# Question for Pastor...

"Can I Use Your Article ?"

That's not the question I had planned on answering. I was going to tackle a question I received from the Sunday morning Bible Study group:



"How would you explain the 'Gospel' to people not familiar with it?"

I'll save that one for next month and deal with the above question today.

This month's question came from a couple of folks in different churches who were preparing for Rally Day. They apparently 'googled' something about Rally Day and up popped up this "Question For Pastor" article I had written several years ago:

"What is Rally Day? It's just for kids isn't it?"

I figured if two other folks in the far reaches of the USA wanted to use the article, I'd better go back and refresh my memory about just what I had said in it. After locating and reading it, I decided to run the answer again after all, Rally Day is coming up again soon:

Taking the last question first No, rally day isn't just for kids. It is for everyone in the church.

Now I'll answer the first question so you can see why it is for everyone. Webster's Dictionary defines "rally" as:

- 1) a verb "to draw or call together for a common purpose"
- 2) a noun meaning "a renewal of energy in joint action"

During the summer, our many activities and vacations and events continually draw congregation members away from each otherespecially on weekends. Summer can also be a spiritually draining time. You start the summer with the good intentions of sticking to your Biblereading schedules. Good intentions of worshiping regularly. Good intentions of attending Bible class. But the reality is that summer's hectic schedules can easily derail us from those good intentions.


#### Food Pantry Reminder





# Story Behind The Song...

#### "All Hail the Power of Jesus' Name"

As printed in Then Sings My Soul By Robert J. Morgan

In the November 1799, issue of The Gospel Magazine, edited by Augustus Toplady, there appeared an anonymous hymn entitled, "On the Resurrection, the Lord is King:

All hail the power of Jesus' Name! Let angels prostrate fall; Bring for the royal diadem, and crown Him Lord of all.

The author, it was later revealed, was Rev. Edward Perronet who for several years traveled with another couple of famous hymn writers, John and Charles Wesley. In time, however, Peronet broke with the Wesleys over various Methodist policies. Rev. Perronet went on to pastor a small, independent church in Canterbury, where he died in 1792.

His hymn, "All Hail the Power" has earned him an indelible place in the history of church music. It also has a place in missionary history, being greatly used in evangelistic endeavors. For example, Rev. E.P. Scott a missionary to India wrote of trying to reach a savage tribe in the Indian sub-continent. Ignoring the pleadings of his friends, he set off into the dangerous territory. Several days later he met a party of warriors who surrounded him, their spears pointed at his heart.

Expecting to die at any moment, Scott took out his violin, breathed a payer, closed his eyes, and began singing, "All hail the power of Jesus' name!" When he reached the words, "Let every kindred, every tribe," he opened his eyes. There stood the warriors, some in tears, every spear lowered. Scott spend the next two years bringing the Good News of Jesus to the tribe.

All hail the pow'r of Jesus' name! Let angels prostrate fall; Bring forth the royal diadem and crown him Lord of all. (repeat line)

Ye chosen seed of Israel's race, Ye ransomed from the fall, Hail Him who saves you by His grace and crown Him Lord of all. (repeat line)

Let ev'ry kindred, ev'ry tribe on this terrestrial ball, To him all majesty ascribe, And crown him Lord of all. (Repeat line)

O that with yonder sacred throng We at His feet may fall! We'll join the everlasting song, and crown Him Lord of all! (Repeat line)

But, this morning, I accidentally drove by the bakery and as I approached, there in the window were a host of goodies.


I felt this was no accident, so I prayed,
