# Question for Pastor...

How would you explain the "Gospel" to someone not familiar with it?

In our Sunday Morning study of the book of Revelation, we were reminded of the need to proclaim the "eternal Gospel" to the folks around us. I asked the class the above question. And, just like Jesus frequently did, they turned it around and asked me the same question.



The word "Gospel" means "good news." Below is one way I would tell that news. (Listen to the sermon "Jesus and State Fair Food" 9/2/18 on our website for another way.)

God created every one of us. And He creates us to have a relationship with Him. A relationship of perfect love and trust.

But something ripped that relationship apart. The thing responsible for that torn-apart relationship is our 'sin.' Sin is when we don't trust that God knows what's best for us. We think we know better and so we disobey what He's told us.

You can't have "Good" News without bad news. Our severed relationship with the God who created us is the "Bad News."

Everyone is familiar with getting gifts, so I present the Good News with a gift analogy:

# God's deepest desire is to give us the gift of a mended relationship!

We are powerless to mend that relationship, but God loves us unconditionally, and doesn't want us to be separated from Him for eternity.



As with any gift, it doesn't do you any good for someone to merely "want" to give you one. They have to go and purchase it for you....

Jesus - God's Son (God-in-the-flesh) paid the price to our mend our relationship when He took the punishment for our sin.

That's what His death on the cross was all about. The Bible says, "The wages of sin is death." God the Father paid His Son those wages that we had earned.

Again, as with any gift, having someone purchase a gift for you still doesn't benefit you if you never open it.

We open the gift of that mended relationship by placing our trust in Jesus.

You've probably heard the Bible verse, "For God so loved the world, that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him shall not perish. but have everlasting life."

As that verse clearly states: The gift of a restored relationship with God means eternal life. And "eternal life" means "rising from our graves to live in a totally restored body (like Jesus had after He rose from the grave) to live on a totally restored earth!" We accept and open that gift and make it our very own when we admit that our sin/disobedience tore apart our relationship with God, and trust that Jesus did everything necessary to mend it when He took our punishment.

Finally, again as with any gift (especially one you really needed but could never afford) you send a "Thank You" note.

We send God a "Thank You" with our lives, by seeking to do what He asks us to do.

We don't go out and attempt to do the kinds of things Jesus did, because we have to as a way of earning our place in God's family. We do those things because we WANT TO as a way of saying, "Thanks God, for loving me so much that you sent your Son to take my punishment, mending the relationship I tore apart with You, and accepting me back into Your family."



# Story Behind The Song...

#### "How Firm a Foundation"

From "Then Sings My Soul" by Robert H. Morgan

Talk about lengthy pastorates! John Rippon pastored Carter's Lane Baptist Church in London for 63 years, beginning in 1775. He was only 24 when he first mounted the Carter's Lane pulpit.

During his years there, John developed a vision for a church hymnal which he edited, assisted by his Minister of Music, Robert Keene. His hymnal was first published in America in 1820 where "How Firm a Foundation" first appeared. The author is unknown, as the line reserved for the author's name simply bore the letter "K." Many scholars attribute the composition to Keene.

The unique power of this hymn is due to the fact that each of the original seven stanzas were based on various biblical promises. The first verse established the author's theme—God's Word is sufficient foundation for our faith. Isaiah 41:10, Isaiah 42:3, 2 Corinthians 12:9 and Hebrews 13:5 are among the promises other stanzas were built upon.

It's no wonder the hymn was first published under the title, "Exceedingly Great and Precious Promises."

How firm a foundation you saints of the Lord Is laid for your faith in his excellent word! What more can he say than to you he has said Who unto the Sayior for refuge have fled.

"Fear not, I am with you; O be not dismayed, For I am your God, and will still give you aid. I'll strengthen you help you and cause you to stand, Upheld by my righteous, omnipotent hand

When through fiery trials your pathway shall lie My grace all-sufficient shall be your supply The flames shall not hurt you, I only desire Your dross to consume and your gold to refine.

The soul that on Jesus has leaned for repose, I will not, no will not desert to its foes; That soul, though all hell shall endeavor to shake, I'll never, no never, no never forsake!"


