# Question for Pastor...

God doesn't tell us to celebrate Christmas, so why do we?

It's true that there's no command in God's Word (the Bible) telling us to celebrate the birth of the Messiah (Christ).



What we are doing in celebrating Jesus' birth is following the example we find in Exodus 12 in the Old Testament. You may remember the story of when the Angel of Death passed over the houses of the Israelites who had followed God's command to sacrifice a lamb and apply the blood to their doorposts. This "pass over" event set in motion the exodus ("going out") of the Israelites from their slavery in Egypt. Of course, on their way they had to cross the Red Sea. God parted the waters so they could walk across on dry land, but brought the waters back on the Egyptian army that was chasing them.

God instructed them (as we read in Exodus chapter 12) to celebrate this miraculous event every year with a special feast called Passover. This annual celebration was designed to serve two purposes:

- To be a reminder of what God had done for them, so they would never forget how God displayed His love, power and salvation in that event.
- 2) It would force them to be sure to tell future generations what God had done, so the memory of it would not die out with the generation that actually experienced it. As Moses said to the people when relaying God's command, "And when your children ask you, 'What does this ceremony mean?' you shall tell them..."

I'd say that it is very appropriate to do the same thing with the day God

came to earth in human form as that baby in the manger. Celebrating that event each year helps ensure that we don't forget that amazing thing God did. It also ensures that we tell the next generations, because they are going to ask the same kinds of questions as kids did in Moses' day: "What is the meaning of this tree.... and these candles... and why do we give gifts.... and why did God come to earth...?"

I'd invite you to join us for our Sunday School Christmas program, (during worship on December 18 @ 10:00) when the kids will actually answer our questions about the meaning of many of the symbols we use for our Christmas celebrations!

# Email Inspiration...

Why Would He Come?
Why? He loves to be with the ones He loves.

Dr. Maxwell Maltz tells a remarkable story of a love like this. A man had been burned and disfigured in a fire while attempting to save his parents from a burning house, but he couldn't get to them. They perished. He mistakenly interpreted his pain as God's punishment. The man would not let anyone see him — not even his wife.

She went to Dr. Maltz, a plastic surgeon, for help. He told her not to worry. "I can restore his face."

The wife was unenthused. Her husband had repeatedly refused any help. She knew he would again.

Then why her visit? "I want you to disfigure my face so I can be like him! If I can share his pain, maybe he'll let me back in his life."

Dr. Maltz was shocked. He denied her request but was so moved by her love that he went to speak with her husband. Knocking on the man's bedroom door, he called loudly. "I'm a plastic surgeon, and I can restore your face." No response. "Please come out." Again there was no answer.

Still speaking through the door, Dr. Maltz told the man of his wife's proposal. "She wants me to disfigure her face, to make her face like yours in the hope that you let her back into your life. That's how much she loves you."

There was a brief moment of silence, and then, ever so slowly, the doorknob began to turn.

The way the woman felt for her husband is the way God feels about us. But He did more than make the offer. He took on our face, our disfigurement. He became like us. Just look at the places He was willing to go: feed troughs, carpentry shops, badlands, and cemeteries. The places He went to reach us show how far He will go to touch us.

He loves to be with the ones He loves.

### Prayer

Great God of the universe, I am amazed that You would leave the glory of Heaven and become like me. I come to You with my disfigurement and ask You to touch me with Your love. I want to be with You as well. In Jesus' name, amen.

### **Exciting News:**

In response to an emerging need, The Link will be launching a Food Pantry in January 2017. When the New London Area Food Shelf closed in August 2016, it left a gap in resources. The Link's board and staff decided to meet this critical need

#### The Need:

- Each week, people from the community request food from either the New London location or at The Link location in Spicer:
- Transportation to the Willmar Area Food Shelf, for some, is difficult, impossible or creates a cost burden:
- Food needs often exceed the 2-3 day food allotment provided by food shelves-the Food Pantry will also play a complimentary role in addition to "filling the gap."

### How and Where You Can Help:

The Link has secured the space at our New London site and is embarking on a community campaign to stock the food pantry and elicit financial support to "fill the gap" in food resources in our community. The Link has set a fundraising goal of \$25,000 by December 31, 2016.

# Story Behind The Song...

"Mary Did You Know?"

Since first being published in 1991, Mary Did You Know has become one of people's favorite Christmas songs - right up there with Silent Night and Joy to the World.

Christian singer, songwriter and comedian, Mark Lowry (a former member of the Gaither Vocal Band) wrote the words to Mary Did You Know in 1984.... The original by Mark and the Gaither Vocal Band can be heard at https://youtu.be/kpFCbJpm5Zk

In an interview with Martha Drake on AbsolutelyGospel.com Lowry said this, "My Pastor asked me to write the Christmas program for our church, called The Living Christmas Tree, & I wrote some monologue to go in between the songs. I started thinking & wondering if Mary realized the power, authority & majesty that she cradled in her arms that first Christmas. I wondered if she realized those little hands were the same hands that scooped out oceans & formed rivers. I just tried to put into words the unfathomable. I started thinking of the questions I would have for her if I were to sit down & have coffee with Mary...you know, "What was it like raising God?" "...What did you know?" "...What didn't you know?". Over time, it (the song) just happened & I had the lyric.

Mark was quick to give credit to his mom: "My mother was actually the inspiration too, because (she said) "If anyone knew he was virgin born, Mary knew it"...she (Mark's mother) said, the silence of Mary at the cross was the greatest proof to her that the story is true."

The song was first recorded by Christian singer Michael English and then Country singer Kathy Mattea. It has since been recorded by over 400 people with Kenny Rogers & Wynonna Judd having the most popular version. Lowry adds, "There is actually a disco version done by a Christine W. that I heard had played in clubs all across the country during Christmas that year...it's actually pretty good because she enunciates the lyrics so well...my favorite version now though, is Christ Church Choir at https://youtu.be/cQDnpOvZVSw ...it is amazing."
