Question for Pastor...

"If God knows what we need, why do we pray?"

Great question! It came from one of our confirmation students after class one day after we read that "God knows our needs even before we ask"



This isn't an exhaustive list of reasons, but probably the biggest ones:

- 1) Because of God's basic "love" character trait, He doesn't want to force things on us. He much prefers that we want what He has to give us (and indicate our desire for it by asking). Someone put it this way, "God has a heaven full of gifts with your name on them, just waiting for you to ask for them." Makes you want to ask, doesn't it!
- 2) Receiving something we asked for increases our gratitude when we get that thing we asked for. When we get good things without asking - or even knowing we need them, we have a tendency to 'take for granted' (or even not notice) what God gave us. We tend to make a much more conscious effort to say "Thanks" when we asked before receiving.
- 3) Prayer strengthens our trust in God that He has the power to give what we ask, and knows the right things to give - at just the right time. We wouldn't ask if we didn't trust those things.
- 4) It is humbling to have to admit there's something you can do or can't acquire on your own. That's what we are doing when we come to God in prayer. And the Bible is very, very dear, God loves it when we are humble and really doesn't like it when we act like we are god and don't need Him.

In short, praying not only reminds us of God's amazing love, it also increases our trust in Him, it humbles us and fosters an "attitude of gratitude." Just some of the reasons God tells us to come to Him constantly in prayer.





(PUBLIC POLICY MATTERS FROM A LUTHERAN PERSPECTIVE

Dear Christian Friends,

"... creator of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible."

It will come as no surprise to anyone when I say that the pace of change in our society has been, and continues to be, dizzying! In fact, so many elements of our cultural foundation have been overturned or called into question that it has become tempting to withdraw from the cultural conversation / battle entirely . . . to stop even trying to understand what's at the heart of it all . . . to stop investing effort in reigning in its many excesses. It's tempting to pretend that we might be justified in our lack of engagement because "these changes don't have a direct connection to the Christian Gospel, the proclamation of which is, after all, our primary calling." But nothing could be further from the truth!

Granted, today's cultural radicals generally do not directly attack the person and work of Jesus or the person and work of the Holy Spirit, but they most certainly do attack the person and work of God the Father, "creator of heaven and earth." And why do they do so? They do so because understand that to the same degree they can entice us to question God's creative powers, we will also question His redeeming and sanctifying powers.

And so we can understand why the radicals have been so militant, for example, in advocating the teaching of evolutionary theory in public schools and the popular media while studiously ignoring the accumulating mountain of scientific evidence which now confirms the complete inadequacy of mutation and natural selection to explain the living world as we know it.

We can understand why, even in the face of natural law and millennia of lived human experience, the binary nature of human sexuality has been rejected along with the obvious complementarity of males and females.

We can understand why, having rejected the role of parents as the primary authority in the life of their children, they now push the State to mandate a new and radical sex-ed curricula in public schools which would effectively prevent children from developing the stable selfidentity so essential to living a healthy and God-pleasing life. Indeed,

taken as a whole, we understand why they are investing so heavily in a concerted effort to completely dismantle and redefine reality.

So, what are we to do in the face of such radical and multifaceted cultural project?

- Well, first and foremost it is essential that we return to the Bible...
 return to that one source from which we receive reliable information both about ourselves as human beings, about the created world in which we live, and about the God who created that world and us. In short, we need to be serious about being 'in the Word."
 Both we and our children need to be proactive in divorcing ourselves from those elements of our culture (schools, media outlets, and social and political organizations) which seem so intent on contradicting the Scriptures, and in particular, fostering doubt in God's creative power.
- Second, we need to be regular in our prayer, regularly including
 petitions which ask God to restrain these efforts to distort God's
 good, created order and thanking God for the many evidences of
 His creative power. Take the time to familiarize yourself with the
 compelling new scientific evidence which now so effectively discredits the basic daim of dassic Darwinism, namely, that mutation
 and natural selection have the capacity to imitate the effects of a
 creative mind. (A key resource you might use is the new book Darwin Devolves by Michael Behe.)
- And third, seek out reliable sources of news and commentary so that you can stay current with our swiftly changing cultural circumstances. To that end, allow me to recommend three sources I've found to be concise, timely and trustworthy:
 - The Colson Center. In particular, let me point you to their "Breakpoint Daily" offering. I've found it to be consistently accurate and insightful in dealing with the most pressing issues of the day from an orthodox Christian perspective. I highly recommend it!
 - The Family Research Council
 - The Minnesota Family Council



We are also looking for a person to be the Make-a-Meal coordinator - someone who notifies the meal makers when a meal is needed and who also arranges for the meal to be delivered.



Story Behind The Song...

"Turn Your Eyes Upon Jesus"

"Let us fix our eyes on Jesus, the author and perfector of our faith..." Hebrews 12:2

In our fast-paced daily lives, how easy it is to get caught up in the "things of earth" so that eternal values become blurred and almost forgotten. We need this month's hymn to remind us that we must continue to make Jesus the central core of our lives - to pursue the Kingdom of God and His righteousness - if we are to be victorious believers.

In 1981, Helen Howarth Lemmel, the author and composer of this hymn, was given a tract by a missionary friend. As she read it, Helen's attention was focused on this line: "So then, turn your eyes upon Him, look full into His face, and you will find that the things of earth will acquire a strange new dimness." She related:

"Suddenly, as if commanded to stop and listen, I stood still, and singing in my soul and spirit was the chorus of the hymn with not one conscious moment of putting word to word to make rhyme, or note to note to make melody. The verses were written the same week, after the usual manner of composition, but none the less dictated by the Holy Spirit."

Since that day, Lemmel's hymn has been translated into many languages and used by God to challenge believers around the world with the necessity of living devoted lives for His glory.

> Chorus: Turn your eyes upon Jesus, Look full in His wonderful face. And the things of earth will grow strangely dim, In the light of His glory and grace.

O soul, are you weary and troubled? No light in the darkness you see? There's light for a look at the Savior, And life more abundant and free!

Through death into life everlasting He passed, and we follow Him there; O'er us sin no more hath dominion-For more than cong'rors we are!

His word shall not fail you- He promised; Believe Him and all will be well Then go to the world that is dving. His perfect salvation to tell!


