Question for Pastor...

Who created God?

in this newsletter column.

I've been asked this question at least three times in the past couple of months - each time by people who had no relationship with the other folks who asked the question. It made me wonder if someone had published a "Top Ten Questions to Ask Pastors" list and this was at the top. Whatever the case, it was pretty obvious that this is a question God wanted me to address

One person who asked this question was my "little brother" Kevin. (Long ago I was part of the Big Brothers program in the Twin Cities.) Kevin sent me a text and said that his son-in-law asked him who created God. Kevin said that he told his son-in-law that the answer is in the Bible. and asked if he needed a Bible.

I was impressed with Kevin's answer. He showed a lot of wisdom. I've said many times that we can look at the Bible as "God's Diary." In it he reveals who He is, what He is like, what He likes, His hopes and dreams, and what He thinks about us. When we dig into His "diary" we find that God truly does reveal the answers to the questions we have about Him and about life.

Here's what God says in His Word....

Do you not know? Have you not heard? The LORD is the everlasting God, the Creator of the ends of the earth. He will not grow tired or weary, and His understanding no one can fathom. Isaiah 40:28

Before the mountains were born or you brought forth the earth and the world, from everlasting to everlasting you are God. Psalm 90:2

In other words, God has always existed. He is the Creator of all that exists and He alone is the 'Un-created.'

Some have compared this question to questions like, "To whom is the bachelor married?" Or "What does the color blue smell like?" Just as bachelors by definition are not married, and colors by definition have no smell, so too, God by definition, has no beginning. As bachelors fit into the "unmarried" category and blue fits in the "having no smell" category, God fits into the "uncreated" category, so to ask who created an 'uncreated' being would be comparable to asking what the color blue smells like.

Well, that's kind of the "logical" answer. More logic leads us to conclude that, since God created 'time,' He cannot be subject to the constraints of time. Even though we can apply some logic to the answer. It's all still a bit "mind-boggling" since we exist in 'time' and everything we've experienced in life has a beginning and an end. (So, eternity - a life that never ends - is also pretty mind-boggling, but that's a topic for another time.)

Aside from our logical explanations, the fact that God has always existed is really not an easy concept for us to understand. In fact, I'm going to say that as God said in the Isaiah 40 passage above, it is one of the things about Him that we really cannot understand or "fathom."

But when you think about it, it really does make sense that we cannot 'wrap our minds around' this idea that God has always existed. I mean, He is God and we are not. That simple fact means that there are things about Him that we as human beings are not ever going to understand.

As I told Kevin, "It's like this:. You are sitting there at your table pounding out a text message. Your dog is sitting there watching you do it. He has no idea what you are really doing. He can watch you texting for the rest of his life and will never, ever be able to understand what you are doing... simply because he's a dog and not a human. But he doesn't need to understand what you are doing when you are texting. He trusts that you know what you are doing and that is enough for him, because he knows he can trust you to give him the things he does understand. Food, shelter, exercise."

It's the same with us and God. No matter how long we live there will be things we will never understand about God, simply because He's God and we are not. But the fact that we can't understand everything about Him doesn't mean we can't trust Him. We may not know why He does some things the way He does them, but because He's God, we know that He knows why. And that's enough for us.

Mormons: Who They Are and What They Believe



The Mormon Church (aka The Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day Saints) means different things to different people. From its feel-good, family-oriented TV commercials to its Grammy- and Emmy-winning Mormon Tabernacle Choir to its bicycling missionaries, the Mormon Church is high profile all the way. Founded in the early

19th century, this religious movement boasts more than 15 million members and 85,000 missionaries, ranking it in the top five of "Christian denominations" in the U.S., according to the National Council of Churches.

But what makes this group distinctive and how does it differ from other Christian churches? Questions like these and more are addressed in *Mormons: Who They Are, What They Believe*

As a religious group, Momons are no strangers to controversy. Let's see, special revelations from God, the murder of its founder, regional expulsion and opposition by various groups, polygamy, and a host of teachings and doctrine peculiar to itself and unlike mainstream Christianity-have all put Momons on the fringe of Christianity.

This Bible study will look at the group's origins (Joseph Smith, the Book of Mormon, Brigham Young, and others); the discrepancy between Mormon beliefs and orthodox Christian teaching and faith; the meaning of some of its rituals (baptism of the dead, endowments for the living and dead, temple garments, celestial marriage); and the prominence of the temple in the life of a Mormon. It will feature comments from individuals who have been deeply immersed in the Mormon belief system. It will show how some, upon exiting the Mormon Church, found themselves bewildered and disillusioned, often cut off and ostracized by their families, ready to abandon religious faith altogether. Real-life stories from those on the inside and other expert commentary add depth and authenticity to this engaging study.

Join us Tuesday evenings or Sunday mornings to explore this fascinating topic through Scripture-related passages and Internet links.

True story...

In September of 2005, a social studies schoolteacher from Arkansas did something not to be forgotten. On the first day of school, with permission of the school superintendent, the principal, and the building supervisor, she took all of the desks out of the classroom. The kids came into first period, they walked in; there were no desks. They obviously looked around and said, "Where's our desks?"

The teacher said, "You can't have a desk until you tell me how you earn them."

They thought, "Well, maybe it's our grades."

"No," she said.

"Maybe it's our behavior."

And she told them, "No, it's not even your behavior."

And so they came and went in the first period, still no desks in the classroom. Second period, same thing. Third period. By early afternoon television news crews had gathered in the class to find out about this crazy teacher who had taken all the desks out of the classroom. The last period of the day, the instructor gathered her class.

They were at this time sitting on the floor around the sides of the room. She said, "Throughout the day no one has really understood how you earn the desks that sit in this classroom ordinarily. Now I'm going to tell you."

She went over to the door of her classroom and opened it, and as she did 27 U.S. veterans, wearing their uniforms, walked into that classroom, each one carrying a school desk. And they placed those school desks in rows, and then they stood along the wall. By the time they had finished placing the desks, those kids for the first time perhaps in their lives understood how they earned those desks.

Their teacher said, "You don't have to earn those desks. These guys did it for you. They put them out there for you, but it's up to you to sit here responsibly, to learn, to be good students and good citizens, because they paid a price for you to have that desk, and don't ever forget it."


An idea: It's tax refund time. If each of us gave 10% of our tax refund we'd likely fill the envelopes and get a good start on another hundred envelopes!

Story Behind The Song...

When I Survey The Wondrous Cross

Lent is the season of the church year when we seek to "Walk with Jesus to the cross." Lent ends with our Good Friday service where we focus on what Jesus accomplished for us by dying on a cross: He (God in the flesh) took the punishment for the sins of the world upon Himself. He made peace between a sinless God and sinful humanity. He reconciled the creatures with the Creator who made them. He tore open the curtain that, without His sacrifice, would have forever separated God and humanity.

As we walk with Jesus through Lent we cannot help but "survey" the cross that stands in front of us. One of the greatest hymns of the season is the one written by Isaac Watts over 300 years ago. In fact, "When I Survey The Wondrous Cross" has been used for many years by the BBC to introduce its 7am broadcast on Good Friday.

From an early age, Watts displayed a propensity for rhyme. Once, he had to explain to his father how he came to have his eyes open during prayers:

A little mouse for want of stairs ran up a rope to say its prayers.

After getting a spanking for this, he cried:
O father, father, pity take
And I will no more verses make.

Isaac Watts grew up "many more verses make" including some hymns you've likely sung many times: "Joy to the World," "From All That Dwell Below The Skies," "Alas, And Did My Savior Bleed," "Our God Our Help in Ages Past," and "Jesus Shall Reign Where'er the Sun."

Isaac Watts penned "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross" in preparation for a communion service in 1707. It was first published in 1707 in Watt's collection Hymns and Spiritual Songs. It has often been called "The greatest hymn in the English language." Maybe you list it, as I do, among your favorites as well.

Watts based this hymn on Galatians 6:14. "But God forbid that I should glory, save in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world is crucified unto me, and I unto the world." Originally, he gave the hymn the title "Crucifixion to the World by the Cross of Christ," following the practice of the day to summarize a hymn's theme in the title. The hymn has been set to more than one tune, but perhaps the most popular is that of

Edward Miller, who wrote his music in 1790, some forty-two years after Watts' death.

Watts wrote five stanzas for the original version of "When I Survey the Wondrous Cross." However, he put his fourth stanza in brackets, indicating it was the most likely one to be left out, if need be. Chances are you've never sung that fourth verse, as it has been traditionally left out.

"When I Survey The Wondrous Cross" is the first known hymn to be written in the first person, introducing a personal aspect to the singing of hymns. In Watts' day such hymns were termed "hymns of human composure" and they stirred up great controversy. At the time, congregational singing was predominately repetitions of the Psalms. But this hymn gave Christians of Watts' day a way to express a deeply personal gratitude to their Savior. The well-loved song continues to stir our hearts today.

Read through the words. Let them inspire you to humble sacrifice during Lent (and beyond). Renew again your commitment to respond to Jesus' love with "your soul, your life, your all."

When I survey the wondrous cross On which the Prince of Glory died, My richest gain I count but loss, And pour contempt on all my pride.

Forbid it, Lord, that I should boast, Save in the death of Christ my God, All the vain things that charm me most, I sacrifice them to His blood.

See from His head, His hands, His feet, Sorrow and love flow mingled down, Did e'er such love and sorrow meet, Or thorns compose so rich a crown?

His dying crimson, like a robe, Spreads o'er His body on the tree; Then I am dead to all the globe, And all the globe is dead to me.

Were the whole realm of nature mine, That were a present far too small; Love so amazing, so divine, Demands my soul, my life, my all

Not What You Expected


Walking along the beach, Dave tripped over a half-buried kerosene lantern. He rubbed its side and sure enough, a genie materialized.
