# Question for Pastor...

## How old will we be in heaven?

At both Men's Study and Sunday Morning Study, we've been taking a look at the book of Revelation. In Revelation, maybe more than in any other book of the Bible, God tells us about eternity - what we typically refer to as "heaven."



As we looked at the final four chapters of Revelation in Men's Study this past week, we were again reminded that all those who believe in Jesus will spend eternity living in our resurrected *physical* bodies. We will live in these perfectly-restored physical bodies on a perfectly-restored earth (not floating on clouds, strumming on harps)!

While we were talking about this eternal life on an earth that has been restored to its original "Garden of Eden" condition, the question above was posed.

Unfortunately, my answer was a simple, "I don't know." This is one of many things about heaven that we're curious about, but that God has not told us about. I could make a guess at an answer, but that's all it would be - a guess. So, we'd best leave it at "God knows. So we know it will be the perfect age, and we'll find out what that is when we get there."

What we found in Revelation is that God most often describes heaven not by telling us what will be there, but by letting us know what will NOT be there:

There will be no pain, tears, crying, death, mourning, sin, evil, evildoers or Satan. Nothing that causes fear or sadness!!!

Living, as we do, in a world that has been messed up by sin and Satan, it truly is hard to imagine a place with absolutely nothing but good. Yet that's exactly what eternity will be for those 'whose names are written in the Book of Life' through faith in Jesus who paid for all our sins!

One thing we do know for certain that will be in eternity. God! Physically and visibly present with His people - just like in the beginning in the





The following is excerpted from the article "Slow to Write: Restraint isn't popular in journalism or in life, but it's often the way to the truth," as printed in World Magazine:

I've begun to think about a verse from Proverbs 30: "Every word of God proves true. ..."

Do we grasp how astounding this is?

In a culture blazing full of nonstop tweets, news feeds, blog posts, podcasts, and television hosts saying so many words that we're often not sure what's true anymore, it's awe-inducing to consider:

EVERY word of God proves true.

It sets a high standard for our own speech: We should strive to speak only truthful words, and to speak them in love. That takes a lot of work, and we often fail.

But the second half of the verse in Proverbs also adds a comfort: "He is a shield to those who take refuge in him."

When our words are either sinful or mistaken, the God of perfect truth is also a God of grace to those who seek Him in Christ. The difficulty of speaking true words—and the regret of speaking untrue or unkind ones—should cause us to stand in awe of a God whose words are always true, AND who forgives us when ours fail again!

The Proverbs are full of warnings about words, including many admonitions to just shut up sometimes. There's a time to speak and a time to be silent. Wisdom requires knowing the time, or at least trying to make the distinction.

Every torrent of words flowing online doesn't require a response, even if it seems urgent in the moment and everyone else is commenting. Other times, it's unwise to stay quiet.

How do we decide?

Often case by case, both in journalism and everyday life, but here's a template I find helpful from another verse in Proverbs: "There is one whose rash words are like sword thrusts, but the tongue of the wise brings healing."

Are my words aimed at inflicting another blow, or are they aimed at promoting the good of others, even when it requires saying hard things? That's another high standard we often miss, but one that will bring us closer to becoming like Christ, who lived a perfect life in a time just as sinful as ours.

I'm convicted even as I think about it, but I'm glad to know this: God had the first word, as He spoke the world into existence, and He will have the final word, when His Son—the Word made flesh—returns to judge the earth and make all things new, including our patterns of speech.

I'm glad those words are true.

# Email Inspiration...

Jesus said to him, "If you can believe, all things are possible to him who believes."- Mark 9:23

The word "impossible" occurs nine times in the New King James Version of the Bible. For example:

Matthew 19:26: (In answer to the disciples' question, "Who then can be saved?" "With men this is impossible, but with God all things are possible."

Luke 1:37: (To Mary who didn't understand how she could give birth to the Messiah when she was a virgin;) "With God nothing will be impossible."

These passages demonstrate how important it is to cast our impossibilities in God's hands. Just as He parted the sea for Israel, reversed the events in Esther, raised Jesus from the dead, and converted Saul of Tarsus, God is capable of reversing our irreversible problems.

What IS Possible?

There is a part of the Christian church that has adopted a slogan from the secular self-help movement "If you can conceive it and believe it, you can achieve it!" If you can conceive of yourself as an astronaut or a star player in the NBA, and believe it with all your heart, are you likely to achieve such a goal? The answer for most adults is no.

Our beliefs and possibilities have to be in line with the will of God. That's how Jesus lived His life and how He taught His disciples to live (John 5:30). When our lives are lived in obedience to God's will, nothing is impossible. Dream big — but dream biblically!

"Jesus Paid It All"
[From Then Sings My Soul by Robert J. Morgan]

It was Sunday morning at Monument Street Methodist Church in Baltimore. Re. George Schrick was leading a lengthy prayer while, up in the choir loft, Elvina Hall's mind was wandering. She thumbed quietly through the hymnbook, then began doodling on the flyleaf. By and by, these words came to her - words she scribbled on the front flap of her hymnal:

> I hear my Savior say / Thy strength indeed is small Thou has naught My debt to pay, / Find in Me thy all in all.

Yea, nothing good have I, / Whereby Thy grace to claim; I'll wash my garments white / In the blood of Calvary's Lamb.

And now complete in Him, / My robe His righteousness, Close sheltered 'neath His side, / I am divinely blest

When from my dying bed / My ransomed soul shall rise Jesus paid it all / Shall rend the vaulted skies.

Elvina's poem came into the hands of John T. Grape, a coal merchant who also served as church organist. As it happened, the church was being renovated, and the small organ had been taken to Grape's house for safekeeping. It was there that he composed the music for "Jesus Paid It All."

Through the years, the words of this hymn have been edited and altered, but its great theme of redemption has remained untouched!
