Question for Pastor...

"So, what are your answers?"

Last month I interrupted our usual "Question FOR Pastor" with a Question FROM Pastor. I asked for you to think about questions that God had used that grabbed your attention and brought you closer to Him as you sought an answer to that question.



I shared these question God grabbed my attention with:

1) "Are you at a point in your spiritual life where, if you died tonight, you know you'd go to heaven?"

2) "Let's say you did die tonight and are standing before God and He says, "Why should I let you into my heaven?" how would you answer Him?

I promised to give my answers to those questions this month, so here they are:

1) "Yes." Because God tells us in His Word in 1 John 5:13 that it IS possible to know:

I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of God, so that you may KNOW that you have eternal life.

I added the capital letters on the word "know" to highlight the fact that it is possible to know we have eternal life. We don't have to 'cross our fingers and wish' or guess about it. It's possible to know for sure.

2) "I know that there's no way I deserve to be here. But I also know that your Son died to remove the sins that would keep me out, and He promised that everyone who repents of their sin and places their trust in

Him as the true God who died to forgive that sin will have eternal

Or as the hymn "Solid Rock" puts it, "No merit of my own I claim, but solely lean on Jesus' name."

As I've said before, when it comes down to our last breath each of us have basically two choices on which to base our hope for a life after this one. We can

a) trust in things we've done - or tried to do - for God Or b) trust in what God through His Son did for us

That's the biggest "no-brainer" of all time. I certainly am never going to go with option A. I know me! I know how absolutely imperfect I am and that total imperfection includes anything I've attempted to do for

But I also know that when God raised Jesus from the grave on Easter Sunday, that was proof that His sacrifice to pay for all my sins was a perfect one. Every sin had been paid for (or God never would have raised Jesus back to life)!

Email Inspiration...

WHO IS OUR REFUGE?

By Dr. Michael A. Halleen

"God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble... The God of Jacob is our fortress." (Psalm 46:1, 11)

John Lewis, a Georgia congressman, tells of growing up in Alabama where he often visited the home of his Aunt Seneva. She lived in a tinroofed, one-room building, essentially a shanty that gave shelter to the poor. Lewis and his cousins were playing there one day when a terrific storm blew in. With thunder rolling, lightning flashing, rain pelting down and wind howling, Aunt Seneva was afraid the house might be blown away. When the wind started to lift one corner of the house, she directed the children to hold hands and stand in that corner to hold it down. Then when another comer started to rise, they ran to that spot, trying to keep the house intact with just the weight of their little bodies.

Commentators have borrowed the language of natural disasters to describe recent economic events: hurricane, tsunami, earthquake, wild-fire—overwhelming forces that make one run for cover. But just as there is ultimately no safe haven from such occurrences, so also there is no security in this world that will protect us absolutely from social and financial calamity. Like the children in Aunt Seneva's house, we can only run from corner to comer—contracts, warranties, insurance policies, bailouts—hoping our little efforts will somehow hold things together.

For the people of God, however, there is something better, stronger, safer. In old Russia every town was built around a fortress, a place of shelter for all its citizens in case they were attacked by enemies. In many places the fortress still stands, called by a name known even to us in the west—kremlin. The psalm writer tells us that our kremlin is God himself. It is none other than the God of Jacob who is our fortress.

The Bible offers no assurance of "homeland security" or "social security." It doesn't promise that our health, our income, our traditions—or even our nation—will survive. The rock on which we build our future is not a mutual fund or a hedge fund. To build there is to build on sand. Our safe haven is not our military might, our constitution or our democratic principles. In the end they will all pass away. We'll not be protected by an IRA, the EPA or the NRA—they're all just temporary and finally will come to nothing.

God alone is our refuge. The God of Jacob is our fortress. Our only true security is "soul security," the promise that we are known, accepted and valued beyond measure. It is enough.



As you are aware, the legislative session wrapped up Monday, May 23. Having had a couple of days to digest the outcome, allow me to give you this brief assessment as it relates to our LCMS public policy advocacy.

Our OAK (Opportunity for All Kids) education coalition had two top priorities as we entered final negotiations last week, namely

- 1) a tax credit to parents for tuition paid and
- 2) a tax credit for donations to scholarship (tuition assistance) funds.

The good news is that both of these were included in a bill right up to the final moment. However, due to political calculations made by Governor Dayton and others, both proposals failed to make the final cut. Needless to say, we are profoundly disappointed.

However, we developed support for these proposals in both the House and the Senate and made significant progress in elevating the profile of parental choice among the general public. Indeed, with that growing public support and the commitment of Governor Dayton to continue working with us on this issue next year, we feel very good about our likelihood of success going forward!

This is tremendous progress in just one year's time is due to the significant grassroots efforts of you and others who took the initiative to understand the proposals and contact legislators about them. Thank you! This kind of advocacy is new territory for us in the LCMS, and we should feel good about the quality and degree of influence we brought to bear for the common good of all Minnesotans.

Again, thank you for your efforts, and we trust that our mutual disappointment will now become mutual resolve as we look forward with anticipation to the elections this Fall and to the 2017 legislative session!

Story Behind The Song...

"This is My Father's World" ...for the world is Mine and all it's fullness. Psalm 50:12b

As we approach Father's Day it's good to be reminded of all the things our Heavenly Father has given us - starting with the amazing world He created just for us.

The song This is My Father's World was originally a poem written by Maltbie Babcock who was born into an aristocratic family in upstate New York. He attended Syracuse University where he was involved in numerous extracurricular activities. In the athletic area Maltbie was an expert swimmer and captain of the baseball team. Gifted musically, he played several instruments, directed the university orchestra, as well a the vocal glee dub. Outside of school he was an avid fisherman.

He could have been great at any number of professions, but felt God's call into the ministry. After training at Auburn Theological Seminary he became pastor at First Presbyterian Church of Lockport, NY - a beautiful area between Lake Erie and Lake Ontario, not far from Niagara Falls. He loved to spend time outdoors in the area, hiking and running in the hills outside town. As he would head out for a run he would often comment, "I'm going out to see my Father's world."

It was during this time at Lockport that he wrote the poem "This is My Father's World." Later, as pastor of the Brick Presbyterian Church in New York City, his congregation gave him a present- a trip to the Holy Land. Unfortunately, it was on that trip that he was seized with a deadly bacterial fever and died at the age of 42. In 1901 His widow compiled his writings into a book entitled Thoughts for Everyday Living. "This is My Father's World" was included in that book. Below is the poem in its entirety. Hymnals typically include only the first three stanzas.

This is my Father's world, and to my listening ears
All nature sings, and round me rings the music of the spheres.
This is my Father's world: I rest me in the thought
Of rocks and trees, of skies and seas; His hand the wonders wrought.

This is my Father's world, the birds their carols raise, The morning light, the lily white, declare their Maker's praise. This is my Father's world: He shines in all that's fair; In the rustling grass I hear Him pass; He speaks to me everywhere.

This is my Father's world. O let me ne'er forget
That though the wrong seems oft so strong, God is the ruler yet.
This is my Father's world: the battle is not done:
