

5 Common Assumptions that Cause Conflict in Relationships

Miscommunications and misunderstandings often bubble up due to making assumptions about each other. We don't do it intentionally. In fact, most of the time we probably don't even realize we're making assumptions. That's what makes them so tricky – but not if you know what to watch out for. Here are five common assumptions we make about our spouse that cause conflict in marriage.

1. Assuming you know what they mean

When we make assumptions about the meaning behind something our spouse says, there's a chance you could be right. However, there's also a chance that your perception is off. Why? We assign our own meaning to something they say, essentially putting words in their mouth. Then we respond to our meaning, instead of to what they actually said. This, understandably, leads to misunderstandings and conflict. The key thing to work on is responding in a less reactive way, and taking the time to clarify with a simple, "So, let me make sure I understand you correctly..."

2. Assuming what they're responsible for

This one often comes up when something doesn't get done (or gets done twice) because one or both of you made assumptions about who was responsible for what. It's often logistics-based, like who was supposed to pick up the kids or pay that bill. The practical inconvenience along with the personal frustration you feel with each other is a perfect recipe for conflict. The main way to avoid this is by communicating, even (or perhaps especially) when you think something "goes without saying." Taking the time to clarify who is responsible for what with a comment like, "Just making sure I what I'm supposed to do..." can save you from many crossed wires.

3. Assuming their preferences

You probably know your spouse's likes and dislikes pretty well, and vice versa. Whether it's how they take their coffee, the movie genre they avoid, or their favorite way to spend a Saturday morning, catering to your partner's preferences – unasked – can be a sweet way to show your love. But, depending on the situation, it can be good to check with them before making decisions on their behalf. Just like we grow and change as individuals, our preferences can also change. By checking in with them on what they prefer in a specific instance, you don't pigeonhole them into always wanting a certain thing a certain way.

4. Assuming their intentions

Your spouse is late – again! They have a tendency to be late, so you made sure to confirm with them when they needed to be home so you could make it to your parents' anniversary party on time. Your annoyance rises as you watch the minutes go by. You start thinking about how inconsiderate they're being, or maybe they just don't want to spend time with your family. Maybe they're late on purpose for that very reason. Your annoyance begins turning to anger. Just then, your spouse bursts in the door with the cake for the party, saving you a stop – and lots of time. You can't help but feel sheepish. We've all been there. When we assume the worst of our partner's intentions before we have all the facts, it stirs up our negative emotions. We might be ready to lash out unfairly, causing them to be defensive and kicking off an argument. Instead, strive to give them the benefit of the doubt and assume positive intent. (And if you're the one going to be late, call or text to say so!)

5. Assuming what they know (or should know)

Sometimes we think our partner is a mind reader. We assume they know what we want or need, and this often results in unmet expectations! Or we think they (should) know something simply because it seems obvious to us, leading to all kinds of mix-ups, misunderstandings, and arguments. By assertively communicating what you need from your spouse, you not only give them a fair chance to meet that need, you also increase your own satisfaction. Similarly, being intentional about communicating important information — and confirming they've received it — can help you avoid unnecessary fights.

As humans, it's in our nature to make assumptions based on the information we have. In the context of relationships, however, it's important to remember that what we think we know to be true isn't always so. By checking in with your spouse and communicating even when you don't think it's necessary, you can avoid jumping to conclusions and allowing incorrect assumptions to cause conflict.

Story Behind The Song...

Last month we talked about a song written nearly 150 years ago. This month we jump forward to a song that was written less than a year ago... Released in January of this year, new artist Katy Nichole became a "viral sensation" with her debut song, "In Jesus Name". Katy Nichole's swift trajectory to the top can only be described as one of the fastest ascents in Christian music memory. Smashing records at breakneck speed with the launch of her debut single, "In Jesus Name (God of Possible)," Nichole has become one of the biggest breakout success stories of the past year. Her TikTok hit took home Worship Song of the Year at the 2022 K-LOVE Fan Awards. You can't miss hearing this song if you listen to Christian radio.

Prior to writing "In Jesus Name (God of Possible)," Katy was diagnosed with scoliosis and underwent surgery to straighten her spine, which led to persistent post-surgery pain that sent her into a bedridden mental and emotional spiral. Three years later, Katy went back in for an operation to essentially remove the metal rods and screws that had been placed in her back.

"I go into the second surgery, and I come out of it, and the smoke cloud of depression was gone. I encountered the Lord in that moment," Katy remembers. "When I got my X-rays after surgery, my spine was actually straighter than when the rods had been in it. So when I say that God can do miracles, I mean it, because I've seen it."

Inspired by her miraculous healing and in the midst of a pandemic, the 21-year-old Nichole created the chorus of the song from entries in her prayer journal. She posted it on Tik Tok and in just a few short months the post had been heard more than 80 million times. (See the original post at https://www.instagram.com/p/CSheOrbhEp6/) After going viral, Katy went to work with co-writers Ethan Hulse, David Spencer, and Jeff Pardo and re-recorded it as a full single.

K-Love radio was made aware of the viral post, and unsolicited, played the song during the afternoon drive show Jan. 31."Never in the 40years that KLOVE has been in existence [has this] ever happened before," revealed K-LOVE host Scott Smith before he and co-host Kelli Caldwell aired the song. The full introduction and Katy's raw, emotional excitement was caught on camera and posted to her socials at https://www.instagram.com/p/CZhWrGzBoDU/

Momentum quickly built as fans heard the complete song on the radio. It climbed to #1 on Billboard's Hot Christian Songs chart dated March 26, 2022, becoming the first debut single to top the tally since Anne Wilson's "My Jesus" in 2021 and did so in a mere 12 weeks, marking

the fastest trip to the top of any prior female artist in the chart's nearly two-decade history.

Her healing has also emboldened her to be an advocate for others facing health challenges. It's further given her a new direction for her music—and her life. "There's no story that doesn't matter to God. Every story was written by Him, and He's the greatest author of all time," Katy declares. "God's healed me, so I know He can heal someone else. I'm going to share my story and hope it will encourage others to go and share theirs."

Katy's first single is a worshipful anthem ready-made for roomfuls of people to sing. Sharing her unwavering belief in God's ability to heal and the power of prayer, Katy's debut single is connecting with audiences around the world who are looking for healing and restoration in a weary and anxious world.
