# Questions for Pastor...

What insights did you get from your trip?

Violet and I just got back from a very long road trip. (I appreciate the questioner not referring to it as a "vacation." 7000 miles in 17 days is definitely a "trip," not a "vacation!")



It seemed more like a bus tour with me as the bus driver. The goal of the tour was to visit Violet's "out west" relatives: Her sister and brother-in-law, two sets of nephews, her great nephew, 3 sets of cousins, her step-father, and her aunt and uncle. All of them live various places in Washington, Oregon and California.

As you can imagine, over the course of 7000 miles (I couldn't believe it when I looked at the odometer after we got home,) I came away with lots of observations and insights. I'll share a number of them in the sermon on August 4, so go check that out if you want to hear more. But for this article, the main insight is summed up by a passage in Proverbs 16:9:

"The heart of a man plans his way, but the LORD establishes his steps."

This truly was a "bus tour" that God had designed for us to take. Violet

and I had planned on going east to visit the Ark Encounter and Creation Museum near Cincinnati. But God re-directed our trip in the opposite direction just a month or



so ago when Jay and Sarah Miller had a couple extra train tickets to Washington. I suggested that Violet take the train to go visit her relatives. But when she asked me to come along, that changed the mode of transportation to "How about I drive." (Violet loves train travel. I'd rather have a root canal!)



# Email Inspiration...

Scars for Life

Some years ago on a hot summer day in south Florida, a little boy decided to go for a swim in the old swimming hole behind his house. In a hurry to dive into the cool water, he ran out the back door, leaving behind shoes, socks, and shirt as he went. He flew into the water, not realizing that as he swam toward the middle of the lake, an alligator was swimming toward the shore.

His mother in the house was looking out the window saw the two as they got closer and closer together. In utter fear, she ran toward the water, yelling to her son as loudly as she could. Hearing her voice, the little boy became alarmed and made a U-turn to swim to his mother. It was too late. Just as he reached her, the alligator reached him.

From the dock, the mother grabbed her little boy by the arms just as the alligator snatched his legs. That began an incredible tug-of-war between the two. The alligator was much stronger than the mother, but the mother was much too passionate to let go.

A farmer happened to drive by, heard her screams, raced from his truck, took aim and shot the alligator. Remarkably, after weeks and weeks in the hospital, the little boy survived. His legs were extremely scarred by the vicious attack of the animal. And, on his arms, were deep scratches where his mother's fingernails dug into his flesh in her effort to hang on to the son she loved.

The newspaper reporter who interviewed the boy after the trauma, asked if he would show him his scars. The boy lifted his pant legs. And then, with obvious pride, he said to the reporter, "But look at my arms. I have great scars on my arms, too. I have them because my Mom wouldn't let go." You and I can identify with that little boy. We have scars, too. No, not from an alligator, or anything quite so dramatic. But the scars of a painful past. Some of those scars are unsightly and have caused us deep regret. But, some wounds, my friend, are because God has refused to let go.

In the midst of your struggle, He's been there holding on to you. The Scripture teaches that God loves you. You are a child of God. He wants to protect you and provide for you in every way.

But sometimes we foolishly wade into dangerous situations. The swimming hole of life is filled with peril - and we forget that the enemy is waiting to attack. That's when the tug-of-war begins - and if you have the scars of His love on your arms be very, very grateful. He did not and will not - let you go.

# A Minute for Couples...

#### 5 Keys to Breaking the Defensiveness Cycle

Defensiveness in your relationship can be a vicious cycle. One of you makes a comment. The other person gets defensive and responds critically, causing the other person to get defensive in return. The longer this cycle continues, the harder it is to talk through issues and be open, authentic, and vulnerable with each other. So, how do you break out of this pattern? These are the key things to keep in mind:



#### 1. Work on your self-awareness.

Time to do some self-reflection. It can be uncomfortable, but when you learn more about yourself, your triggers, insecurities, and blind spots, you gain a better understanding of the things that cause you to react defensively. You become more mindful of your emotions rising and your heart rate increasing. You can take steps to calm yourself and respond more rationally. Even if you let a defensive comment bubble out, you can recognize what's happening take responsibility, and try a different approach. Self-awareness is the foundation when it comes to decreasing your own defensiveness.

#### 2. Understand it's a two-way street.

Doing your own work is half of the equation, but for best results, decreasing defensiveness is something you and your spouse work on together. It takes both of you to create a sense of emotional safety in your relationship that is conducive to being vulnerable and taking ownership of your respective feelings. In the same way that defensiveness can be a catalyst for negative communication patterns, making each other feel safe, respected, and free of judgment creates a positive reciprocal effect.

#### 3. Get curious.

A big part of why we get defensive is because of how we interpret what our spouse is saying. We might feel our defensiveness is justified because we make negative assumptions about the meaning or intent of their words. Getting curious about what your spouse actually means will help you see things more objectively. When you see things as they truly are, you can react more reasonably to the situation.

#### 4. Embrace the do-over.

Decreasing defensiveness doesn't mean eliminating it. In fact, it would be unrealistic to even strive for that – it's human nature to protect yourself emotionally. So adjust your expectations to allow for the fact that you're both going to get defensive from time to time. Maybe you're stressed out, tired, or just having a bad day. Whatever the case, all is not lost –



you can correct your course. Don't be afraid to ask for a do-over.

#### Choose empathy.

When your spouse gets defensive, you have a choice. You can get snippy yourself – or you can choose empathy instead. The bestway to stop the defensiveness cycle in its tracks is to help your spouse feel emotionally safe and understood. If they ask for a do-over, grant it. Help them understand you're on their team.

In passing, defensiveness might seem like just a minor bad habit or an occasional tendency. Left unchecked, however, it can prevent you from being able to work through issues, have vulnerable conversations, and resolve conflict in a healthy way. All of these things are vital to growing together, and that's why learning to break the cycle is so important. Working on these key things will help you get there.

#### June 2024 IMPACT FROM THE LINK

Although things have slowed down a bit since Ribfest, The Link has continued to see record numbers in the Food Pantry. Despite the increased budget, the pantry tends to

be quite empty the week before we receive another food truck. If you are interested in organizing a food drive to help supplement during those weeks, please reach out!

The Food Pantry. In June, The Link served 183 households – including 306 adults, 186 children and 51 seniors -- distributing a total of 11,279 pounds of food.

Wildcat Backpack and Snack Pantry. The Wildcat Backpack bags are available through the summer to those in need if families would like to pick them up at The Link each week.

Client Outreach. Each month, The Link is able to provide support to a number of families facing hardships, such as (but not limited to): job loss, chronic illness, unexpected change in family dynamics and increase in the cost of living. In June, your donations were able to support 41 families by helping with medical bills, gas, utility bills and rental payments along with providing budgeting support, networking and referrals for additional basic needs. Household Exchange. The Household Exchange Program was able to provide 37 families with much needed furniture and other household necessities in June.

WE LOVE OUR VOLUNTEERS!!!! In June, The Link's volunteers donated 992 hours of their time to ensure The Link's programs and Ribfest run smoothly! We are so grateful for their selfless service of helping those in need in our community!!! If you are interested in volunteering, please call Ashley at 320-354-5465! 

# Story Behind The Song...

"Take My Life and Let It Be"

Frances Ridley Havergal (1836-1879) was an unusually gifted and passionate saint. The daughter of a church rector, she was raised in Worcester, England and attended schools in England and Germany. In her love of learning, she grew to become an able scholar (even becoming proficient in both Hebrew and Greek) and a talented singer and pianist.

Frances had begun reading and memorizing the Bible at the age of four (eventually memorizing The Psalms, Isaiah and most of the New Testament). At seven she wrote her first poems. Several of her mature verses became hymns. In addition to "Take My Life," she wrote such favorites as "I Gave My Life for Thee," "Like a River Glorious," and "Who Is on the Lord's Side?"

Because her voice was lovely, Frances was in demand as a concert soloist. She also was a brilliant pianist and learned several modern languages as well as Greek and Hebrew. With all her education, however, Frances Havergal maintained a simple faith and confidence in her Lord. She never wrote a line of poetry without praying over it.

The deepest desire of her heart, however, was in "personal spiritual influence upon others" (Benson). This led her to value most of all her ability to write; for that reason she expended the majority of her life's labors in writing prose and poetry that would be spiritually beneficial to the saints.

Havergal suffered poor health and was taken by the Lord at just 42 years of age. But the Lord prospered her ministry; her writings had a large impact in her own day, and several continue to be read and sung today.

Frances R. Havergal wrote this hymn on February 4, 1874. The story of

"Take My Life" gives a good picture of the kind of passion and joy she had in ministering to others. She once recounted the story behind it:

Perhaps you will be interested to know the origin of the consecration hymn, "Take my life." I went for a little visit of five days. There were ten persons in the house, some unconverted and long prayed for, some converted but not rejoicing Christians. He gave me the prayer, "Lord, give me all in this house!" And He just did! Before I left the house every one had got a blessing. The last night of my visit I was too happy to sleep, and passed most of the night in praise and renewal of my own consecration, and these little couplets formed themselves and chimed in my heart one after another, till they finished with, "Ever, ONLY, ALL for Thee!"

In her own words, the hymn is a "consecration hymn" in which the singer commits all of her possessions and being to the Lord for his purposes. It expresses what each of us ought to feel and long for, even if at times we see so much disparity between the words and our actual state that we have to sing most of it in hope and faith.

In 1878, four years after writing the hymn, Miss Havergal wrote a friend, The Lord has shown me another little step, and, of course, I have taken it with extreme delight. 'Take my silver and my gold' now means shipping off all my ornaments to the Church Missionary House, including a jewel cabinet that is really fit for a countess, where all will be accepted and disposed of for me...Nearly fifty articles are being packed up. I don't think I ever packed a box with such pleasure."

Take my life, and let it be Consecrated, Lord, to Thee; Take my moments and my days, Let them flow in ceaseless praise.

Take my hands, and let them move At the impulse of Thy love; Take my feet and let them be Swift and beautiful for Thee.

Take my voice, and let me sing Always, only, for my King; Take my lips, and let them be Filled with messages from Thee.

Take my silver and my gold; Not a mite would I withhold; Take my intellect, and use Every power as Thou shalt choose. Page 30
