Ouestions for Pastor...

What is the meaning of life?

Whoa! Talk about deep questions! This is another question from one of our recent confirmands. I'm guessing it's also a question many more of you have pondered a time or two.



I answered it by having the class look up several passages from God's Word and then summarizing what God tells us about our purpose in life.

So whether you eat or drink or whatever you do, do it all for the glory of God. 1 Corinthians 10:31

And whatever you do, whether in word or deed, do it all in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him. Colossians 3:17

An expert in the law, tested him with this question: "Teacher, which is the greatest commandment in the Law?"

Jesus replied: "Love the Lord your God with all your heart and with all your soul and with all your mind.' This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it: 'Love your neighbor as vourself." Matthew 22:37-39

Then they asked him, "What must we do to do the works God requires?" Jesus answered, "The work of God is this: to believe in the one he has John 6:28-29 sent."

Maybe a good summary of those passages (and lots of others) would be:

God created us to center our lives around Him, not, as usually happens. around ourselves. Trust Him. Love Him. Serve Him (and when we love and serve our "neighbors", we are really serving Him). When God is the center of our lives, we find true satisfaction. When "we" are the center of our lives, we'll never truly be satisfied, because we were not created to find meaning apart from God.

This paragraph from our devotion at a recent trap shoot also says it well:

Page 3

We weren't made to enjoy life apart from our Creator. The book of Genesis shows us a major design feature about us as people: We were meant to find our significance, pleasure and acceptance in a dose relationship with our Maker. God created us to be with Him... We are all created to need this closeness to God. From "In Pursuit" by Zeke Pipher

Our sin drove a wedge in the close relationship we were created to have with God. Jesus came to earth for the express purpose of restoring our relationship with God by removing that wedge, forgiving our sin. We accept that restored relationship by putting our trust in Jesus and seeking to follow Him. (That's why Jesus calls "believing in the One God sent" the "work" God requires. It is what brings us back to our original purpose of having a dose, loving, trusting relationship with our Creator.)

Once we've accepted that restored relationship by trusting Jesus, we find meaning in life (our purpose) by serving Him and serving others.



A Minute for Couples...

(from the Prepare-Enrich blog)

The Downside of Comparing Your Relationship to That of Others -And What to Do Instead

Oh look, one of your favorite couples that you follow on social media just went on (another) amazing vacation. They look so happy! They must be doing something right. Scroll, scroll, scroll. Ah, and there's an old classmate gushing on for paragraphs about their spouse... Should I be doing that? Should my spouse be doing that? Hmm, when was the last time we went on a romantic vacation or gushed about each other



like that? Is our marriage going stale? Are we doing something wrong?

The pervasiveness of social media and the rise of "influencers" (both individuals and couples) has created innumerable opportunities for comparison to take hold. Even when you know it's an unhealthy habit to fall into, comparison can creep into your thinking—especially when you're constantly bombarded with what other couples are sharing about their own lives and relationships. You might begin feeling like your own life and marriage isn't what it should be. These nagging feelings often start out small, but they can become a larger problem if you're not careful.

To avoid getting stuck in a rut of comparison, keep these things in mind:

Other couple's highlights are a skewed measuring stick for your marriage. Material or superficial things like the beautifully decorated houses, luxurious vacations, perfectly coordinated family photos for every occasion, and even the public declarations of how wonderful one's marriage and spouse are — are not a measure for your own marital success!

You're seeing the "cherry-picked" version of others' lives.

Even the most authentic personalities are likely not sharing all of the details – the tension, the arguments, or the issues that never seem to get resolved. Constantly comparing your day-to-day life to the highlights you see online is going to wear on your mental health.

Every couple and relationship is unique.

That means what works for one couple might not work for you, and vice versa. Think of the differences between you and your spouse. You both have different personalities, love languages, triggers, and tendencies, which creates dynamics in your relationship that are one-of-a-kind. Trying to mold yourselves to be like other couples will leave you both feeling like you're failing, when you could be succeeding at being yourselves.

The grass is NOT always greener.

Take a moment to list how the "grass is greener" in your relationship. Focusing on "living up to" or matching what others seem to be doing could mean you're not paying attention to the real issues in your marriage that need attention, which can be detrimental to relationship over time. Try to work on watering your own grass, so to speak.

Of course, even if you're pretty mindful about falling into a comparison funk, it can be helpful to have some tips to fall back on when you need them. Here are a few things to help you get back on the right track:

Be discerning.

Glean what is actually helpful, inspires you to be a better spouse, and gives you tools and confidence. Leave the rest behind. People have lots of thoughts and opinions on what you should and shouldn't be doing in your marriage — you don't have to do it all. Be picky about what you take in

Take periodic breaks from social media.

It could be a few days each month or one day every weekend. Many people find it refreshing and beneficial to their mental and emotional wellbeing. You might also consider cleaning up the list of people you follow, unsubscribing from any accounts that actually make you feel kind of bad.

Reflect on what need you're trying to fulfill.

If you find yourself fixated on the idea that having or doing a certain thing is going to be the magical key to feeling like you've "made it" in your life and marriage, take some time to reflect and see the bigger picture. What need or underlying area are you trying to fix or fulfill? Are you craving more romance or spontaneity? Do you wish you and your spouse expressed your love more often? Work on getting to the root of the problem.

Talk to your spouse.

When you're struggling with feelings of inadequacy or find yourself living vicariously through others' social media posts, talking to your partner about it can be a big help. They might be able to give you the refreshed perspective you need. Maybe you both agree you could benefit from less scrolling and more time doing other activities together. Or perhaps they can relate to the way you're feeling, and together you can take steps to stop the comparison game.

It's natural to compare ourselves to others; it's just how our brains work. Unfortunately, the combination of current cultural trends and technology results in a constant overload of seeing what other people are doing and how they're doing it— and that includes marriage. Learning to maintain a healthy perspective while being discerning about what you take in will ultimately benefit both your mental health and your relationship.





Story Behind The Song...

My Hope Is Built On Nothing Less

Edward Mote (1797-1874) falls into the rare category of hymn writers who grew up without religious training and whose parents were pub owners. He was apprenticed at a young age by his parents to a cabinet-maker, but found faith when he heard the preaching of John Hyatt at the Tottenham Court Road Chapel in London at age 15.

Living in Southwark near London, he established a successful cabinetmaking enterprise and became a Baptist minister in 1852, at 55 years of age. He ministered for 21 years at Strict Baptist Church in Horsham, Sussex.

Singing hymns was of great interest to him. The master cabinetmaker became a prolific hymn writer, composing more than 100 hymns. He published his hymns with selections by others in 1836 in Hymns of Praise, A New Selection of Gospel Hymns. Hymnologists note that this is the first time the now common term "gospel hymn" appears.

American Methodist hymnologist and hymnal editor Robert Guy McCutchan notes that the hymn was probably written in 1834 and originally began, "Nor earth, nor hell, my soul can move." The original title was "Jesus, my All in All."

"One morning it came into my mind as I went to labor, to write an hymn on the 'Gradous Experience of a Christian.' As I went up to Holborn I had the chorus,

On Christ the solid Rock I stand, All other ground is sinking sand.

The refrain of "My Hope Is Built on Nothing Less" refers to the Parable of the Wise and the Foolish Builders and builds around the metaphor of Christ as a rock with a firm basis in scripture.

"In the day I had written four complete verses. On the Sabbath following... I composed the last two verses...

Baptist hymnologist William Reynolds summarizes the rest of the story: "The next Sunday, Mote visited the home of some fellow church members where the wife was very ill. The husband informed Mote that it was their custom on the Lord's Day to sing a hymn, read the Bible, and pray together. Mote produced the new hymn from his pocket, and they sang "The Solid Rock" together for the first time." Instantly, the lady liked the song and asked for a copy of it. After hearing this compliment. Mote became more inspired to finish the hymn. After adding two more verses to the first song, Mote sent the lyrics to a publisher.

The version in our hymnals today is the result of careful editing of the original six stanzas into four, choosing the most coherent lines from the original. One can quickly see how the best lines of Mote's two original stanzas were combined to make a much more articulate whole.

Dr. Young comments on the revised product: "This hymn's compelling topic—the parable about the security of building a house on rock, as opposed to sand (Matthew 7:24-27)—and subsequent redaction and setting to a simple, repetitious, foot-stomping tune have merged to form a hymn of faith that over the generations has proved useful and comforting to many in their daily spiritual journey."

The "foot-stomping" tune was composed by American gospel song composer, William Bradbury, a fellow Baptist, for Mote's text in 1863.
