## Questions for Pastor...

## What do you think of the Terri Schiavo situation ?

This is obviously a situation that has been on everyone's "radar screen" for the past month. I've heard valid points on both sides and I've had lots of thoughts of my own about the situation. But the challenge here is to separate personal feelings ("what *I* think") from what *God* thinks. That really is the challenge with every situation we face. We are always tempted to base our decisions on what *we* think and feel instead of on what God thinks.

How do we know what God thinks? He's told us in His Word (the Bible):

Some things God has told us in His Word:

- ?? God is the author of life. Acts 17:24-25
- ?? Only he has the authority to end it. Deuteronomy 32:39 / 1 Corinthians 6:19-20
- ?? The value of life isn't found in who we are (i.e. what we can do).
- ?? The value of life is found in *whose* we are. Genesis 9:6
- ?? Our lives are valuable to our Creator God in spite of what we do and what we can't do.

Two simple facts show how valuable each person is to God.

1) God created you and knows you - knew you even before he created you (Psalm 139, etc...)

and

2) God sent His own Son to die for you (*because* of the things you do). (John 3:16, etc...)

Lessons from Bible Guys: Peter

"Don't give up when you mess up."

Peter really messed up. He boldly said that he would never deny Jesus. But less than 24 hours later he had publically - and boldly as - stated not once, but three times that he didn't know Jesus.

Naturally, Peter was filled with remorse after the third denial when he heard the rooster crow and looked up to see Jesus looking at him. We are told that he went and "wept bitterly."

Everyone of us has really messed up like Peter. More than once. More than three times. We've all said or done something (or maybe not done something) that told the world "I don't know Jesus."

Both the apostle Paul and the evangelist Luke tell us that after His resurrection, Jesus appeared specifically to Peter. We aren't told about the conversation, but we do know that Jesus held out for Peter the forgiveness that he purchased for each of us on the cross.

The example Peter holds out for us isn't the denials (we can do that just fine on our own). The example is of not letting his sin remove all hope. Peter didn't give up all hope - as Judas did. Peter hung in there. He ran to the tomb when he heard the report that Jesus wasn't in it.

Next time you really mess up and do something you thought you weren't capable of doing, don't give up. Don't throw in the towel. Run to Jesus. His tomb is still empty. He lives and will be holding out for you the same forgiveness He gave to Peter.

"What can that life do?"

Back in the 70's we started to do this by saying that the life of the unborn child is worth less than that of the mother, so that gives us the right to take that life. That is absolutely wrong. No room for if's, and's or buts on that one. Abortion is the taking of a life that God created. That life may be inconvenient. So what! That doesn't give us the right to end it. Only God has that right. Thank God the people around us don't take it into their hands to end our lives when we are "inconvenient" to them!

The thing that I fear with the Terri Schiavo case is that, because the courts got heavily involved, this could do for euthanasia (assisted suicide) what Roe v Wade did for abortion thirty years ago. Roe v Wade made it acceptable (to us - not to God) to take a life that's inside the womb based on our (not God's) definition of the value of that life. I fear the Terri Schiavo case will make it acceptable (to us - not to God) to take a life outside the womb based on our (not God's) definition of its value.

There's a difference between allowing death to come naturally and actually taking away a life. The situation with Terri Schiavo was one of taking away a life. Terri Schiavo was not kept alive by any "heroic" technological means. Just food and water. Taking a person off artificial life support to allow death to come naturally is one thing. Withholding the basics we all need for survival is another.

Once again, the key isn't "What we think."

The key is "What does God think?"

How do we know what God thinks? He's told us in His Word (the Bible). The challenge for Christians is to make sure we are listening to God more than we listen to the people who are only to willing to give us "What they think."

#### A Summary of God's Purposes for Our Lives

**God's Main Purpose:** Restore the eternal relationship we were created to have with him. Jesus' purpose was to take first step in restoring that relationship by taking the punishment for our sins to 'right our wrongs' against God. The Holy Spirit's purpose is to bring us to faith in Jesus and thus enable us to accept the relationship Jesus died to restore.

After the Spirit brings us to faith in Jesus and accept that restored eternal relationship, He continues to work to empower us to accomplish these purposes:

1. Worship - Loving God

Worship isn't something just done in church.

We worship God in everything we do that is done with a focus on pleasing God.

#### 2. Fellowship - Loving God's people

Fellowship often starts with coffee and cookies, but true fellowship never ends there. It grows as we get to know each other on a deeper level and care for each other as we care for immediate family.

#### 3. Discipleship - becoming more like Jesus.

This is the central purpose. We get this one and all the others fall into place. The Holy Spirit works through God's Word, circumstances and other believers to help us become more like Jesus.

4. Ministry - serving God by serving others.

Ministry isn't just something pastors do. It simply means "serving" and God has given everyone a special SHAPE to use in serving Him.

#### PUT ALL YOUR EGGS IN ONE BASKET.

That phrase you usually hear is the opposite:

"Don't put all your eggs in one basket"

The "eggs" are our "hopes." The idea being that when you put all your hopes in one place, your hopes will be dashed if the bottom falls out of that one place.



Don't put all your eggs in one basket may be a good thing to remember when it comes to your investments. But it's not good when it comes to life.

The Resurrection of Jesus from the grave means you can - and should - put all your hopes for this life and eternal life in Jesus' basket.

#### Your hopes for eternal life.

Jesus rising from the grave proves that there is such a thing as life after death. It also shows us that He is the only one to place your trust in for obtaining life after death. Everyone else who ever came and said, "Follow me and I'll lead you to eternity" died and stayed dead. Jesus came back to life to prove he is the right one to lead us to eternity.

#### Your hopes for forgiveness of sin

We usually are tempted not to put our "sin" eggs into any basket. We'd prefer to do the "Easter-egg hunt" thing and hide those eggs. If we do put them into a basket, we are tempted to try to hide them under lots of "good deeds." But piling good eggs on top of bad ones doesn't get rid of the bad ones. The only way to be rid of bad eggs is to admit that you have them and then have them thrown out. Jesus 'threw out' all our bad eggs when he died on the cross. His resurrection proves that God accepted His sacrifice as full payment for all our bad-egg sins. 5. Mission - sharing the Good News of Jesus

Everyone who trusts in Jesus for that eternally restored relationship with God has a mission. That mission is to share the Good News that Jesus offers them the same restored relationship. Our mission is to PLANT the seeds of the Good News.
