Questions for Pastor

"You always say after Confession that God has forgotten the sins we've confessed and that we should forget them too. But there are some things you just can't forget - there are constant reminders of them in my life."

Another great question.

It is very true that some of our sins have consequences that follow us around for the rest of our lives. Because of those ever-present consequences, it is next-to- impossible to forget the sin that caused them.

It is important to remember God's promise:

"Repent and turn to God and your sins will be wiped away." (Acts 3:19)

When God forgives - and forgets - a sin, he has indeed "wiped it off his books." Jesus took the punishment for that sin. God forgives it the moment we repent. The eternal consequences have been removed and forgotten.

But we also need to remember that God has attached earthly consequences to our sin to remind us not to commit that sin again. These earthly consequences also remind those around us that the sin we committed is not something they should do. Consequences are actually a good thing - keeping us from getting into deeper trouble.

The problem comes when Satan, the "Father of Lies," (whose name means "Accuser") comes to you and accuses you with lies like "The reason you can't forget that specific sin is because God can't or won't forgive that one." He tries to make you feel guilty all over again - even though the guilt was removed when you repented. He casts doubt on God's ability to forgive. He casts doubt on whether or not you have been forgiven. He wants you to throw up your hands and say that you are going to just forget about God.

As someone said, "When Satan reminds you of your past, remind him of his future." Satan is a defeated enemy. He has lost the war, even though he still wages battles in your life. He does not have to succeed in making you feel unforgiven.

So, while you may not be able to forget the earthly consequences, you

can forget about the eternal consequences. Those were wiped away the moment you repented.

Simple Ways to Give Your Spiritual Life

Resolve (anew) to daily feed on God's Word this year.

In order for your body to grow and stay healthy, you need to feed it the right kind of nutrients - daily. The same is true of our spirit. In order for your spirit to grow - and stay healthy, you need to feed it the right kind of nutrients. You need a balance of God's law (the part that shows us our sin) and God's gospel (the part that shows us our savior).

Of all the things you can resolve to do this new year, **THE ONE THAT WILL LIKELY GIVE YOUR SPIRITUAL LIFE THE BIGGEST LIFT** (not to mention your physical and emotional life) **is this one**: Read God's Diary (His Word)

Once again, daily Bible readings will be printed in each Newsletter to help you get into God's Diary. Use this as a checklist to help you keep on track. Keeping in mind that the Bible is "God's Diary" in which he reveals himself and his innermost desires, after each reading, record what you learned about God or from God.

God's Word is more than just a reference book to keep on the shelf until you need to find out something. God calls his Word "Living and Active." That means there is power in the Word. The same power that caused the universe and everything in it to come into being - remember, God simply *spoke* and things came into being.

Lessons from Bible Guys Joseph (Mary's Husband)

Matthew 1:18-19

This is how the birth of Jesus Christ came about: His mother Mary was pledged to be married to Joseph, but before they came together, she was found to be with child through the Holy Spirit. [19] Because Joseph her husband was a righteous man and did not want to expose her to public disgrace, he had in mind to divorce her quietly.

Before the angel told Joseph that God was the father of the baby that Mary was pregnant with, all Joseph knew was this:

a) Mary was pregnant and b) He was not the father

And how did he respond? According to Jewish law Joseph *could have* taken Mary before the elders, accused her of adultery and had her publically stoned (put to death). He didn't do that. We are told that he didn't even want to do that.

Joseph had decided to deal with Mary on the basis of mercy. Not making a big deal out of her offense. Not wanting revenge. Simple mercy. "Giving something good that is undeserved."

Dealing with people on the basis of mercy is a great example for all fathers and husbands. Deal with the people in your life on the basis of mercy, not revenge. The people you show mercy to may not deserve it. They may continue to do things that offend and hurt you. You can't control what they do. But, like Joseph, you can control how you respond.

A Minute for Parents

<u>Give an "After-Christmas" Gift that will keep on giving.</u> (The same one God gave us at Christmas)

By now some of the Christmas presents you gave your kids have become broken. Others have been forgotten. Hopefully some are still in use. But the start of a new year would be a great time to resolve to give your children the present they really want most - your presence.

His presence is the present God gave us at Christmas. It's the one he has promised to give us until the end of time "And surely I am with you always, to the very end of the age." Mt. 28:20
