Questions for Pastor...



"Have you told them that?"

Four times a year Pastor Strohschein from the District Office hosts a conference for pastors who are planting new churches. He started this week's meeting by telling us that he has a new appreciation for how tough the task of starting a new congregation can be. (His son was recently put in charge of planting a new congregation in Arizona.)

Pastor Strohschein shared how his son was frustrated with the reality that planting a church at times can seem to be "one step forward and two steps back." He'd recently been through one of those "two steps back" times. Some folks who had been part of the core group involved in founding the church had left. He said it was apparent that they had an agenda of things they wanted to have happen in the new church, and when those things didn't come about the way they wanted, they left - and tried to get others to leave with them.

I commented that I think pretty much everyone has some kind of "agenda" - things we would like to see happen. I said that I greatly appreciate the people of Living Word, because I see how they have been willing to set aside whatever agendas they may have in order to follow God's agenda (which most often isn't the same as ours). I see a definite willingness to set aside what you want and instead seek to find out what God wants.

I continued by saying that I feel greatly blessed to be leading a congregation where people have been very committed, dedicated and have "hung in there" in those "one step forward and two steps back" times. I told the folks at the conference that I get paid to persevere and hang in there when things don't happen as fast or just the way I want. You don't. And I greatly appreciate the fact that you hang in there anyway.

Pastor Strohschein's response was the "Question for Pastor" at the

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top of this article.

October was Pastor Appreciation Month, and it was so neat to have you show your appreciation to me and my family with the special gift certificate and cake after worship a couple Sundays ago. But the phrase "Pastor Appreciation" could also mean: Pastor expresses appreciation. The youth and chaperones who attended the LC-MS National Youth Gathering in Orlando were asked to reflect on their experience. The youth were given questions to answer while the chaperones got a "blank sheet of paper. This month we include the reflections Rebecca Dauk. One of the sessions I found really helpful was "The Jesus Painter." This young man was in front of the auditorium with a large canvas. He started painting little images on it. In about ten minutes the little images came together into an amazing painting of Jesus. After he finished painting, he told us about how he got started doing these "Jesus paintings." He reminded us that God has something special for everyone to do.

I saw God working in my family group just in the fact that even though we were in three small rooms together for nine days - we didn't really get into any big fights.

My goal in going to the National Youth Gathering was to grow in my faith (and, of course, have some fun and get away from mom and dad). One way that goal was accomplished was in having to read my Bible and spend time with God every day, because I don't always do that.

One thing I want to change as a result of what I experienced in Orlando: I want to be a better Christian and actually want to read my Bible and go to church.

What I wish the rest of you could have seen, heard and experienced: The constant reminders that we are all Chosen and that God wants all of us in His family.

The most important thing for me to remember about "Being Chosen with Others": We need to be nice to everyone, because God chose them too.

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Operation Christmas Child...

Operation Christmas Child (Shoe Boxes)

In the next few weeks millions of caring people like you will be praying for children in the poorest areas of the world and filling shoe boxes with gifts for them. **On Sunday, November 18, we will dedicate to the Lord all the shoe boxes that we collect.** The next day they will be delivered to the Youth for Christ office in Willmar. From there they will be transported to a large distribution center in the Twin Cities where they will be sorted and packaged for shipping to locations in over 100 countries.



Franklin Graham, President of Samaritan's Purse, says, **"Sometimes people ask me how much difference a shoe box can make in the life of a child who is poor, sick, hungry or traumatized by war. I tell them that the gifts are only the beginning. Church partners who hand out the boxes on our behalf also reach out to the children and their families, sharing the hope of the Gospel. By God's grace, every year hundreds of thousands of these children receive Jesus Christ as their personal Lord and Savior through the Gospel storybooks and discipleship program."**

"Let me give you an example. In 1993 in snowy Bosnia, an 11-year-old girl named Lejla received one of our very first shoe box gifts. 'That's when I knew God loved me,' she said. Raised in a non-Christian home, she didn't know who Jesus was. When one of our team shared the Gospel with her, Lejla prayed to accept Christ as her Lord and Savior. Today, living in Pennsylvania after marrying a soldier who was in Bosnia on a peacekeeping mission, Lejla Allison is packing boxes for over 50 children, and we are planning to take her back to Bosnia this winter to help hand out gifts and minister to children in her homeland."

You can help with this special ministry by packing a shoe box for a girl or boy (you choose the age). Bring the shoe box to church on or before our Dedication Sunday. Thank you for your partnership in sharing the Gospel!

Steps Completed This Month:

The Mission and Ministry Team completed the step of determining the amount of loan we would be willing to take on for Phase One of construction. They determined that \$300,000 would be the maximum loan amount we would apply for. (We would qualify for a loan between \$250,000 and \$400,000). Couple this with the \$120,000 we have pledged and we will have \$420,000 available for building expenses. That figure could go up (or the loan amount go down) should we receive more pledges or special gifts.

MEXICAN DINNER FUND RAISER

We served approximately 100 people and raised close to \$600 after expenses. Thanks to everyone who made the dinner a success!

Bring the best robe and put it on him.. (Luke 15:22)

Pete was one of my best friends in high school. He was an only child, the kind of kid on whom some parents dote. Mr. and Mrs. T. would do anything for Pete. When he went off to Harvard, his parents, despite being cramped in a condo, maintained his room just as it was, pennants and posters in place. It was Pete's room -always .

Pete had a dog, an old black lab named Frankie, who had been his pet from the time he was a young boy. I used to visit Mrs. T. occasionally when I was in the neighborhood to pick up the latest news about Pete. At each of my visits, lying on his rug in the corner of the living room, there was Frankie-ugly, old, half-blind, unable to do more than totter around because of arthritis. He was neither useful nor ornamental. Once I made an uncomplimentary remark about the dog, and Mrs. T. said, "Mike, Frankie's no burden to us. We'll love him till he dies because he's Pete's dog." This totally dependent, odd-looking creature had meaning, dignity and worth in their eyes just because he belonged to the son they adored.

The father of the prodigal told his servants to put the best robe on the boy when he returned home - and a ring and some good sandals too. Having done everything wrong and on a fast track to nowhere, the son finally had decided that throwing himself on the pity of his father was his only hope of survival. Instead of pity he found love. His father saw past the mistakes and recognized one whom he adored-worthy of care and of the best gifts he could offer

A seminary classmate, a Coast Guard veteran, had a hard time with his studies in his first year out of the service. He kept a dress uniform in his closet, and sometimes in the midst of a rough afternoon in the library, he said he was going home to polish his medals. I know that at least once he put them on again. It was his way to reestablish a sense of worth.

An old dog, a runaway boy, a struggling student - bring out the best for them! Each was worthy. We can be encouraged to know that, like them, we - whether old and past our prime,

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or detoured on a path sideways to our best interests, or just feeling inadequate to the expectations laid on us - are worthy too. Why? *Because we belong to the SON!*

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

Some specific things we'll cover:

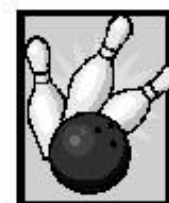
- + Why is belief in the Biblical account of creation important?
