by other lights or when shining in the darkness? The darker, more God-less our nation becomes, the more noticeable the Light of Christ.

Our challenge, as individuals and as a congregation, is to - as Jesus said - make sure we don't hide our Light under a bowl but rather to let it shine!

"You are the light of the world. A city on a hill cannot be hidden. Neither do people light a lamp and put it under a bowl. Instead they put it on its stand, and it gives light to everyone in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before men that they may see your good deeds and praise your Father in heaven."

Asia Calling: Jastrams to Japan

Natsukashii (Nostalgic)!" was the word that came to mind as the smells came wafting from Tokyo restaurants – reminiscent of Dan's walks home from Judo lessons as a child. He had returned for a short visit after a 40-year absence, part of the LCMS delegation to celebrate, with our Japanese brothers and sisters in Christ, the dedication of the new Urawa Lutheran school building. Dan's visit also allowed him to discuss his part-time seminary teaching responsibilities (not to be confused with half-time, which in Japan could mean forty-hour weeks) when he returns to stay, Godwilling, later this year. Tokyo will also serve as his home base to carry out the other half of his work - theological education facilitator for Northern Asia seminaries. He came back from his short visit, jet-lagged, but eager to begin to his missionary work for the long-term.

Essential in "getting set" for overseas work is to establish a strong support network, both spiritual and financial, here in the States. Dan and I had the privilege of sharing the story of our mission work with dear sisters in Christ at many LWML MN North Zone spring rallies last month. To date: <u>53</u> envelopes have been taken and filled with <u>\$2457</u>! THANKS!



Story Behind The Song...

"Stand Up, Stand Up for Jesus"

It seems that the recently released Pew Research survey showing Christianity on a decline in the U.S. is a call for Christians to do





what this hymn urges. Here's how the hymn came about:

In the spring of 1858 revival was taking place in Philadelphia. The movement grew out of midday prayer meetings coordinated by the Young Men's Christian Association (YMCA). Rev. Dudley A. Tyng, a young Episcopalian minister, soon came to be recognized as its leader. Though there was some controversy over his anti-slavery preaching, Tyng was known and loved for his zeal for the work of God. Among the inter-denominational leaders who gathered around him was the Presbyterian minister George Duffield, Jr.

On Tuesday, April 13th, 1858, Rev. Tyng was studying at his country home when he went to the barn to check on his mule which was driving a machine that shelled corn. As he patted down the animal, the sleeve of his gown got caught in the cogs of the machine, and his arm was severely injured. The arm was soon amputated, the wound became mortal, and Tyng died the following week.

Before he died, however, he was asked by friends if there was a message he would have them give to those who had participated with him in the revival work. Tyng responded briefly, beginning with the words, "Tell them, 'Let us all stand up for Jesus."

In the days and events following Tyng's death, these final words were invoked several times and became a resounding exhortation to all who had been affected by his ministry. When George Duffield, Jr. preached to his own congregation the next week, he focused on Ephesians 6:14 ("Stand firm therefore, having fastened on the belt of truth...") and concluded his sermon with a hymn he had written. It began with the line, "Stand up, stand up for Jesus." The hymn was soon picked up by Presbyterian and Congregationalist publishers, and it quickly became an established work.

Similar to "Onward Christian Soldiers," it became popular among soldiers of the Civil War, most likely because of its militaristic imagery and language. But a connection to worldly battles was not the author's intent; Christians have often sung soldier songs, because, as God tells us in Ephesians 6 and elsewhere, our lives in Christ are a fight for faith in the midst of spiritual enemies. We are called to stand in the strength He supplies.

The original six verses (we typically omit verses 2 & 5)

Stand up, stand up for Jesus, ye soldiers of the cross; Lift high His royal banner, it must not suffer loss. From victory unto victory His army shall He lead, Till every foe is vanguished, and Christ is Lord indeed.

Stand up, stand up for Jesus, the solemn watchword hear; If while ye sleep He suffers, away with shame and fear; Where'er ye meet with evil, within you or without, Charge for the God of battles, and put the foe to rout.
