Question for Pastor...

"Why are we having the Sunday School Christmas Program in January?"

Sometimes you discover important truths totally by accident (or so it seems). That's kind of what happened with our Christmas Program.



Last year the Sunday School Christmas Program was scheduled at the traditional time - during Sunday worship a week prior to Christmas. But we had to cancel worship that day due to really bad weather. What to do with the Christmas Program??? The options were either to cancel it or reschedule it for after Christmas. We decided that the birth of Christ is so important that it didn't matter if we had to celebrate it after Christmas, we needed to do it!

That posed the challenge of trying to find a date that worked for most of the participants - not an easy thing with all the typical Christmas events and family celebrations and traveling. So we re-scheduled at a time when the kids were back in school and most all the celebrations were in the rearview mirror: Friday evening, January 5. Which just happened to be the eve of Epiphany - the day that is referred to as "The Gentile Christmas." It's the day Jesus was revealed (which is what "epiphany" means) as the true God to the non-Jewish Magi (Wise Men).

Things couldn't have gone much better! Attendance was great, and because all the hustle and bustle of Christmas activities was over everyone was much more relaxed, and no one had to rush off to another event. As a result, we received quite a few comments like, "We should think about doing it after Christmas every year".

So, like Mary, we "treasured up all these things and pondered them in our hearts," and when it came time to plan for the Christmas Program this year, we made the decision to intentionally plan it to coincide with Epiphany again. The only change is that this yearwe will hold the program on Saturday, so the kids and parents won't have to rush here from school and work.







Story Behind The Song...

"My Soul Now Magnifies the Lord" by Jesus' mother Mary

Many hymns and gospel songs are based on one or two verses in God's Word. This great Advent-season song is in its entirety a modern paraphrase of the song the virgin Mary sung after being greeted by Elizabeth the mother of John the Baptizer.

Mary's song is one of four canticles recorded in Luke chapters one and two - songs sung in response to the birth of the Messiah. Mary's is the first song and often referred to as the Magnificat (the first words of the song in Latin). It is followed by a song known as the Benedictus (Latin for the first word, "Blessed") sung by Zechariah, at the birth of his son, John the Baptizer (Luke 1:68-79); the short chorus we refer to as the Gloria in Excelsis ("Glory to God in the highest") the angels sang, in the presence of the Shepherds (Luke 2:14); and finally the song we know as the Nunc Dimittis ("Lord now let me depart") sung by a man named Simeon upon seeing the infant Jesus presented by Mary and Joseph in the temple (Luke 2:29-32)

Below are the verses as recorded in Luke 1:46-55, followed by the verses as we sing them in the hymn "My Soul Now Magnifies the Lord" (tune <u>Puer Nobis</u>).

And Mary said, "My soul magnifies the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior, for he has looked on the humble estate of his servant. For behold, from now on all generations will call me blessed; for he who is mighty has done great things for me, and holy is his name. And his mercy is for those who fear him from generation to generation. He has shown strength with his arm; he has scattered the proud in the thoughts of their hearts; he has brought down the mighty from their thrones and exalted those of humble estate; he has filled the hungry with good things, and the rich he has sent away empty. He has helped his servant Israel, in remembrance of his mercy, as he spoke to our fathers, to Abraham and to his offspring forever."


